Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Machinists Health and Welfare Trust Fund (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits and of benefit obligations as of July 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and of changes in benefit obligations for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations of Machinists Health and Welfare Trust Fund as of July 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits and of benefit obligations for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Machinists Health and Welfare Trust Fund (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only.

General

The Plan provides for medical, vision, hearing, dental, weekly disability, death, life insurance, and accidental death and dismemberment benefits for eligible employees (and dependents) of employers under collective bargaining agreements, special agreements, or nonbargaining agreements.

The Plan also has an Alaska Plan which provides for medical, dental, and vision benefits for eligible employees (and dependents) of employers under a collective bargaining agreement with Machinists District Lodge 160.

The Plan also provides for medical and related welfare benefits to certain individuals who have retired from active employment, their spouses, and dependent children. The Plan provides no other retiree coverage and no new retirees are eligible for this benefit.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions and Benefits

The Plan is maintained for employees whose employers are required to contribute to the Plan pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement, special agreement, or nonbargaining agreement. Some of the agreements provide for employee cost-sharing provisions.

Medical and prescription benefits are self-funded. Dental and vision benefits provided under the Alaska Plan are self-funded. All other benefits are fully insured. Benefits and premiums are recorded when paid by the Plan.

The Plan also provides that retiree participants make self-payments to the Plan, the amount of which is fixed from time to time by the Board of Trustees.

An employee will become initially eligible for benefits on the first day of the second month following the month during which he or she was compensated for a minimum of 80 hours. Coverage will cease at the end of the month following the month in which the employee fails to be compensated for 80 hours. Coverage is also available for eligible dependents.

For the Alaska Plan, an employee will become initially eligible for benefits on the first of the month following 60 days from the employee's most recent date of hire, following work of 450 continuous hours, or work of 40 continuous days in each calendar year. Dependent coverage is available to employees who have completed one year of eligibility under the Plan.

If an active participant loses eligibility, the participant may self-pay for up to 18 months of coverage through COBRA. Additional periods of continued coverage apply in the case of disability or death of the participant.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Board of Trustees determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodian.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from employers are accrued based on the work month for which the employer is required to provide coverage.

Contributions from retiree participants are due on the 10th of the month preceding the month of coverage.

Some collective bargaining agreements of participating employers provide for employee cost-sharing provisions. These categories of contributions have been combined as contributions in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits as the amounts are remitted by the employer along with employer contributions and are a part of the negotiated wage package for employees of the applicable employers.

Plan Benefit Obligations

Self-funded benefits are recorded when paid. Effective with August 1, 2013 eligibility, medical and vision benefits were moved to a self-funding arrangement with Regence BlueCross BlueShield and Vision Service Plan, respectively. The Plan is obligated to provide benefits for the participants' August and September eligibility because that eligibility results from June and July employer contributions that have been recorded as revenue by the Plan.

Lag months eligibility coverage is based on the estimated average claim cost per eligible participant times the number of eligible participants for two months following year-end. The determination of the estimated liability did not include assumptions for mortality and employee turnover, which are assumed to be insignificant to the estimate.

Claims payable and claims incurred but not reported are estimates of the cost to the Plan for claims incurred by participants under the terms of the Plan through July 31 of each year but paid by the Plan subsequent to July 31. They were estimated based on prior claims experience and actual lag patterns of the Plan.

Plan Benefit Obligations (Continued)

The Plan's obligation for eligibility for future benefits is based on the number of months of unused eligibility as of the Plan year-end for Alaska Plan participants for whom employers make an annual contribution.

Premiums payable are accrued based upon the eligibility requirements of the Plan.

Refunds and Rebates

Prescription refunds due from the Plan's pharmacy benefits manager are recorded when earned. Refunds due as year-end are recorded as a receivable on the statements of net assets available for benefits, with the offset being netted against claims paid. Pharmacy rebates totaling \$1,385,810 and \$1,160,296, have been netted against benefits paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended July 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Stop Loss

Claims that were already paid by the Plan that exceeded the stop-loss coverage and are due to the Plan at year-end are recorded as a receivable on the statements of net assets available for benefits. Premiums for stop-loss insurance are included in premium payments in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Stop loss refunds totaling \$737,049 and \$420,270 have been netted against benefits paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended July 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Postretirement Benefits

On June 10, 2004, the Board of Trustees decided to eliminate the Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 965 Retiree Liability Study. No new retirees can enter the Plan. Retiree benefits are fully insured. Since future contributions are expected to equal future premiums, the postretirement benefit obligation at July 31, 2024 and 2023 is \$-0-.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, benefit obligations and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 29, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Change in Accounting Policy

The Plan has adopted Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-13, *Financial Instruments - Credit Losses (Topic 326): Measurement of Credit Losses on Financial Instruments*, effective August 1, 2023, utilizing the modified retrospective transition method. The accounting standard modifies the method for estimating credit losses on financial assets from probable or incurred credit losses to lifetime expected future credit losses (CECL). No cumulative effect adjustment to net assets available for benefits as of August 1, 2023, was necessary upon adoption.

Employer Contributions Receivable

Contributions due but not paid prior to year-end are recorded as contributions receivable. Contributions are due from employers as specified in the collective bargaining or participation agreement. In general, contributions are due on the 15th day of each month following the work month. Delinquent contributions and payroll audit findings are individually analyzed for collectability. The estimate for expected credit losses considers historical loss experience, current economic conditions, and forward-looking information, including factors such as payment history, employer financial condition, and labor trends. As of July 31, 2024, the allowance for credit losses was insignificant.

NOTE 3 PLAN TERMINATION

The Trust Agreement may be terminated at any time by action of the trustees, provided that, if the signatory parties hereto are other than the trustees, any such action shall require the written approval of the signatory parties (or their successors).

The Trust and Plan shall be automatically terminated upon the expiration of all collective bargaining agreements and special agreements requiring the payment of contributions to the Trust Fund, provided that for purposes of this provision a collective bargaining agreement or special agreement shall not be deemed to have expired in a strike or lockout situation, unless said strike or lockout continues for more than six months, provided that for purposes of this provision a collective bargaining agreement or special agreement shall not be deemed to have expired in a strike or lockout situation, unless said strike or lockout continues for more than six months.

In the event of the termination of the Trust and Plan, the trustees shall apply the assets of the Trust to pay, or to provide for the payment of, any and all obligations of the Trust, and shall distribute and allocate all assets of the Trust in accordance with the provisions of the Plan. In no event shall any of the assets remaining in the Trust be paid to or be recoverable by an employer or union.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at July 31, 2024 and 2023.

Short-Term Fund – Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

U.S. Securities and Corporate Bonds – Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuers with similar credit ratings. When quoted prices are not available for identical or similar bonds, the bond is valued under a discounted cash flows approach that maximizes observable inputs, such as current yields of similar instruments, but includes adjustments for certain risks that may not be observable, such as credit and liquidity risks or a broker quote is available.

Preferred Stock – Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Mutual Funds – Investments in mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 5 TAX STATUS

The Trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, accordingly, the Trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan obtained its latest exemption letter on May 9, 1989, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the Plan, as designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the exemption letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan provides for investment in a variety of investment securities. In general, investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that change in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan maintains its cash balances in a high credit quality financial institution. Accounts at this institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000. At times such cash balances may be in excess of the insurance limit.

Lag months eligibility coverage is based on the estimated average claim cost per eligible participant times the number of eligible participants for two months following year-end. The obligation for claims incurred but not reported is estimated based on prior claims experience and actual lag patterns of the Plan. The Plan's obligation for eligibility for future benefits is based on the number of months of unused eligibility as of the Plan year-end for Alaska Plan participants for whom employers make an annual contribution. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and the assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.
