Scope and Nature of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of The Taunton Press, Inc. Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of November 22, 2024 and December 31, 2023 (in liquidation), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from January 1, 2024 to November 22, 2024 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of November 22, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and for the period from January 1, 2024 to November 22, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section -

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- the information in the financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

As described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the governing body of plan approved an action to terminate the Plan effective December 31, 2023. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting to the liquidation basis used in presenting the financial statements. Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.



1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The Taunton Press, Inc. Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. For a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, refer to the Plan document.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on January 1, 1987, available to all full-time employees of Taunton, Inc. and subsidiaries (the "Plan Sponsor" or "Company"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan is administered by the Company and the administrative committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Trustee") serves as the trustee to the Plan.

Plan Termination

On December 1, 2023, the Plan experienced a partial termination due to the sale of certain assets and liabilities of the Plan Sponsor, which resulted in certain participants becoming employees of the buyer or were terminated by the Plan Sponsor. Subsequently, the Plan Sponsor adopted a resolution to terminate the Plan effective December 31, 2023 (the "Termination Date"). Benefit payments were paid in full during 2024. Administrative expenses anticipated to be incurred by the Plan in liquidation were accrued as of December 31, 2023.

Eligibility

Employees who had attained the age of 21 or older and, effective August 1, 2019, completed at least one month of service (previously six months), as defined in the Plan document, were eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan excluded employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement, certain non-resident aliens and casual per-diem workers. As of the Termination Date, the Plan ceased accepting new participants.

Contributions

Each year, participants were able to contribute up to 60% of their pretax annual compensation to the Plan, as defined in the Plan document. The participants were also able to designate some or all of their elective deferral as after-tax contributions, also known as Roth contributions. Participants who had attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants were also able to contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans, as defined in the Plan document. Participants directed the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan automatically enrolled newly eligible participants into the Plan using a pre-tax 3% deferral rate. The deferral rate was automatically increased by 1% annually up to a maximum automatic elective deferral of 6%. Participants were able to elect to opt out of automatic enrollment.

Prior to the Termination Date, the Company previously made matching contributions in an amount equal to 100% of each eligible participant's deferral amount, subject to a maximum of \$250. In addition, the Company was also able to make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution on behalf of each eligible participant, as defined in the Plan document. For the period from January 1, 2024 to November 22, 2024, no matching or discretionary profit sharing contributions were made. Contributions in any calendar year may not exceed the limits under Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") Sections 401(k), 404 and 415.

Participants' Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants were able to borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of a) \$50,000, or b) 50% of the participant's vested account balance. The funds required to satisfy a borrowing request are withdrawn on a pro-rata basis from various investment funds in the participant's account. The borrowings generally must be fully repaid within five years. Borrowings for a primary residence may be repaid within a reasonable time based on the discretion of the Plan's administrator.

The loans were secured by the balance in the participant's account and bore interest at a rate commensurate with market rates for similar loans. Participant loans generally must be fully repaid within five years, unless the loan was for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the period can be extended to 10 years. Participants can have no more than one loan outstanding at any given time. As of the Termination Date, no new loans shall be made from the Plan.

Vesting

Participants were vested immediately in their contributions and employer matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon was based on years of service as follows:

Participants who attain the age of 65 while still employed with the Company were 100% vested in their account balance.

As of the Termination Date, all participants became 100% vested in their account balance.

Participant Distributions

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the participant's vested interest in his or her account or annual installments over a period of not more than their assumed life expectancy as determined at the time of distribution. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$51,629. These accounts were available to be used to reduce future employer contributions and/or pay for qualified plan expenses. During the period from January 1, 2024 to November 22, 2024, the Plan Sponsor used all remaining forfeitures, plus earnings thereon, to pay Plan expenses and allocate the remainder to Plan participants.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements were prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and changes in net assets available for benefits during the year. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates. Any adjustments applied to estimated amounts are recognized in the year such adjustments are determined.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 8 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification ("FASB ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). Categorization within the valuation hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Under the standard, fair value is defined as the exit price, or the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date.

Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and, inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans were reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in "Net appreciation in fair value of investments."

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

In accordance with FASB ASC 855, *Subsequent Events*, the Company has evaluated subsequent events through April 16, 2025, the date on which these financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.

3. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

4. PLAN TERMINATION

As discussed in Note 1, effective December 1, 2023, the Plan experienced partial termination and subsequently, the Plan Sponsor adopted a resolution to terminate the Plan effective December 31, 2023. As such, participants with a Plan account balance became 100% vested in their employer discretionary contributions and were entitled to the entire amount of their account balance. No further employees will become eligible under the Plan and no further contributions shall be made to the Plan.

5. TAX STATUS

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by the Trustee, which received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") dated June 30, 2020, stating that the prototype document satisfied the provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax council believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and that, therefore, the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) of the IRC and is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(a) of such code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of November 22, 2024 and December 31, December 31, 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

6. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN TRUSTEE

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following is a summary of information regarding the Plan as of November 22, 2024 and December 31 December 31, 2023, and for the period from January 1, 2024 to November 22, 2024, which was prepared by or derived from information prepared by the Trustee and furnished to the Plan administrator. The Plan administrator has obtained a certification from the Trustee, that such information, is complete and accurate.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Additionally, certain Plan expenses are paid directly by the Company.

Certain Plan investment options consist of shares of mutual funds managed by an affiliate of the Trustee. Accordingly, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants are also party-in-interest transactions.

8. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

There were no assets held by the Plan as of November 22, 2024.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023.

Mutual funds and money market fund: are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the NAV of the securities held in such funds and are classified as Level 1 investments. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust: is valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Unit values are determined by dividing the fund's net assets at fair value by its units outstanding at the valuation dates.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
