Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of the Universal Athletic Services, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Universal Athletic Services, Inc. (the "Company") who have six months of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in salary deferral contributions and discretionary match contributions after six months of work and having attained the age of 21. The Plan's trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a specific percentage or dollar amount of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may elect to contribute a matching contribution equal to a specified percentage of the amount of the salary reduction participants have elected to defer. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made matching contributions of 35% of the participant's salary deferral on the first 8% of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The specified percentage is established by the Company at the beginning of the Plan year and will remain in effect for each Plan year thereafter unless adjusted by the Company. As of August 1, 2018, participants will be auto enrolled at a 5% deferral percentage and increase 1% each year with a 10% deferral maximum.

Participants may elect to make a Roth 401(k) deferral. These deferrals are subject to federal income taxes in the year of deferral. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other Roth Elective Deferral amounts only to a participant's current Roth Elective Deferral account.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company discretionary matching contributions, and allocations of (a) plan earnings (losses) and (b) forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching contribution portion of participant's accounts, plus actual earnings thereon is based on the number of years of service.

Plan contributions vest according to the following schedule:

Participants are considered to have completed one year of service for purpose of vesting upon the completion of 1,000 hours of service at any time during 12 consecutive months.

Participants will always be 100% vested upon normal retirement age if still employed with the Company. Normal retirement age is defined as the date the participant has attained age 62. Early retirement is defined as the date on which the participant has attained age 55 and completed 5 years of service. Participants will also be 100% vested if they die or become disabled while still employed with the Company.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. Loan terms may not exceed five years unless for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans must be adequately secured. Generally, a participant must use no more than 50% of their vested interest in the Plan as security but the Plan administrator may request additional collateral. The interest rate must be reasonable and must be one that other lenders would charge for making a loan in a similar circumstance. Interest rates currently range from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are to be paid ratably through payroll deductions at least quarterly.

Notes Receivable From Participants (Continued)

If a participant fails to make payments under the terms of their loan they are considered to be in default. The Plan administrator will consider a participant's loan to be in default if any scheduled loan repayment is not made by the end of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the missed payment was due. When the Plan administrator deems the participant's loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

All distributions from the Plan will be made in a single lump-sum payment of cash or partial withdrawals. If an employee's vested benefit in the Plan exceeds \$5,000 the employee must consent to the distribution before it will be made. A distribution is required to be made if the vested benefit under the Plan (excluding amounts attributable to rollovers) does not exceed \$5,000. Minimum distribution rules must be followed. A participant may also elect to rollover all or a portion of their distribution to an Individual Retirement Account or another qualified plan. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,702 and \$7,909, respectively. When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the non-vested portion of the participant's account, as defined by the Plan, represents forfeiture. The Company has the discretion how to treat forfeitures under the Plan. Forfeitures can be used to pay Plan expenses or can be allocated or divided among eligible participants. Forfeitures may not be allocated to any Roth Elective Deferral accounts. Forfeitures used to reduce Company contributions or used to reduce plan fees was \$12,588 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant notes receivable are recorded as benefit payments on the basis of the terms of the plan document.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of Estimates in Preparation of Financial Statements

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value except for a fully benefit-responsive contract (FBRIC). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The FBRIC is reported at contract value, which is the amount participants would normally receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 4 and Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements and the FBRIC.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments held as well as sold during the year.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are allocated proportionately to plan participants based on their respective account balances and are included in net investment income.

Note 3: Information Prepared and Certified by Custodians

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest on notes receivable from participants, and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the Custodians of the Plan.

Note 4: Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan can access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable value collective trust funds: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities' liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business matter.

Note 5: Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract (FBRIC)

The Plan maintains a fully benefit responsive investment in a guaranteed interest contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower). Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administration expenses. The contract issuer must repay the principal and a specified interest rate is guaranteed to the Plan.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Empower Trust Company, LLC including plan termination and other events as specified in the FBRIC. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants or the issuer are probable of occurring. The FBRIC does not permit Great-West to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The average yield earned by the Plan and the average interest rate credited to participants for the year ended December 31, 2024 was 1.66%.

Note 6: Concentrations, Risks, and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, four investments represented 52% of total plan net assets.

Note 7: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

Note 8: Tax Status

The Company adopted a volume submitter plan document with an IRS notification letter which states the volume submitter plan document is in compliance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for any closed statutory years.

Certain recordkeeper activities are handled by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America is a Custodian, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred and paid by the Plan for the recordkeeper services were \$10,755 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Certain plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC. Empower Trust Company, LLC is a Custodian, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred and paid by the Plan for the investment management services were \$863 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Certain other plan activities are handled by LeafHouse Financial Advisors, LLC. LeafHouse Financial Advisors, LLC is a related party, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred and paid by the Plan for other services were \$7,012 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Certain administrative services are managed by United Pension Administration. United Pension Administration is a related party, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred and paid by the Plan for the administrative services were \$11,987 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Certain administrative services are managed by LPL Financial. LPL Financial is a related party, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred and paid by the Plan for the administrative services were \$27,752 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

There are two trustees who are Plan participants. The trustees make contributions and receive benefits in the same manner as all other participants of the Plan. There are 4 participants who own more than 5% of the Company, which includes one of the Trustees.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
