Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following description of the Sacred Heart Schools, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Sacred Heart Schools, Inc. (the “Organization”). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan for the purpose of salary deferrals on the first day of the month coinciding with or following two consecutive months of service and obtaining age 21. An employee becomes eligible for Organization contributions on the first day of the month coinciding with or following one year of service and obtaining age 21. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions – Each year, participants may elect to contribute up to the maximum compensation permissible under the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The Plan also includes an automatic enrollment provision for all eligible employees. For eligible employees who are automatically enrolled, a pre-tax deferral in the amount of 4% of eligible compensation will be contributed to the Plan unless the employee elects a different percentage or elects to not contribute to the Plan. This percentage will be increased by 1% each year until reaching a maximum of 8%. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit and defined contribution plans.

The Organization may make discretionary contributions to the Plan. For the Plan year ended June 30, 2024, the Organization made a discretionary matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 4% of compensation each eligible participant contributed to the Plan plus 50% of compensation contributed between 4% and 8%. Participants must meet certain criteria, as outlined in the Plan Agreement, in order to receive Organization matching contributions. No other additional discretionary contributions were made for the Plan year. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts – Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Organization matching contributions, as well as an allocation of other Organization discretionary contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, specific participant transactions, or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Investment Options – Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. They may change their investment options among those investments provided at any time during the Plan year.

Payment of Benefits – Upon termination of service or attaining normal retirement age, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount or partial lump sum amounts equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. In-service and hardship withdrawals are also allowed as defined in the Plan Agreement.

Forfeited Accounts – The non-vested portion of former participants’ accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce the amount of future Organization contributions. Forfeited accounts totaled \$4,355 and \$1,217 at June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During the Plan year ended June 30, 2024, forfeitures totaling \$14,039 were used to reduce the amount of Organization matching contributions.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Presentation – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan’s investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the Plan year.

Payments of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid. There were no benefit payments requested and not yet disbursed at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Administrative Expenses – Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Organization or Plan participants, as defined in the Plan agreement.

Investment Management Fees and Operating Expenses – Investment management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the various funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are reflected as a component of net appreciation (depreciation) in fair values of investments.

Note 3—Information certified by the qualified institutions (unaudited)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“Empower”) and Empower Trust Company, LLC, qualified institutions, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule.

- Investments at fair value, and investments at contract value as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividends as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024.
- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) – Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i as of June 30, 2024.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan’s independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Note 4—Fair value measurements

U.S. GAAP provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liabilities fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 or 2023:

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are therefore classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Collective Trust Funds – Valued at NAV of units held by the Plan at year-end provided by the issuer of the fund. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on the value of the underlying investment assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate full redemption of the collective trust funds, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments. Investments valued using NAV as a practical expedient are not reflected in the valuation hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5—Fully benefit-responsive investment contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive contract with Empower that invests in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Empower may impose restrictions on the ability to move Plan assets into or out of this investment option or among investment options in general under the contract. Under the contract, Empower is contractually obligated to repay to the Plan the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, or (3) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such event, which would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants, has occurred or is probable.

Note 6—Related party and party-in-interest transactions

Certain administrative services are provided by the Organization at no cost to the Plan and certain administrative costs incurred by the Plan are paid by the Organization. The Plan has entered into various service agreements with parties-in-interest. It invests in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract managed by Empower, a custodian of the Plan. The Plan paid administrative fees to Empower and a related affiliate totaling \$81,071 during the Plan year ended June 30, 2024. The Plan also invests in collective trust funds managed by Putnam Investments, an affiliate of the custodian. These investments and related transactions qualify as party-in-interest.

Note 7—Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 8—Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Note 9—Income tax status

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") ruled on November 14, 2022, that the pre-approved plan of Empower Retirement LLC upon which the Plan is based, is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 10—Non-exempt transactions

In June 2024, the Organization identified and remitted employee withholdings totaling \$57 that were not remitted to the trust within the appropriate time period by the Organization. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA.

Note 11—Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through April 11, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued and has determined there are no subsequent events that require disclosure.
