## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

### **Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the D.A. Davidson Companies Employee Stock Ownership Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the D.A. Davidson Companies Employee Stock Ownership Plan as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Basis for Opinion**

The information has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards.

**1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following brief description of the D.A. Davidson Companies (the Company or the Employer) Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan has been amended for the provisions of the Pension Protect Act (PPA) of 2006, the Heroes Earning Assistance and Relief Act (HEART Act) and Worker, Retiree, and Employer Recovery Act of 2008 (WRERA) requirements. The Plan was restated in January 2014, to be a stock bonus plan and an employee stock ownership plan in a single document. In addition, the Plan has been amended periodically to allow for the recognition of prior service for eligibility and vesting for businesses acquired by the Company.

*Eligibility*

The Plan is a stock bonus plan and an employee stock ownership plan covering all employees who have completed six months of service. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) as amended.

*Employer Contributions*

Discretionary contributions are determined by the Company's Board of Directors and are based on a percentage of total recognized compensation as defined by the Plan. The Company contributes the discretionary contribution to the Plan in either cash or Company common stock. Employer stock discretionary contributions totaled \$3,861,974 and \$2,295,926 for the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Contributions are allocated to participants' accounts based on the percentage each participant's recognized compensation bears to total recognized compensation of all participants. The maximum contribution allowed shall not exceed the maximum amount deductible by the Company for federal income tax purposes.

*Forfeitures*

According to the Plan, forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are to be used for the following: 1) to make restorations for rehired participants; 2) reduce Employer contributions; 3) pay Plan expenses; or 4) to correct errors, omissions and exclusions. Forfeitures of \$85,636 or 1,009 shares and \$41,165 or 664 shares were used to reduce the employer contributions for the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

*Participant Accounts*

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of the Company's common stock contribution, Company common stock dividends and Plan earnings or losses. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

*Vesting*

Participants vest 20% per year after two years of service in their account and become 100% vested after completing six years of service with the Employer. In addition, participants will be fully vested if prior to withdrawal from the Plan, a participant dies, attains the age of 65, becomes disabled, or if the Plan is terminated or there is a complete discontinuance of contributions to the Plan.

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their reinvested dividends.

*Administrative Expenses*

As provided in the Plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

*Payment of Benefits*

The full value of a participant's vested account may be distributed to the participant in one lump sum or by various other methods as detailed in the Plan upon termination of employment, retirement or death. Benefits are distributable in Company common stock or cash. Fractional shares, if any, are distributed in cash. Vested accounts which do not exceed \$5,000 are automatically distributed as a lump-sum. At age 59 and 1/2, participants are allowed in-service distributions of all or a portion of their vested account balance.

*Put Option*

Under Federal income tax regulations, the Company common stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, is required to include a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its common stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the current fair market value of the Company common stock. The put option must be exercised by written notification to the Employer during the sixty-day period beginning on the date the Company common stock is first distributed or during the sixty-day period that begins one year after such date. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of four years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash. The Board of Directors of the Company can cause the Plan to assume the Company's rights and obligations under the put option. The Plan did not repurchase any shares as a result of the put option during the years ended September 30, 2024 or 2023.

*Call Option*

The Company has a call option right to purchase participants' ESOP shares upon certain triggering events. Effective October 1, 2019, the ESOP provides that at the later of age 65 or termination of employment, the ESOP will require the participant to take a distribution from the ESOP in kind in D.A. Davidson Companies shares. At the time of the distribution in kind, the Company would have a call option to elect to purchase all of any portion of the shares distributed. The call price is representative of the current fair market value of the Company common stock. The Company can pay for the common stock that is called, with interest, over a period of four years. The Plan did not repurchase any shares as a result of the call option during the years ended September 30, 2024 or 2023.

*Voting Rights*

Each participant and beneficiary shall be entitled to direct D.A. Davidson Trust Company (the Trustee) as to the manner in which all Employer securities which are held in such Participant's or Beneficiary's Account (and which are entitled to vote) are to be voted. On certain major corporate issues that require approval by the Company's shareholders (such as merger or liquidation), voting must be "passed through" to participants and beneficiaries of deceased participants based on the shares in their accounts (whether vested or not). On all other matters, while not required by the Plan, the Company voluntarily has also allowed pass-through voting.

*Diversification Elections/Plan-to-Plan Transfers*

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have an opportunity to move part of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 and have been a participant in the Plan for ten years may elect to diversify, on an annual basis or more frequently if permitted by the Board of Directors of the Company, certain percentages of their eligible account, as defined by the Plan. In each of the first five years a participant may diversify up to a cumulative total of 25 percent of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year the percentage changes to 50 percent.

Participants who elect to diversify are allowed to transfer the amounts to the D.A. Davidson Companies Retirement Savings and Profit Sharing Plan (RSPSP), and are invested in one of the alternate investment vehicles made available under the Company RSPSP. Participants are then subject to the terms of that plan.

Transfers of Plan assets to the Company RSPSP consist of assets transferred out of the Plan for qualified participant diversification elections. Transfers to the Company RSPSP during the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023 were \$269,013 and \$1,031,964, respectively.

**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

*Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

*Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

*Contributions*

Discretionary employer contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the Company formally authorizes the contributions for, in accordance with the Plan's provisions, and are subject to the Plan's funding deadlines.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments in the Company common stock are stated at current estimated fair value as of September 30, 2024 and 2023. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid for a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. As the Company common stock is not readily available to the public, market value is determined semi-annually by an independent valuation specialist. Because of the inherent uncertainty of valuation, those estimated values may differ from the values that would have been used had a ready market for the securities existed and the differences could be material. The independent valuation specialist used the Income (Discounted Cash Flow Method) and Market (Guideline Public Company Method) approaches to arrive at the fair market value of the Company common stock investments at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

As of September 30, 2024 and 2023, investments of the Plan consisted entirely of Company common stock. The Company common stock securities were valued at \$84.90 per share and \$62.00 per share at September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The Plan presents in the statements of changes in net assets the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of its investments, which consists of the realized gains (losses) and the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of those investments.

*Plan Costs*

All of the Plan costs, other than distribution and Qualified Domestic Relation Order (QDRO) fees charged to participant accounts, are absorbed and paid by the Employer. For fiscal years 2024 and 2023, the Company paid \$196,244 and \$200,948, respectively, for trust services and administrative fees provided for the Plan.

*Payment of Benefits*

Benefits are recorded when paid.

*Risks and Uncertainties*

The Plan assets are invested entirely in Company common stock, which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with investment in the Company common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the Company common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) developed the Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, to establish a framework for measuring fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Valuation techniques used to measure fair value must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The valuation techniques used are based upon observable and unobservable inputs. Observable inputs reflect market data obtained from independent sources, while unobservable inputs reflect the Company's market assumptions. These two types of inputs create the following hierarchy:

Level 1 assets include inputs based on quoted prices in active markets for identical assets, which provides the most reliable fair value measurement.

Level 2 assets include inputs other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the measurement date. These observable inputs include quoted prices for similar assets, and bond pricing models based on interest rates, credit risk and remaining maturity for similar assets.

Level 3 assets do not have observable pricing for all significant inputs as of the measurement date. These assets are valued based on best estimates of fair value, which may include significant judgment or estimation.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024.

*D.A. Davidson Companies common stock:* Valued at estimated fair value based upon an independent valuation. The valuation specialist took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables and estimated fair value of company assets and liabilities.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in changes in net assets for the period above are reported in net (depreciation) appreciation in the fair value of Company common stock in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

The fair value of the Company common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based upon an independent appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the Market and Income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. Plan management accumulates the data for the appraiser from the audited financial statements of the Company. The appraisal includes a discount for lack of marketability.

**4. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Company has designated an administrative committee to direct the management and investment of the trust fund and a trustee to hold assets of the Plan, all of which are related parties. D.A. Davidson Trust Company (the Trustee) is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company. The Trustee provides goal-directed asset management and trust and financial consulting services to its customers. The Trustee received its Federal Savings Bank (FSB) charter and began its trust operations under federal supervision and control on January 1, 2001.

For the year ended September 30, 2024, the Company authorized the contribution of 44,480 shares of Company common stock to be transferred to the Plan. The Company common stock was valued at \$84.90 per share at September 30, 2024.

For the year ended September 30, 2023, the Company authorized the contribution of 36,367 shares of Company common stock to be transferred to the Plan. The Company common stock was valued at \$62.00 per share at September 30, 2023.

**5. FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Plan sponsor by a letter dated August 22, 2014, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine examination by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

**6. PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION OF THE PLAN**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participant accounts will become fully vested.

**7. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through April 29, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Management determined there were no subsequent events that required reporting in the financial statements.
