NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the C. Blackburn Inc. Retirement Plan, (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established on October 1, 1998, but was restated on January 1, 2022. The plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. Employees are immediately eligible upon commencement of employment to participate in the Prevailing Wage Contribution.

Contributions

The Plan Sponsor makes Prevailing Wage Contribution amounts specified for the Plan year. Contributions also include discretionary profit sharing.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the (a) the Company contributions and, (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on each participant's earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in the company's prevailing wage and discretionary profit-sharing contributions.

Participant Loans

The plan does not allow for participant loans.

Payment of Benefits

Participants, or their beneficiaries, are eligible to receive payment of benefits in the event of the participant's retirement, death, disability, or termination or the termination of the Plan. Benefits are distributed according to provisions set forth in the plan document. Such options include lump sum and partial distributions.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$0. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and administrative expenses. Also, in 2024, employer contributions and administrative expenses were reduced by \$0 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when they are earned. Employee contributions are recorded when withheld from pay. Expenses are recorded in the accounting period in which they are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded in the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investment bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation(depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 as described as follows:

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for asset measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: The fair value is determined on the basis of quoted prices in an active market. Shares of mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of shares held by the Plan on the last business day of the Plan year where the price of the fund is quoted in an active market.

Common Collective Trust Fund: The initial pricing input is the quoted price obtained for the underlying mutual fund which is then adjusted to apply the expense factor disclosed in the annuity contract. The formula-calculated unit value is then compared to an accounting-driven unit value the following morning. The accounting unit value is determined in a manner similar to a mutual fund NAV calculation: dividing the net assets by the number of units outstanding. Any discrepancies between the two-unit values are resolved to ensure the recordkeeping system reflects the accurate value for the day.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Changes in fair value levels: To assess the appropriate classification of investments within the fair value hierarchy, the availability of market data is monitored. Changes in economic conditions or valuation techniques may require the transfer of investments from one fair value level to another. We evaluate the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the investment and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5. GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH EMPOWER ANNUITY INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan has a group annuity contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company that invests contributions in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund totaling \$1,938,284 for 2024 and \$2,084,123 for 2023. The Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is a general account product. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate is reset quarterly.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for plan benefits attributable to the group annuity contract since the contract was determined to be a FBRIC. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. At December 31, 2024, the Plan Administrator does believe that such events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring.

NOTE 5. GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH EMPOWER ANNUITY INSURANCE COMPANY (CONTINUED)

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 0%. Such interest rates are reviewed for reset on a quarterly basis.

In addition, certain events allow the issue to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

NOTE 6. NONPARTICIPANTS-DIRECTED INVESTMENTS

The Plan's participants direct all investments. There are no non-participant directed investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 7. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company. Empower Insurance Company is the custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the company has the right under the plan to discontinue its operations at any time and to terminate the plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the company may determine.

NOTE 9. PLAN AMENDMENT AND TAX STATUS

The Plan was restated on January 1 2022. The Company has obtained an IRS Determination Letter for the restated plan that states the Plan and its related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 10. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
