We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of S & S Sprinkler Company, L.L.C. 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. ## **S & S Sprinkler Company, L.L.C. 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan Notes to Financial Statements**

### **Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the S & S Sprinkler Company, L.L.C. 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Refer to the Plan's document for a more complete description of the Plan provisions.

#### ***General***

The Plan, adopted January 1, 2003, is a defined contribution plan established by S & S Sprinkler Company, L.L.C. (the Company) under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), which includes a qualified cash or deferred arrangement as described in Section 401(k) of the IRC, for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's (DOL's) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan's Investment Review Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Board of Trustees.

The administration of the Plan is the responsibility of an administrator appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company. Some administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No compensation is remitted to the Company for these services.

Plan assets are held and managed by Capital Bank and Trust Company, the trustee and qualified institution for the Plan, which invests contributions and Plan earnings, makes investment transactions as directed by the Investment Review Committee and provides certain recordkeeping services and annual ERISA compliance testing.

The Plan Sponsor was purchased by Pye Barker Fire and Safety in November 2023. Plan assets began to transfer to the Pye Barker 401k Plan in November of 2023 and the transfer completed in the first quarter of 2024. See Note 7 for additional information on the Plan Merger.

#### ***Eligibility***

All employees of the Company who have attained the age of 19 are eligible to participate once 500 hours of service are met within a six month time frame. Employees may begin participating in the Plan on the first day of the month following when they become eligible.

## S & S Sprinkler Company, L.L.C. 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan Notes to Financial Statements

### Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

#### ***Contributions***

Each year, participants may elect to defer up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to limitations under the IRC. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company matches of 25% of each dollar of participant contribution up to 6%, which totaled \$148,960 for the year ended December 31, 2023. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

#### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company's matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### ***Vesting***

Participants are fully vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant vests according to the following schedule:

#### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. A participant may have two loans outstanding at a time. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 1% plus the prime rate published in the *Wall Street Journal* on the first business day of each month. Principal and interest is paid ratably through regular payroll deductions.

## **S & S Sprinkler Company, L.L.C. 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan Notes to Financial Statements**

### **Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)**

#### ***Benefit Payments***

Upon termination of service due to retirement, death, disability, or other service, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. The form of payment is a lump-sum distribution or an installment distribution if a participant's vested interest is greater than \$5,000. Additionally, distributions may be provided in instances of financial hardship as determined by the plan administrator.

#### ***Forfeitures***

Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 as of December 31, 2023 and 2022. Forfeitures will be used to reduce future employer contributions and pay Plan fees. In 2023, employer contributions were reduced by \$2,215 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

### **Note 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

#### ***Hardship Withdrawals***

As permitted by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and in accordance with the Plan agreement, a participant may request a financial hardship withdrawal if they experience a severe financial hardship. The financial hardship withdrawal may not exceed the amount of the financial hardship or the value of the vested portion of the participant's balance, whichever is less.

#### ***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) provides authoritative guidance regarding U.S. GAAP through the Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) and related Accounting Standards Updates (ASUs).

#### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of U.S. GAAP financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### **Note 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)**

#### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments generally are reported at fair value, but may also be reported at net asset value (NAV). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements. The Plan's Investment Review Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participant loans are measured at the amount of unpaid principal plus any accrued and unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expense and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 and 2022.

#### ***Excess Contributions Payable***

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants before March 15, 2024.

#### ***Payment of Benefits***

Distributions to participants are recorded when paid.

#### ***Administrative Expenses***

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation/depreciation of fair value of investments.

#### ***Risks and Uncertainties***

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that these changes could materially affect amounts reported in the Plan's financial statements.

### Note 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

#### *Subsequent Events*

Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, May 1, 2025, and determined events relating to the plan termination requiring disclosure. See Note 7 – Plan Termination for additional details. No subsequent events occurring after this date have been evaluated for inclusion in these financial statements.

### Note 3: INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY QUALIFIED INSTITUTION

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following financial information included in the Plan's financial statements was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Capital Bank and Trust Company, the qualified institution.

- a) Total investments, at fair value, included in the statements of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2023 and 2022.
- b) Notes receivable from participants, included in the statements of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2023 and 2022.
- c) Investment income, net appreciation in the value of investments, other income and interest income from notes receivable included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023.
- d) All amounts included in Note 4, *Fair Value Measurements*.
- e) All information included in the supplemental schedule, Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2023.

### Note 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. There are three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair values:

*Level 1:* Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the entity has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

### Note 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

*Level 2:* Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs, other than quoted prices, that are:
  - observable; or
  - can be corroborated by observable market data.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3:* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

*Money market fund:* The account is a government money market mutual fund that seeks to preserve the value of the Plan's investment. The fund is value based on the closing market price.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Accordingly, these NAV based investments have been excluded from the fair value hierarchy leveling.

**Note 5: TAX STATUS**

The Internal Revenue Service issued an opinion letter dated March 31, 2014, stating that the prototype plan that was adopted by the Plan was designed in accordance with applicable IRC requirements as of that date. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. The plan administrator has not applied for a separate determination letter on the Plan; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

Tax positions are recognized only if it is "more likely than not" that the tax position be sustained in a tax examination, with a tax examination being presumed to occur. The amount recognized is the largest amount that is greater than 50% likely of being realized on examination. For tax positions not meeting the "more likely than not" test, no tax position is recorded. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 6: RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan paid certain expenses related to plan operations and investment activity to the Plan's trustee, record keeper, and independent auditors. These expenses totaled \$133,119 for the year ended December 31, 2023. These transactions qualify as permissible party-in-interest transactions.

### Note 6: RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS (Continued)

Plan investments are managed by Capital Bank and Trust Company. Capital Bank and Trust Company is the trustee as defined by the Plan. Capital Bank and Trust Company provides certain administrative expenses to the Plan pursuant to a Master Plan Services Agreements (MSA) between the Company and Capital Bank and Trust Company. Capital Bank and Trust Company receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services Capital Bank and Trust Company provides to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Capital Bank and Trust Company and others for administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by Capital Bank and Trust Company from such mutual fund service providers exceeds the amount owed under the MSA, Capital Bank and Trust Company remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During 2023, the Plan received credits under this program of \$0 and used credits towards fees of \$27,552. The cumulative credit balance as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, which is included in the money market account, was \$20,060 and \$46,783, respectively.

### Note 7: PLAN TERMINATION

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

The Plan Sponsor was purchased by Pye Barker Fire and Safety in November 2023, and the Plan's assets were merged into the surviving Sponsor's plan. \$1,118,441 of Plan assets were transferred out of the Plan before December 31, 2023. The Plan's remaining assets were transferred in the first quarter of 2024 and the Plan was terminated.
