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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees of the  
Asbestos Workers Local 24  
Medical Fund

### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Asbestos Workers Local 24 Medical Fund (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits and of benefit obligations as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and of changes in benefit obligations for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations of the Plan as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### Basis for Opinion

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

JUNE 30, 2024 AND 2023

**NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following brief description of the Asbestos Workers Local 24 Medical Fund (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the summary plan description for more complete information.

**General** - The Plan is a multiemployer collectively bargained defined benefit welfare employee benefit plan that covers eligible active asbestos workers, and their dependents, pursuant to collective bargaining agreements between the International Association of Heat and Frost Insulators and Asbestos Workers Local 24, Washington, D.C. (Local 24) and employers, and certain other employees who are not covered by such collective bargaining agreements. Employees may also be covered based on certain hours worked in previous periods and self-payments of contributions. Further, benefits are provided to eligible retired employees, widows and dependents. The Plan was formed effective December 1, 2004 under an Agreement and Declaration of Trust between Local 24 and employers in the insulating and asbestos field. The Plan is operated and administered by a Board of Trustees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**Medical Benefits** - Participants satisfying eligibility requirements are provided coverage for hospitalization, surgery, dental, vision care, physician's care, prescription drugs, accidental death and dismemberment, disability income and life benefits. The Plan has insurance coverage for claims for certain life and accidental death and dismemberment benefits. The insurer, Symetra Life Insurance Company, pays these claims.

**Eligibility** - Participants are eligible for benefits under the Plan based on the number of hours worked and contributions remitted during the work quarter. A work quarter is the three-month period that ends one quarter before the eligibility quarter. A participant maintains eligibility if the Plan receives contributions for 400 or more hours from the participant's employer during the work quarter or 800 or more hours in the last two work quarters. See the Summary Plan Description for more detailed information on number of hours required for eligibility.

Under the Plan eligibility guidelines, a participant, for whom the Plan does not receive the minimum of 400 hours during the work quarter or 800 hours during the last two work quarters worth of contributions, can make up the difference with self-payments. The self-payment rate is set periodically by the Trustees. If a participant does not maintain the eligibility requirements as stated in the Plan, they have the option to continue coverage under COBRA.

## **NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Method of Accounting** - The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** - Investment in mutual funds is carried net asset value of the fund which generally represents quoted market prices at the last business day of the Plan's year. Certain United States Government and Government Agency obligations are carried at fair value as of the last business day of the Plan's year as reported by the investment manager or as provided by the custodial bank. The investments in corporate obligations, municipal obligations and certain United States Government and Government Agency obligations are carried at estimated fair value as reported by the investment manager or as provided by the custodial bank. The limited partnerships are carried at estimated fair value as provided by the sponsor of the investment.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividends are recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

**Funding Policy and Revenue Recognition** - Employer contributions to the Plan are based upon hourly contribution rates determined by collective bargaining agreements between Local 24 and participating employers. Retiree and other self-payments include receipts from retirees, and from the Asbestos Workers Local No. 24 Defined Benefit Pension Plan (DB Plan) on behalf of retirees, self-payments and COBRA contributions. Receipts from the DB Plan represent retiree premiums for pensioners who have authorized that these amounts be withheld from their pension benefits. Self-payment rates for active participants, whose hours of covered employment fall below the level required to maintain eligibility, and for retirees are established by the Board of Trustees. Employer and participants contributions are accounted for as exchange transactions. The contributions are due on a monthly basis. It is the policy of the Trustees to pursue monies due.

Employers' contributions receivable represents amounts due under the term of collective bargaining agreements. Employer contributions are recorded in the period in which the hours giving rise to the contribution are worked. The Plan believes that the receivables are fully collectible; therefore, no allowance for credit losses is recorded.

**Estimates** - The presentation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

## **NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)**

**Benefit Obligations** - Benefit obligations include the Plan's liability for health claims incurred as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and paid subsequent to year-end, including claims incurred but not reported. The Plan's liabilities for claims incurred but not reported is based on actual claims incurred subsequent to year end. Benefit obligations at June 30, 2024 and 2023, for accumulated eligibility credits have been estimated based on the latest data and past experience of the Plan. Accumulated eligibility credits are amounts needed to cover eligibility earned by active members but not yet provided as of the end of the period, commonly due to the lag between hours worked and eligibility for benefits. Postretirement benefit obligations were estimated by the Plan's actuary.

**Payment of Benefits** - Premiums paid by third-party claims administrators are recorded as premium payments in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Claim payments are recorded when paid by a third-party claims' processor. These payments are recorded as claims paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Refunds** - Refunds due from the Plan's benefit manager are recorded when earned. Refunds due as of the financial statement date have been reported as a receivable, with the offset being netted against claims paid. Pharmacy rebates of \$668,663 and \$630,564, have been netted with claims paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Medicare Part D subsidy of \$0 and \$50,612 has been netted with claims paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits available for benefits for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Stop Loss Coverage** - The Plan has entered into a stop-loss insurance arrangement in an effort to limit its exposure for self-insured benefits for individual participant claims over a specific dollar amount, as well as its aggregate exposure for all claims.

## **NOTE 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value.

The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

### **Basis of Fair Value Measurement:**

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**NOTE 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)**

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period. For the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, there were no transfers in or out of levels 1, 2, or 3.

There have been no changes in valuation methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

A - Members may not give notice of withdrawal of any portion of the balance of a capital account until the first anniversary of the contribution of capital representing such portion of the capital account (a “One Year Lock-up Period”). A Member must notify the Manager no later than September 30 of its intention to withdraw a portion or all of the balance of a capital account for the withdrawal to be effective. A Member that seeks to withdraw any portion of the balance of a capital account must therefore wait until after the One Year Lock-Up Period and give written notice to the Manager no later than the next September 30 for distribution effective no later than the following February month-end. The Manager will attempt to effect such withdrawal prior to the end of the year in which notice of a withdrawal is given but reserves the right to effect such withdrawal as late as the last business day of February in the following calendar year (a “Withdrawal Date”). However, the Manager may permit capital to be withdrawn as of such other dates and upon such other notice periods as it may determine from time to time in its sole discretion so long as there is no material negative impact on the Fund.

### **NOTE 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)**

Ceres Farms, LLC's objective is to generate an attractive total return by acquiring and actively leasing farmland in the United States. The sources of funds used in acquiring farmland consist primarily of the proceeds from the sale of Interests offered, cash flow provided by the lease or sale of previously acquired properties, and various types of borrowing, including first mortgage loans, bank credit facilities and other forms of indebtedness.

TA Realty Core Property Fund, L.P. was formed for the purpose of investing alongside TA Realty Core Property Fund PF-1, L.P. ("PF-1"), TA Realty Core Property Fund PF-2, L.P. ("PF-2"), and TA Realty Core Property Fund PF-3, L.P. ("PF-3") (collectively the "Feeder Funds") in TAR CPF OP, LLC ("CPF Master" or the "Fund"), a limited liability company investing directly in real estate assets.

Ceres Farms, LLC and TA Realty Core Property Fund, L.P. are measured at estimated fair value, without adjustment by the Plan, as reported by the sponsor of the investments as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

### **NOTE 4. POSTRETIREMENT BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS**

The amount reported as the postretirement benefit obligations represent the actuarial present value of those estimated future benefits that are attributed by the terms of the Plan to employees' service rendered to the date of the financial statements, reduced by the actuarial present value of contributions expected to be received in the future from current plan participants. Postretirement benefits include future benefits expected to be paid to or for (1) currently retired or terminated employees and their beneficiaries and dependents and (2) active employees and their beneficiaries and dependents after retirement from service with the participating employers. The postretirement benefit obligations represent the amount that is to be funded by contributions from the Plan's participating employers and from existing plan assets.

The actuarial present value of the expected postretirement benefit obligations is determined by an independent actuary and is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to historical claims-cost data to estimate future annual incurred claims costs per participant and to adjust such estimates for the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as those for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The weighted-average health care cost-trend rate assumption has a significant effect on the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements. If the assumed rates increased by 1 percentage point in each year, it would increase the obligations as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, by \$4,608,737 and \$5,961,973, respectively.

The liability has decreased from \$37,369,100 to \$29,785,562. This decrease is mainly due to the updated premium increase, updating the healthcare cost trend for 2024, and increasing the discount rate from 4.91% to 5.32%.

**NOTE 4. POSTRETIREMENT BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS (continued)**

The following were other significant assumptions used to determine the postretirement benefits obligations as of June 30, 2024 and 2023:

Discount Rate: 5.32% for 2024, 4.91% for 2023.

Mortality: For actives employees in the current valuation, 110% of the Pri-2012 Blue Collar Dataset Employee Headcount-Weighted Mortality, projected generationally using scale MP-2021. For healthy retirees, 110% of the Pri-2012 Blue Collar Dataset Retiree Headcount-Weighted Mortality, projected generationally using scale MP-2021. For disabled retirees, 110% of the Pri-2012 Total Dataset Disabled Retiree Headcount-Weighted Mortality, projected generationally using scale MP-2021.

Retirement: 100% of employees are assumed to retire at the following ages, once they have reached the applicable years of service:

For members who do not have an hour of service before July 1, 2009, age 51 becomes age 55.

Turnover and disability rates: Rates vary with age.

Participation: For current retirees, medical coverage elections based on the class code field provided on the data were used. For future retirees, 90% of eligible employees are assumed to elect coverage at retirement. Of those expected to elect coverage, participants currently electing single coverage based on their class code field provided on the data were assumed to continue electing single coverage at retirement. Participants currently covering a spouse are assumed to continue covering a spouse at retirement.

Spouse Age: For current retirees, actual spouse age based on spouse dates of birth was used if possible. For retirees where we could not determine the actual spouse age and for future retirees, females are assumed to be 3 years younger than male spouses.

Per Capita Costs: The expected per capita costs for post-retirement medical and Rx benefits for pre-Medicare retirees are based on active and retiree claims data provided through June 30, 2023.

Per capita costs were developed as follows:

- Total claims for each period were divided by the number of members in the plan based on monthly enrollment data and projected to the midpoint of the projection period using 6% trend.
- Expected per capita costs were developed based on a weighted average of experience during FY2022 and FY2023, with equal weighting assigned to each year.

The resulting average per capita claims costs were age adjusted using the Yamamoto aging.

The foregoing assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of the postretirement benefit obligations.

The Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement and Modernization Act of 2003 provides for a prescription drug benefit under Medicare (Medicare Part D) as well as a federal subsidy to sponsors of retiree health care benefit plans that provide a benefit that is at least actuarially equivalent to Medicare Part D. The Plan's actuary has determined that the Plan is at least actuarially equivalent to Medicare Part D. The Plan's benefit obligations as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, have been reduced for the subsidy that the Act provides will be paid to the Plan related to benefits attributed to past service.

**NOTE 4. POSTRETIREMENT BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS (continued)**

The costs of the postretirement benefits are shared by the Plan's participating employers and retirees. In addition to deductibles and co-payments, retirees pay a quarterly contribution. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description for more complete details. Contribution rates payable by retirees to the Plan during the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, were:

The Plan's deficiency of net assets over benefit obligations at June 30, 2024 and 2023, relates primarily to the postretirement benefit obligation, which is an actuarially calculated estimate of the amount required to fund postretirement benefits under the current plan rules. These benefits are not guaranteed or vested and the Plan's Trustees, as Sponsor, has the right under the Plan to modify the benefits provided to participants.

**NOTE 5. FEES MANDATED BY THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT**

The Plan is subject to certain fees mandated by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. Fees payable to the Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) are effective for seven years, through 2018. The Further Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2020 signed into law on December 20, 2019 extended the PCORI fee obligation another 10 years, through plan years ending before October 1, 2029. The fee is equal to \$3.22 and \$3.00, per covered life for the periods ending June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Plan paid \$3,493 and \$3,165, in PCORI fees, respectively.

**NOTE 6. TAX STATUS**

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter in August 22, 2006, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements under section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that, more likely than not, would not be sustained upon examination by the U.S. Federal, state, or local taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Typically, plan tax years will remain open for three years; however, this may differ depending upon the circumstances of the Plan.

**NOTE 7. PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION**

The Plan's Board of Trustees, as Sponsor has the right under the Plan to modify benefits provided to active employees. In the event of termination of the agreement and declaration of Trust, the balance of the net assets available for benefits is to be used to provide for the payment of all obligations of the Plan. Such payments shall be for exclusive benefit of the employees, their dependents or beneficiaries and the administrative expenses of the Plan.

**NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as economic, interest rate, market and sector risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Benefit obligations are based on certain estimates and assumptions. Due to uncertainties inherent in the process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near-term would be material to these financial statements.

#### **NOTE 10. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan shared certain administrative expenses with the Asbestos Workers Local No. 24 Defined Benefit Pension Plan (DB Plan), the Asbestos Workers Local No. 24 Defined Contribution Plan (DC Plan), and the Asbestos Workers Local No. 24 Apprenticeship Fund (Apprentice Fund). These expenses are allocated based upon pro-rata percentages. As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, the DC Plan, DB Plan, and Apprentice Fund did not have any outstanding liabilities to the Plan for expenses not allocated between the Funds.

During the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, the DB Plan withheld funds from the monthly pension distributions to the DB Plan's retirees. These withheld funds were then transferred to the Plan, on the retirees' behalf, as the retirees' contribution for health benefits. During the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, the DB Plan withheld \$227,665 and \$220,013, respectively, from retiree Pension distributions to be transferred to the Plan as contributions for health benefits. As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, the DB Plan did not have any outstanding liabilities to the Plan for retiree health benefit contributions withheld from pension distributions.

During the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, certain employers made contribution payments into the Plan that were for the related Plans. As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, \$812,722 and \$741,220, respectively, was due to related Plans.

#### **NOTE 11. CONCENTRATIONS**

Contributions from five employers accounted for 60% and 64% of total contributions received by the Plan during the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. If contributions from these employers were to cease, it could have a significant impact on the Plan and its net assets available for benefits.

The Plan places its cash with financial institutions deemed to be credit worthy. The balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000. Cash balances may at times exceed the insured deposit limits. At June 30, 2024, the Plan's cash in excess of FDIC coverage totaled \$1,682,287.

#### **NOTE 12. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 4, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and they have been evaluated in accordance with relevant accounting standards.
