NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the American Academy of Physician Associates 401(k) Savings & Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. All employees of American Academy of Physician Associates (the Company) (the Plan Sponsor) are eligible to participate in the plan after 6 months of service except nonresident aliens with no U.S. income, employee who are residents of Puerto Rico, and certain part-time, temporary, and seasonal employees.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute 100% of their compensation to the Plan not to exceed the maximum allowable IRC 402(g) limit of \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Roth elective deferrals are permitted under the Plan.

The Company has a matching contribution of 100% of participants' elective deferral contributions not over 3% of compensation, plus 50% of participants' elective deferral contributions which are over 3% of compensation but not exceeding 5% of compensation. The company may also contribute a discretionary contribution and a nonelective contribution each plan year. For Plan year 2024, the Company did not elect to do so. The maximum IRC 415 limit for total contributions made on behalf of a participant (deferrals and employer contributions) is \$69,000 for 2024. Catch-up contributions can be made in excess of this limit.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. The plan currently offers various mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and a fully benefit responsive investment contract for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Company matching contributions as well as allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that were paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and matching contributions. Vesting in discretionary contributions are based on a 5-year graded schedule as such:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan must bear a reasonable amount of interest. The interest rate for 2024 was 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution or an annuity. In-service withdrawals allowed for hardships and at age 59 ½.

The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Employees who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$0, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and administrative expenses. In 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$0 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded in the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan Participants and matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investments related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for asset measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish at their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at the price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Account: valued based upon the unit values of such pooled accounts held by the Plan at yearend. The pooled separate accounts are priced daily, and participants transact at that price. Unit values are based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the fund derived from inputs principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means, although are not based upon quoted market prices in an active market. The underlying investments of the pooled separate accounts consist of mutual funds, each of which follows a separate investment strategy. Due to the nature of these pooled accounts, there are no unfunded commitments or redemption restrictions. We believe the net assets value has a readily determinable fair value in a manner that is similar to that of a mutual fund; hence are level 1 assets.

NOTE 6. PRINCIPAL FIXED INCOME GUARANTEE OPTION

The Plan invests in the Principal Fixed Income Guarantee Option (the “Contract”), a benefit - responsive group annuity contract issued by Principal Trust Company. totaling \$420,469 at December 31, 2024 and \$446,493 at December 31, 2023. The Contract is not a portfolio of contracts whose yields are based on changes in the fair value of underlying assets but is rather a single group annuity contract with a fixed rate of interest. As a result, the average yield earned by the Plan is the yield earned, or the interest credited, on the group annuity contract. The underlying assets consist primarily of treasuries, commercial real estate mortgages, mortgage - backed securities and short - term cash equivalents.

The Plan’s investment options include the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option (FIGO) which is a guaranteed general account-backed group annuity contract issued by Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal) to Principal Trust Company as custodian. The FIGO has a contractually guaranteed rate of interest which is credited to participants’ accounts. The FIGO is considered a fully benefit-responsive investment and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. Interest crediting rate is reset quarterly.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Principal Life Insurance Company. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another Plan), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination. The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The GIC does not permit Principal Life Insurance Company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity dates without additional termination charges.

NOTE 7. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Principal Trust Company. Principal Trust Company is the trustee for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. The Plan also made direct payments to third party administrators of \$81,200. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the plan's operations. The Plan Trustee receives fees from administration and investment management.

NOTE 8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the rights under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 9. TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by letter June 30, 2020 in which the Internal Service stated that the Plan, is designed, in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 10. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
