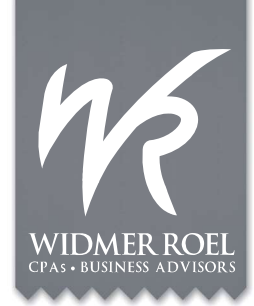

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the **R & R Transportation, Inc. 401(k) Plan and Trust's** internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about **R & R Transportation, Inc. 401(k) Plan and Trust's** ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter — Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of the year ended August 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the R & R Transportation, Inc. 401(k) Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Basic Plan Document (“Plan Document”) and the Adoption Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of R&R Transportation, Inc. (the “Company”). Participants who are 19 are eligible for elective deferrals upon hire and are auto enrolled at three percent. Participants are eligible for discretionary matching contributions when they have completed one year of service with a minimum of 1,000 hours and are age 19 or over. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Participants may contribute any percentage of their income up to the maximum allowed under federal regulations for the plan year. Participants who reach the age of 50 during the calendar year and are making the maximum IRS contribution may make additional catch-up contributions in accordance with the provisions of IRS Code Section 414(v). Participant contributions may be made on a pre-tax or after-tax (Roth) basis. The Company matches the lesser of 3.0% of gross compensation or 50% of elective deferrals. The Company may elect to make a discretionary non-elective profit-sharing contribution that is determined on an annual basis for all eligible participants. For the year ended August 31, 2024, the Company did not make a discretionary non-elective contribution. Participants may make rollover contributions into the Plan from another qualified plan.

Participant Accounts

Each eligible participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution, the Company’s matching contribution, Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in all employee contributions and actual earnings thereon. Employer contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions are subject to a six-year vesting schedule as follows:

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct contributions in any of the investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their funds up to a maximum not to exceed the lesser of (a) \$50,000 or (b) one-half of the fair market value of a participant's vested account balance. The minimum loan amount that may be borrowed is \$1,000. Only two outstanding loans are permitted at any given time.

The term of such loan must not be less than one year nor greater than five years, except in the case of a loan for the purpose of acquiring a primary residence. The term of such loan shall be determined by the employer considering the maturity dates quoted by the representative commercial banks in the local area for a similar loan.

All loans will bear a commercially reasonable rate of interest which the Company has determined to be the prime rate as determined by the Plan Administrator plus 1.0%. Interest rates range from 4.25% to 9.5%. The loan agreement shall also provide that the payment of principal and interest be amortized in level payments not less than quarterly. The loans are secured by 50% of participant's vested account balance.

Payment of Benefits

In the event a participant terminates employment due to separation of service, retirement, disability, or death, if the vested account balance exceeds \$5,000 a Participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. The participant may also elect to rollover the distribution to an Individual Retirement Account ("IRA") or to another qualified account. If no election is made, the account balance will remain in the participant's account within the Plan. If upon termination of employment due to separation of service, retirement, disability or death, the vested account balance is less than \$5,000, the participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum distribution of the entire vested account balance or rollover the account into an IRA or to another qualified account. If no election is made and the balance is less than \$5,000 but greater than \$1,000, the funds will be rolled over into an IRA in the participant's name with a provider selected by the Plan Administrator. If no election is made upon termination of service and the participant's account balance is less than \$1,000, the vested account balance will be distributed to the participant. In-service distributions are available upon a participant reaching the age of 59 ½.

Participants may take hardship withdrawals to satisfy an immediate and heavy financial need and subject to certain limitations as defined in the Plan.

Upon attainment of 65 years, participants may withdraw all or any portion of their vested account balances. For participants whose age exceeds 73 years the Internal Revenue Service required minimum distribution rules may apply.

Administrative Fees

The Plan custodian and record-keeper assesses a per-transaction fee for certain types of distributions. These fees were deducted from the individual participant's account balance and recorded as plan administration expense. The Plan custodian also assesses a fee for the administration of the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeiture occurs when a participant terminates employment and all or part of the employer matching contributions are not vested. The nonvested portion is forfeited immediately if the participant either has no vested interest upon termination of employment or receives a distribution of the entire vested interest when the participant terminates employment. If none of these circumstances exist, nonvested balances are forfeited upon the completion of five consecutive years in which the participant works fewer than twelve months.

Forfeitures may be used to reduce matching contributions or pay plan expenses. Forfeitures of \$73 were used in 2024 to reduce matching contributions or pay plan expenses. At August 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$40,940 and \$14,973 of forfeitures, respectively, available to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses in future years, as provided by the Plan.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded based on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation and depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The classification of investment earnings reported in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Payment of Benefits

Payments for benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date of the auditor's report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, no independent auditing procedures were performed with respect to the information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Plan custodian.

The Plan custodian has certified its statements of accounts as of August 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended August 31, 2024. The statements of accounts includes beginning and ending balances of investments held and a detail of all transactions during the period, including interest income on investment earnings.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy in accordance with ASC 820 *Fair Value Measurements* are described below.

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical instruments in active markets;

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar instruments in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar instruments in markets that are not active and model-derived valuations whose significant inputs are observable; and

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Fund – Valued at NAV of units of an insurance company common trust fund. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. However, participant withdrawals may be subject to a delay of up to 7 or 30 additional calendar days if it is determined, respectively, that such delay is necessary to maintain adequate liquidity for, or to avoid an adverse impact on, the underlying trust or investment vehicle. In addition, the fund's declaration of trust provides that withdrawals for purposes other than normal benefit payments or plan permitted investment option transfers are subject to either a market value adjustment or without a market value adjustment and effected no later than 12 months. These events may include, but are not limited to, the following: mergers, layoffs, plan termination, implementation of early retirement incentive programs, additional investment options are established that constitute a competing fund, or other events within the control of the Plan Sponsor resulting in a material and adverse financial impact on the issuer's obligations under the contract.

NOTE 5 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the termination of the Plan, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 6 – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the third-party administrator by an opinion letter dated April 2, 2012, that the prototype plan as adopted was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and determine if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan administration has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of August 31, 2024 there are no uncertain positions taken.

NOTE 7 – TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan, for which no fees are charged.

Certain plan investments are in shares of investment funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the custodians, as defined by the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest.

Fees incurred by the Plan to the custodian, record keeper, and third-party administrator qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are considered exempt under EIRSA.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' individual account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

As of August 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had an investments of \$2,596,135 and \$2,581,649, respectively, that were concentrated in two funds.
