- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Chesapeake Containment Systems 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE A – PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the Chesapeake Containment Systems 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information concerning the operation of the Plan. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Chesapeake Containment Systems, Inc. (the Plan Sponsor). The Plan Sponsor has elected to apply the 401(k) Safe Harbor provision. The Plan covers all employees of Chesapeake Containment Systems, Inc., Wind Defender, LLC, International Cover Systems, Inc., and Carolina Environmental Construction, LLC (collectively the Company). Participants who attained the age of 18 may enter the plan on the first day of the month following six months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Participant Contributions

Participants may elect to defer a percentage of their annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, not to exceed the maximum allowable contribution under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year may make additional catch-up contributions to the Plan. A participant’s Roth elective contributions are allocated to a separate account maintained for such contributions. Roth elective contributions are treated as elective contributions for all purposes under the Plan. Participants are also permitted to make rollover contributions into the Plan from other qualified retirement plans.

Company Contributions

The Company is required to make a matching contribution of 100% of elective deferral contributions that are not over 3% of eligible compensation, plus 50% of elective deferral contributions which are over 3% but are not over 5% of eligible compensation. For the year ended December 31, 2024, Company matching contributions totaled \$303,957. The Company may make additional discretionary contributions to the Plan. No discretionary contributions were made during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is participant-directed and credited with the participant’s contributions, distributions, and allocations of: (a) the Companies’ contributions, (b) the Plan earnings and losses, and (c) administrative expenses.

Allocations of earnings, losses, and administrative expenses are based on the proportion of each participant’s account balance to the total of all account balances within the respective fund. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portion of the participant’s account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant’s vested account balance, without regard to the intended use of the funds. A participant may have no more than one loan outstanding at any given time. Notes are secured by the participant’s vested account balance and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates for similar loans. Note

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repayments are to be made each pay period through payroll deductions. Notes are to be repaid within five years. Delinquent notes are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments and Benefits

Upon termination of service, death, disability, retirement (normal retirement age is 65) or attainment of age 59 ½, a participant or their beneficiary in the event of death is entitled to a distribution of their account balance. These amounts may be distributed in a lump sum payment of the entire vested account balance or a single sum distribution of a portion of the vested account balance not to exceed two such installments during a one-year period to the participant or another qualified plan, as designated by the participant, if the account balance exceeds \$5,000. If the balance is less the \$5,000, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Plan administrator, of an immediate and heavy financial need of a participant (or their primary beneficiary), amounts contributed by the participant may be withdrawn for a hardship purpose. Certain income tax penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59 ½.

Distributions and withdrawals are subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan agreement. As of December 31, 2023, there were no net assets of the Plan allocated to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan but had not received such distributions prior to year-end.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, rollover contributions, and required Company matching contributions plus earnings (losses) thereon. Participants vest in Company discretionary contributions and earnings thereon based upon years of continuous service as follows:

Participants become 100% vested in Company matching and discretionary contributions at the time of death, normal retirement age or total and permanent disability.

Investment Options

A participant can choose to allocate any portion or all of their account balance between the investment options.

Forfeitures

All forfeitures resulting from the withdrawal of participants prior to vesting are retained in the Plan and may be used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce discretionary Company contributions. Forfeitures will occur in the Plan year that participants receive a distribution of their entire vested balance. There were no forfeitures available to the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. No forfeitures were used to reduce Company contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE B – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to net assets available for benefits and deductions from net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in assets that are exposed to risks such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of these investments may occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. The notes bear interest at rates between 5.25% - 10.50%. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent notes are treated as distributions based on the terms of the Plan agreement.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs would be used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or Level 3 inputs for the years presented.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds is based on the quoted market prices of the mutual funds owned by the Plan at year-end.

The underlying securities in common trust funds are listed on national securities exchanges and/or have a readily determinable fair value. The fair value of these investments is used in determining the net asset value ("NAV") of the common trust funds, which is not publicly quoted but is available to current investors. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and the common trust funds can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. The NAV is calculated in a manner consistent with GAAP for investment companies. Because it is valued similarly to mutual funds, the Plan believes the common trust funds should be a level 1 asset to allow for consistent disclosure. The Plan's policy is to recognize transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and into and out of Level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no significant transfers between Levels 1 and 2 and no transfers into or out of Level 3.

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The methods described previously may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the end of the reporting date.

NOTE E – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company, d/b/a Principal Trust Company, who acts as the record keeper for the Plan. The record keeper is a related entity to the Custodian. The Plan loans funds to its participants according to the applicable provisions of the Plan document. The Company provides the Plan with certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. All such transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

NOTE F – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a non-standardized prototype plan with a deferral arrangement, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the taxing authorities and/or the Department of Labor for three years, including 2021, 2022 and 2023; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all contributions to the Plan would cease and all affected participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE H – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through March 31, 2025 (the issuance date of the financial statements) and has determined that there were no subsequent events to recognize or disclose in these financial statements.
