Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Bayer Built Woodworks, Inc. Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Bayer Built Woodworks, Inc. Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion



NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Bayer Built Woodworks, Inc. (the Employer) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established January 1, 1993 and has been amended and restated throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The Plan was most recently amended and restated effective February 17, 2022 as part of the Cycle 3 remedial amendment period. There were no changes to Plan provisions from the prior restatement. The Plan covers all employees of the Employer who have completed 30 days of service and are age 21 or older. Plan entry dates are monthly. The Plan is subject to ERISA. The Retirement Plan Committee is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, and along with their external investment advisor determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

The Plan includes a salary deferral arrangement allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants are permitted to elect to have a portion of their compensation contributed as pre-tax 401(k) or Roth contributions to the Plan. The Plan includes an automatic enrollment feature whereby eligible participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation, and their contributions invested in the designated default fund until changed by the participant. The deferral rate is also automatically increased each Plan year by 1% up to a maximum of 15% of eligible compensation, unless the participant elects otherwise. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Employer makes a 401(k) matching contribution to the Plan. The 401(k) matching contribution is made each pay period to eligible participants who elected salary reduction contributions for the pay period. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer matching contribution was 25% of the first 4% of eligible compensation deferred, limited to 1% of compensation deferred.

The Employer may, at its discretion, elect to make a discretionary contribution to the Plan. A participant must have completed 500 hours of service during the Plan year if they were not employed on the last day of the Plan year in order to be eligible for the additional discretionary contribution. There were no additional discretionary contributions authorized for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's deferral contributions, the Employer's matching contribution, the Employer additional discretionary contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of participant administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their deferral contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, vest at a rate of 20% per year starting with the second year of service. A participant is 100% vested after the completion of six years of credited service. Notwithstanding the above, a participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Note transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund (to) from the participant note. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, retirement, or early retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump-sum distribution, installments, or an annuity. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59½ and hardship distributions, subject to Plan provisions. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. If the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$7,000, the Plan Sponsor may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts can be used to reduce future Employer matching contributions to the Plan or to pay administrative expenses. The forfeited nonvested accounts were \$16 and \$50 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The forfeited nonvested amounts used to reduce the Employer matching contributions were \$42,799 and \$26,084 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The forfeited nonvested amounts used to pay administrative expenses were \$234 and \$2,886 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Retirement Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodian, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expense. The Plan utilizes an expense account to pay asset-based investment advisory fees which are allocated to participant accounts. Investment related expenses including the expense account for investment advisory fees and revenue sharing credits are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Principal Life Insurance Company, the insurance company, Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company dba: Principal Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, and Principal Life Insurance Company (on behalf of Principal Global Investors Trust Company), the trustee of the Principal Stable Value Fund, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of the investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs that utilize quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units as determined by the insurance company. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

Collective Trust Funds: Valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 5 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their accounts and the Plan administrator will facilitate the distribution of account balances under the provisions of the Plan and Trust Agreement until all assets have been distributed.

NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan is in the form of a pre-approved plan which is placing reliance on an opinion letter received from the IRS on the pre-approved plan indicating that the pre-approved plan is qualified under Section 401 of the IRC and is, therefore, not subject to tax under current income tax law. The pre-approved plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The investments are managed by Principal Life Insurance Company, the insurance company, Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company dba: Principal Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, and Principal Life Insurance Company (on behalf of Principal Global Investors Trust Company), the trustee of the Principal Stable Value Fund. Therefore, all transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment advisory services to MMA Securities, LLC are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.
