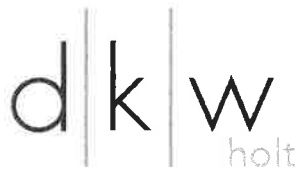

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Transportation and Logistics 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

Effective January 1, 2003, Martin Transportation Systems, Inc. (the ‘Company’) established the *Martin Transportation Systems, Inc. 401(k) Plan* as a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company. The *Martin Transportation Systems, Inc. 401(k) Plan* was restated January 1, 2019 as the *Transportation and Logistics 401(k) Plan* (the ‘Plan’).

The Plan allows other employers to adopt provisions of the Plan. Other employers that have adopted the Plan’s provisions are as follows:

Retirement plan assets were transferred to the Plan from the *Martin Transportation Systems, Inc. 401(k) Plan* and the *Jet Express, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan* on January 1, 2019. Effective February 1, 2019, the assets of the *Bay Logistics, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust* were transferred to the Plan. Effective October 10, 2024, certain assets of the *Toyota Tsusho America, Inc. 401(k) Plan* were transferred to the Plan (specifically, assets of the Battle Creek, Michigan location).

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and benefits are available to substantially all eligible non-union employees.

The Plan has been amended from time to time to comply with current legislation and management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Eligibility

Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following completion of 6 months of service (as described by the Plan) and the attainment of age 18. Participants who are union employees, become eligible to receive discretionary profit-sharing contributions after 6 months of employment with at least 1,000 hours of service and attainment of age 18 (if employed on the last day of the Plan year).

Contributions

Participants may make voluntary contributions to the Plan of up to 100% of their annual eligible compensation, but not in excess of the maximum amount permitted by the Internal Revenue Code. The Company made an employer-matching contribution of 25% of employee deferrals up to 20% of eligible compensation (calculated on a weekly basis). The Company may also elect to make a special discretionary employer contribution for non-highly compensated employees, determined each year by management.

Participants may also elect to contribute after tax dollars into their plan accounts.

Participant accounts

Upon enrollment in the Plan, or at any time subsequent, a participant may direct contributions into any of the available investment options. Each participant's account is credited with contributions in an amount equal to the salary reduction elected by that employee, the related matching contribution and, if applicable, a portion of the special discretionary contribution for non-highly compensated employees equal to a percentage of each eligible individual's compensation. Earnings and administrative expenses are allocated based on the participant's account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Each participant's account is credited with voluntary contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings based on the participant's account balance. Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral, employer matching contributions, and actual earnings.

Special discretionary contributions vest based on years of continuous service. Specifically, special discretionary contributions vest according to the following schedule:

3	40%

5	80%
6	100%

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of non-vested special discretionary contributions from terminated participant accounts are used to offset future Company matching contributions, future Company special discretionary contributions, or to pay expenses of Plan administration, as determined by Plan management.

Benefit Payments

Generally, benefits are paid to participants at termination. When the service period ends as a result of death or retirement, the participant or beneficiary will receive a lump sum distribution equal to the value of their accounts. Participants may elect to defer receipt of benefits. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had obligations to terminated employees totaling \$4,577,205 and \$4,965,400, respectively.

Investment Options

All investments are participant directed among various *Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company* investment options.

Notes from participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Repayment of note principal and interest are made through regular payroll deductions for a period of up to 60 months (180 months to purchase a principal residence). If a participant's employment terminates for any reason and the note balances are not paid in full within 90 days of termination, the note balances will be deemed distributed and become taxable income to the participant. Participants may continue to make note repayments after termination of employment under procedures established by the Plan administrator.

Administrative Expenses

Unless elected to be paid by the Company, administrative expenses incurred in connection with the Plan shall be paid from forfeitures, except for expenses related to distributions and other participant-initiated transactions, which are charged to the account of the participant.

Certain plan administrative fees are absorbed by the Company and certain administrative fees are paid by the Plan. Administrative fees paid by the Plan totaled \$12,576 and \$13,943 during 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

All Plan investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 are held by the Plan custodian, *Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company*, and are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 7 for further discussion and disclosure related to fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Realized and unrealized gains and losses on the Plan's investments are included in net appreciation in the fair value of investments in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, the plan custodian shall hold the funds for distribution and distribute to the participants the full amount standing to their credit on the date of such termination, less the administrative cost to the custodian for such distribution, in accordance with the Plan provisions.

NOTE 4 – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is therefore not subject to tax under present income tax law. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

NOTE 4 – TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)

The Plan has adopted the provisions of ASC Topic 740, *Income Taxes*, relating to uncertain tax positions. ASC Topic 740 provides a consistent framework to determine the appropriate level of tax reserves to maintain for uncertain tax positions. Specifically, the Plan must recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that *more likely than not* would not be sustained upon examination by applicable taxing authorities.

The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition or additional disclosure in the financial statements.

NOTE 5 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Company provides certain accounting, recordkeeping, and administrative services for the Plan for which no compensation is received. Administrative expenses for legal, accounting and other services are rendered by parties-in-interest and are paid by the Company.

Certain plan assets are in investment funds managed by *Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company*. *Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company* acts as trustee and / or Plan custodian; therefore, transactions with *Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company* qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 – INVESTMENTS - UNAUDITED

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Transportation and Logistics 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, acts as trustee and / or Plan custodian, and has certified the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the 2024 schedule of assets held at end of year, and the related investment activity reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 7 – FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

FASB ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). ASC Topic 820 requires fair value measurements to be separately disclosed by level within the fair value hierarchy. The three levels of fair value hierarchy under ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for *identical* assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted market prices for *similar* assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Valuation is generated from model-based techniques that use at least one significant assumption not observable in the market. These unobservable assumptions reflect the estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability.

The following valuation methodologies were used to measure the fair value of the Plan's investments:

Common collective trusts (CCT's) consist of collective investment trust funds that aim to provide consistent income and protect principal, with minimal volatility. CCT's are valued at their *net asset value* (NAV) – a practical way of estimating their fair value. CCT holdings are included as Level 1 assets in the fair value hierarchy.

Registered investment companies consist of mutual fund holdings and are valued at quoted market prices in an exchange and active market. Registered investment company holdings are included as Level 1 assets in the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Further, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 8 – EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE TO PARTICIPANTS

The Plan is subject to certain non-discrimination rules under ERISA and the Code. For the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan failed certain non-discrimination tests under the Code due to lower contribution percentages by non-highly compensated eligible employees relative to the contribution percentages of highly compensated eligible employees. In order to meet the requirements of the non-discrimination rules, the Plan refunded a portion of the contributions made by highly compensated participants, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Code. The refunds attributable to 2024 and 2023 totaled \$9,063 and \$3,232, respectively.

NOTE 9 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In accordance with ASC Topic 855, *Subsequent Events*, the Plan’s management has evaluated subsequent events through May 14, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.
