1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the Williams-Keepers LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Plan was established effective July 1, 1991, and most recently restated on January 1, 2022. The Plan sponsor is Williams-Keepers LLC (the Company or the Firm). The Plan covers all employees who are age 18 or older and who have completed three months of eligibility service, as defined. Employee participation in the Plan is voluntary.

Contributions

Employees may contribute up to the amount permitted by Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations, which was \$23,000 in 2024. Employees who meet certain age requirements are also permitted to make catch-up contributions. The Plan also permits Roth contributions, as well as rollover contributions.

The Company may make contributions as outlined by the Plan agreement. During 2024, the Company made a safe harbor nonelective contribution of three percent of compensation, as defined, for certain participants. A discretionary nonelective contribution ranging from three to nine percent of compensation was made for certain eligible participants. In order to be eligible for the non-elective contribution, a participant must have worked at least 1,000 hours during the plan year and must be employed on the last day of the plan year, unless termination is due to death, disability, or retirement. All contributions are subject to maximum amounts as permitted by the Internal Revenue Service (the IRS).

Participant Accounts

All Plan investments are participant directed. Plan participants have the option of having their contributions invested in a variety of pooled separate accounts or an insurance company general

account. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions, (b) Plan earnings or losses (including plan expense reduction amounts), and (c) charged with administrative expenses, if applicable. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Under the provisions of the Plan, participants are immediately 100 percent vested in their contributions. Employer safe harbor nonelective contributions are 100 percent vested. Any discretionary match and nonelective contribution is vested over a two to six year graded vesting schedule.

Benefits

On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. The Plan permits in-service withdrawals under certain conditions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from 1-5 years, or longer for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 2% over the Wall Street Journal prime rate at the time the loan is originated. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Administrative Expenses

Certain costs of administering the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore not reflected in the Plan's financial statements. Other costs such as transaction fees are paid by affected participants with plan assets and are reflected in the financial statements.

Unallocated Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$443 and \$443, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce employer contributions or to pay plan expenses.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in any unvested company contributions in their account.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are accounted for on a trade-date basis. All dividends or interest from the underlying mutual funds held within the pooled separate accounts are reinvested in additional shares of the underlying mutual funds. Accordingly, the unit value is adjusted daily to reflect these transactions. Net investment income reported in the financial statements includes the effects of dividends received, interest earned, and net appreciation on the Plan's pooled separate accounts bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid to participants.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are carried at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expense and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowances for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

3. Investment Information Certified by Insurance Company

All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and participant notes receivable at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest on participant notes receivable for the year ended December 31, 2024 were obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator, and certified as complete and accurate, by the insurance company, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (John Hancock).

4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows accounting standards which establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under accounting standards are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Pooled separate accounts invest directly in the underlying mutual funds (as indicated by the name of the pooled separate accounts which mirror the names of the underlying mutual funds). The pooled separate accounts with underlying mutual fund investments are valued based on the observable net asset value (NAV) of the underlying investment which are listed on national securities exchanges and have a readily determinable fair value.

5. Group Annuity Contract

The Plan maintains a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with John Hancock totaling \$4,477 for 2024 and \$4,086 for 2023. John Hancock maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate in 2024 ranged from 0.75 to 3.45 percent. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate

permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by John Hancock, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

6. Administration of Plan Assets

The Plan's assets are held by the insurance company of the Plan. Employee contributions are held and managed by the insurance company, which invests cash received, interest, and dividend income and makes distributions to participants.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

As noted in Notes 1 and 6, the Plan has a number of service providers. Such parties are a party-in-interest under ERISA.

8. Income Tax Status

On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service informed the Company by letter that the Plan is designed in accordance with and qualifies under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(a). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position more likely than not, would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated all subsequent events through May 13, 2025, which represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
