Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Peckham, Inc. Defined Contribution Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Peckham, Inc. Defined Contribution Retirement Plan financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 8 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the Financial Statements

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Peckham, Inc. Defined Contribution Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting; and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Peckham, Inc. (the Company or the Employer) Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the summary plan description and the plan agreement for complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan pursuant to Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code covering all employees of the Company, who have completed one year of service and 21 years of age, unless employed for the purpose of rehabilitation or work training programs and whose employment is governed by a contract established pursuant to the Federal Services Contract Act of 1965 or the employee is classified as "high need". It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Employer may contribute an amount at the end of each plan year for participants who have completed at least 1,000 hours of service in that plan year. The amount of the employer contribution (if any) is determined each year by the Employer's governing board. The employer discretionary contribution is allocated among participants in proportion to each participant's compensation received during the year. For the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023, the employer contributions were 9% or 3% of participant's compensation, as defined, for staff and for team members.

The Plan does not allow any rollover contributions from participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of (a) the Employer's contribution, (b) plan earnings, and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants become vested in their accounts based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Forfeitures

Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled approximately \$100,000 and \$111,000 at September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, approximately \$118,000 and \$100,000 respectively, of forfeitures were utilized.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement (normal retirement is age 59½), a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum amount, or in a variety of annuity options.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment into the Plan, a participant may direct their contributions to various investment accounts maintained under insurance contracts with Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association (TIAA) or the College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF). Participants may change their investment options daily.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting which differs from the accrual method primarily in the recognition of contributions.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodians. See Note 9 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Reclassifications

Certain prior year amounts have been reclassified for consistency with the current year presentation. These reclassifications had no impact on previously reported net income or net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 24, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan has entered into fully benefit-responsive and non-fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (TIAA Traditional) with TIAA-CREF. TIAA-CREF maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The average yield and crediting interest rate was approximately 3% and 4% for the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The crediting interest rate is reset each year.

As described in Note 2, the portion of the investment contract which is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the investment contract. TIAA-CREF has determined that contract value approximates fair value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participants withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 4 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5 - INCOME TAX/ERISA STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service issued its latest determination letter on January 15, 2014, which stated that the Plan and the underlying trust qualify under the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, are exempt from Federal income taxes. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of September 30, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although there has not been any expressed intent to do so, the Company reserves the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan in whole or in part at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their account balances.

NOTE 7 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Fees paid during the year for legal, accounting, administrative and other services rendered by parties in interest are, in the opinion of the plan administrator, based on customary and reasonable rates for such services.

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the plan sponsor and are not charged to the Plan.

The Plan's investments include funds sponsored by, or an affiliate of TIAA-CREF. As such, TIAA-CREF qualifies as party-in-interest as defined by ERISA. Thus, all investment transactions with TIAA-CREF and funds represent party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment.

NOTE 9 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting standards established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price.

Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
