1. Description of Plan:

The following description of the Pet Paradise 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established on February 1, 2019. The Plan is a 401(k) defined contribution plan covering all employees of American Pet Resort, LLC and Subsidiaries (the "Company"). The Plan is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

The Plan was restated effective January 1, 2023, to comply with Internal Revenue Service restatement requirements.

Eligibility

Eligible employees may become a participant upon completion of one year of service. Eligible employees may enroll on the first day of next month coincident with or next following the date the employee satisfies the Plan's eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute compensation, as defined by the Plan document, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

Effective January 1, 2023, the Company has elected to make safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 3% of eligible participant's compensation contributed to the Plan and 50% of the next 2% of eligible participant's compensation contributed to the Plan. Employees must meet the eligibility requirements, work 1,000 hours for a year of crediting service, and be an active participant during the contribution period to be eligible for the safe harbor matching contribution.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of Company contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant earnings are based on an allocation of plan earnings respective to each participant's account balances and investment selections. Any related administrative expenses based on participant earnings or account balances are deducted from the participant's account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested balance.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a variety of mutual funds, pooled separate accounts and a stable value fund as investment options for participants.

1. Description of Plan (Continued):

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Company safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures by non-vested participants are generally used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses. During 2023, the Plan used \$10,790 of forfeited non-vested accounts to pay administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2023, and 2022, forfeited non-vested accounts held to be used in the future totaled \$3,433 and \$445, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum or annuity distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account in accordance with Plan provisions. Additionally, under certain circumstances of financial hardship, the participant is allowed to withdraw funds from the Plan. Participants may elect to receive an in-service distribution after attaining the age of 59 ½.

Account balances that are under \$5,000 may be automatically distributed upon termination of service as a lump sum without the consent of the participant.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan may be paid by the Company or Plan. Unless paid by the Company, administrative expenses for recordkeeping and Plan investment advisory fees are charged to participant accounts and deducted proportionally based upon account balance. Fees related to the administration of distributions and participant investment advisory fees are charged to the related participant accounts.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the mutual funds and pooled separate accounts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

2. Summary of Accounting Policies (Continued):

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Income Valuation and Income Recognition

The investments of the Plan are reported at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of the investments within the Plan are reflected on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in a combination of investment securities which are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that the changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

3. Fair Value Measurements:

The Financial Accounting Standards Board, Accounting Standards Certification Topic 820 ("ASC 820"), establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). A financial instrument's level with the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

- Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.
- Level 2: Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3: Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

The following descriptions of the valuation methods and assumptions used by the Plan to estimate the fair values of investments apply to investments held directly by the Plan.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing NAV price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. Investments in mutual funds generally may be redeemed daily. These securities are classified as Level 1.

Pooled Separate Accounts: The value of the units held in pooled separate accounts is based on the net asset value ("NAV") of the units, determined by the security prices of the underlying investments. Many of the security prices are obtained from a pricing service, Interactive Data Corporation. While the underlying security prices are quoted prices, the NAV of a separate account is not publicly quoted.

Common collective trust fund: The Principal Stable Value Fund, held in a common collective trust fund, invests in conventional and synthetic guaranteed investment contracts (GICs) issued by life insurance companies, banks and other financial institutions with excess cash invested in cash equivalents. These investments are valued at their NAV per share as of the close of business on the valuation date as a practical expedient for the estimated fair value. The NAV is quoted on a private market that is not active; however, the unit price is based on the value of the underlying investment assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The NAV for the Stable Value Fund is based on the contract value of fully benefit-responsive contracts, conventional and synthetic GICs, which represents invested principal plus accrued interest thereon. The Stable Value Fund seeks to provide preservation of capital and relatively stable returns regardless of the volatility of the financial markets.

The Principal Stable Value Fund is valued at the NAV of the units held by the Plan. NAV would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. There are no significant redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

5. Plan Termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

6. Excess Contribution Payable:

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of the amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

7. Party-in-Interest Transactions:

Plan investments are pooled separate accounts managed by Principal Life Insurance Company. Principal Life Insurance Company is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. The Plan paid \$1,385 to Principal during the Plan year ended December 31, 2023, for management and recordkeeping services and transaction fees which are included in administrative expenses in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

9. Tax Status:

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and tax counsel believe the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that as of December 31, 2023, the Plan had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition of a liability (or asset) in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. federal, state, or local tax authorities for years before 2020.

10. Nonexempt Transactions:

During the Plan year ended December 31, 2023 employee deferrals of \$26,986 were not remitted to the Plan within the appropriate time frame specified by the Department of Labor, which were pending correction at December 31, 2023.

11. Subsequent Events:

The Securing a Strong Retirement Act ("SECURE 2.0 Act") was signed into law on December 29, 2022, and includes mandatory and optional provisions with varying effective dates in 2023 and later. The Plan Administrator will determine the optional provisions to elect and amend the Plan document accordingly.

Management has evaluated subsequent events through April 29, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be filed and has determined that, except as disclosed above, there were no material events requiring recognition or disclosure.
