### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the Cold Heading Group 401(k) Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (the 2024 financial statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the 2024 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying 2024 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying 2024 financial statements related to assets held by and certified by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## Basis for Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements section of our report. ## Emphasis of Matter – Asset Transfer

As further discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Plan transferred the plan investments representing participant balances from certain related entities to a new separate plan in January 2024. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

## Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the 2024 financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the 2024 financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Cold Heading Group 401(k) Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the 2024 financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the 2024 financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

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### Note 1 – Description of the Plan

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was established on February 1, 1995 by The Cold Heading Co. and includes related entities Ajax Metal Processing, Inc. and Wolverine Carbide and Tool, Inc. (collectively the “Company”).

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The following description of the Cold Heading Group 401(k) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan changed its name from The Stevens Family 401(k) Retirement Plan to the Cold Heading Group 401(k) Retirement Plan.

On January 2, 2024, the Plan transferred the plan investments representing participant balances of Circa Hospitality Group, LLC, Circa Hospitality Group I, LLC, Circa Hospitality Group II, LLC, Circa Hospitality Group III, LLC, Downtown Las Vegas Events Center, LLC, Desert Rock Enterprises, LLC, 18 Fremont Street Acquisitions, LLC, Circa Sports, LLC, and Circa Sports Illinois, LLC. The assets transferred totaled approximately \$27,312,000 and were received and invested by the Circa Hospitality Group 401(k) Retirement Plan on the same date. The Circa Hospitality Group 401(k) Retirement Plan was established with an effective date of January 2, 2024.

#### Administration

The Plan Sponsor and named Plan Administrator is the Cold Heading Co. The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator has formed an Investment Committee made up of the Company officers, members of management, and a third investment advisory company. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance and fees. The Plan’s Trustee and Investment Custodian is T. Rowe Price Trust Company. The Investment Custodian holds all of the Plan’s assets and executes all of the Plan’s transactions. The Company has retained T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc. to provide participant recordkeeping and administration services.

#### Eligibility

The Plan covers all non-union employees who have completed 90 days of service and have attained age 18. An employee becomes a participant in the Plan effective on the first day of the payroll period following the date which the employee satisfies the eligibility requirements specified in the plan document. All persons employed on or before October 20, 2011 are eligible to participate in the Plan regardless of years of service or age.

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Contributions to the Plan

Each year participants may contribute up to 100% of eligible compensation, as defined in the plan document, provided that the amount does not exceed the various deferral limits set forth in the Internal Revenue Code through payroll withholdings. The plan document also allows participants to make Roth elective deferral contributions to the Plan. These deferrals are included in the participant's gross income at the time of deferral and are irrevocably designated and accounted for as Roth elective deferrals.

Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make additional 'catch-up' contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers).

The Plan includes an automatic elective deferral feature whereby all new employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at 6% deferred contribution, upon meeting the eligibility requirements, unless electing otherwise. In addition, the Plan has an automatic escalation clause for participants automatically enrolled which includes scheduled increases of deferral rates by 1% annually, effective during the first pay period in January of each year, until the deferral rate reaches 15%.

The Company makes matching contributions on behalf of the participants equal to 25% of the participant's deferral, limited to a deferral of up to 6% of the participant's compensation and not to exceed \$5,175. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made matching contributions on behalf of eligible contributions in the amount of \$444,425. The Plan also allows for discretionary employer profit sharing contributions which are allocated prorata based on eligible participant compensation. The Company has elected to not make a profit sharing contribution for 2024.

Participants direct the investment of both their individual contributions plus their share of employer matching and profit sharing contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company's contributions are allocated in the same manner as that of the participant's elective contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and employer matching and profit sharing contributions as well as plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

The income, gains or losses in each fund are allocated daily to the applicable participants' accounts in that fund based on the previously reported account balances, adjusted for current period contributions and withdrawals.

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### Distribution of Benefits

The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Employees who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions.

On termination of service, participant account balances of \$7,000 or less will be distributed in a lump sum payment to the participant or rolled over into an individual retirement plan determined by the Company unless the participant affirmatively elects otherwise.

The Plan also allows for in-service distributions upon attainment of age 59 1/2 for any reason, and before age 59 1/2 due to financial hardship, as defined in the plan document.

### Vesting

The balance in each participant's salary deferral and rollover accounts is 100% vested at all times. Employer matching and profit sharing contributions are subject to a graded vesting schedule based on years of service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. Participants also become 100% vested in employer contributions when termination of employment is the result of attaining retirement (age 59 1/2) or in the event of upon death or total disability.

### Forfeitures

Forfeitures attributable to employer contributions shall be used to pay plan expenses and to reduce future employer contributions. No forfeitures were used to reduce the employer matching contributions for the plan year ended December 31, 2024. Forfeitures amounting to \$118,396 were used to pay plan expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024. The balance in the forfeiture account as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$39,729 and \$95,759, respectively.

## **Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Income from investments is recorded when it is earned. Employee contributions are recorded when withheld from pay. Employer contributions are recorded when they are earned. Expenses are recorded in the accounting period in which they are incurred.

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Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Investment Custodian and investment advisers. See Note 4 for a description of the fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is accrued on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Fees and Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses, including salaries, accounting, and legal are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements.

Fees related to the administration of benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's accounts and are included in administration expenses. Direct fees for custodian and recordkeeping services are paid by the Plan and are also included in administration expenses. Total administrative fees are shown net of forfeitures used. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has permitted participants to convert matching contributions received after December 31, 2024, to Roth matching contributions. This is an optional feature under SECURE Act 2.0.

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including May 28, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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### Note 3 – Unaudited Investment Information Certified by the Custodian

Plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the following information has been certified by T. Rowe Price Trust Company as to its completeness and accuracy and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditors:

1. All investment balances reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024;
2. All investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
3. All investment-related information included in the Supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

### Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified contractual term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds:* Valued at daily closing prices as reported by the Fund. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified as a Level 1 investment.

*Common/Collective Trust Funds:* The common/collective trust funds invest in various collective trust funds. The fair value of the common/collective trusts are not publicly quoted pricing inputs. Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units held of the common/collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying investments within the fund less liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

*Stable Value Fund:* The Stable Value Fund is not publicly traded and represents a stable value collective investment for which NAV is considered fair value as a practical expedient.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of the net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**Note 5 – Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain plan investments are managed by T. Rowe Price Trust Company, who is the Plan’s Trustee. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid direct compensation to the Trustee for services rendered. Indirect compensation (that is netted against investment income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits) is paid to the Trustee from total annual operating expenses charged on the balance of fund investments, depending on the particular fund. Transactions involving these investments are considered party-in-interest transactions; however, these transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

**Note 6 – Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

**Note 7 – Plan Restatement and Tax Status**

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan sponsored by T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc., which has been filed with the IRS and has received a favorable opinion letter dated August 19, 2020 from the IRS. The Plan Sponsor has not elected to apply for an individual IRS Determination Letter upon adoption of the Plan nor on any subsequent amendments. However, the Plan Sponsor believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) and that the related Trust is tax-exempt as of December 31, 2024.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

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**Note 8 – Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
