Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed audit of the financial statements of the Texas Chiropractic College DC Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of August 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (2024 Financial Statements).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of August 31, 2024, and for the year then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note E to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with US GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with US GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the ability of the Plan to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of US GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with US GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters – 2024 Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental information in the accompanying Schedule H, Line 4(i) – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of August 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of Management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with US GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.



- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by the qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that Management determined meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Auditor's Report on the 2023 Financial Statements

Predecessor auditors performed an audit of the 2023 financial statements of the Plan. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated June 17, 2024, indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with US GAAP, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that Management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedule, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that Management determines meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Texas Chiropractic College DC Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Plan Sponsor and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 as amended ("ERISA").

Eligibility and Participation Requirements

Generally, employees of the Texas Chiropractic College (Plan Sponsor or Sponsor) are ineligible to participate in the Plan for purposes of matching contributions until completing 12 months of service at which time they become automatically enrolled and are required, as a condition of employment, to withhold a minimum of 2% from eligible compensation for contributing to the Plan. However, employees that come from an institution of higher education are credited for months worked at a predecessor employer and may enter the plan immediately if they have worked for 12 consecutive months at their predecessor. Employees under the age of 21 are excluded from the mandatory participation requirement.

Entry Date

In general, employees must enter the Plan immediately upon meeting the eligibility requirements set forth above.

Contributions

Upon meeting eligibility requirements, participants must contribute a minimum of 2% to the Plan and can contribute up to the maximum percent allowed by the Internal Revenue Code, as defined in the Plan. Eligible compensation defined by the Plan includes all W-2 wages excluding bonus compensation.

Catch up contributions are also permitted under the Plan for participants who attain the age of 50 during the plan year. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Under the plan provisions, the Sponsor can make discretionary matching contributions at 100% of the participant's first 6% of elective deferrals. During the year ended August 31, 2024, the Sponsor made matching contributions of \$184,428.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Sponsor's contribution and Plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in employee elective deferrals and Plan Sponsor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct the investment of their contributions and the Sponsor's matching contributions into any of the investment options offered by the Plan.

Plan Loans

Participants may borrow collateralized loans from Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association and College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA-CREF), using a portion of their plan account as collateral, in an amount up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 45% of their vested account balance. The loans bear interest at the Moody's Corporate Bond Index rate. Principal and interest are paid ratably by the participant directly to TIAA-CREF. The plan administrator has concluded that these loans are not plan assets and that such arrangements are exempt transactions. Effective January 1, 2022, TIAA no longer issues collateralized loans.

Plan loan balances as of August 31, 2024 and 2023, are \$13,016 and \$16,576, respectively. Under the borrowing terms, Plan assets of the same amount serve as collateral to the loans. Interest paid by participants on such loans during the plan year ended August 31, 2024, was approximately \$496. In the event of default, such loans are reportable to plan participants as taxable income but remain outstanding and continue to accrue interest until repaid by the plan participant or the participant becomes eligible to receive a distribution under the terms of the plan. During the year ended August 31, 2024, no loans went into default. As of August 31, 2024 and 2023, loans in default, including principal and accrued interest, were \$9,732 and \$9,236, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their plan accounts for any purpose a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' account and bear interest rates at the Federal Reserve Prime Rate plus 1% or otherwise determined to be reasonable by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably by the participant through payroll deduction. No new loans will be issued to a participant unless any outstanding loan, including any deemed distributed loan, has been paid off.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions under the Plan are made upon a participant's death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment. Benefit payments are made in the form of a lump sum cash amount or in-kind distribution. As of August 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no benefit claims that had been processed and approved for payment.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except for the stable value fund which is stated at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. See Note 8 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represents participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of August 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that may affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Plan expenses are paid by the Sponsor. Certain expenses are borne by the participants based on their investment selections and use of certain features of the Plan.

Recently Accounting Pronouncements

Recent accounting pronouncements issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) did not or are not believed by management to have a material impact on the Plan's present or future financial statements.

NOTE 3: RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The investments offered by the Plan are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with these investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE 4: INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

TIAA Traditional Annuity Contract (TIAA Traditional) is an unallocated fixed-annuity contract that is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by TIAA and is reported at fair value. TIAA Traditional provides a guarantee of principal, a guaranteed minimum rate of interest (generally 3%, but in some recent contracts between 1% and 3%) and the potential for additional interest if declared by TIAA. Additional interest, when declared, remains in effect for the "declared year", which begins each March 1. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future years. Contributions to a participant's account purchases a guaranteed amount of lifetime annuity income. When a participant's account in TIAA Traditional is annuitized based on variable options, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the account balance. The subsequent stream of annuity payments occurs outside of the Plan and does not represent an obligation of the Plan.

NOTE 5: INFORMATION CERTIFIED OR PROVIDED BY CUSTODIANS

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, information related to investments and notes receivable from participants as of August 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended August 31, 2024 was certified to be complete and accurate by TIAA-CREF and American United Life Insurance Company (AUL), a OneAmerica company (collectively referred to as the "Custodians").

NOTE 6: TAX STATUS

The Plan was initially adopted September 1, 1993, and was amended effective January 1, 2009, to qualify under section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the sample language provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in Revenue Procedure 2007-71. Although the Plan has not received a determination letter from the IRS, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirement of ERISA and in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status for the Plan participants under the applicable section as of August 31, 2024.

The plan administrator has evaluated the Plan's tax positions as of August 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended August 31, 2024, as required by US GAAP and has concluded that the Plan had taken no uncertain tax positions that required adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7: PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and pooled separate account fund managed by one of the Custodians; therefore, these investments represent exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA; however, they are considered exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA Section 408(b)(8) and the applicable DOL regulations.

Additionally, participant loans and the Plan's investment in the AUL Stable Value Fund, which is managed by one of the Custodians, also represent party-in-interest transactions. All such transactions were conducted in the ordinary course of operations and at terms that were reasonable and commensurate with those available to unrelated parties.

NOTE 8: PLAN TERMINATION

Although the Sponsor has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan, subject to provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would remain 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 9: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to valuation methodology include,

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at August 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing services, except those held by the TIAA-CREF Money Market Fund, whose holdings are valued at amortized cost. Each fund determines its share price or net asset value (NAV) each day. The TIAA-CREF money market fund is managed to maintain a constant value, though not guaranteed, of \$1 per share.

TIAA Real Estate Pooled Separate Account: Valued based on the daily Net Asset Value (“NAV”) per unit of the funds which is determined using quoted market prices of the underlying real estate holdings or other real estate-related investments. Real estate holdings are valued using external appraisals, which are estimates of property values based on a professional’s opinion. The real estate account sometimes holds securities as well. These are generally priced daily using values obtained from independent pricing sources.

TIAA Traditional Group Annuity Contract: The contract is an illiquid non-benefit responsive fixed-rate guaranteed annuity valued using a discounted cash flow value calculated using an appropriate risk-adjusted market discount rate which correlates closely with the annuity’s historical crediting rates.
