## Notes to Financial Statements

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### Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Calbag Metals Company Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Calbag Metals Co., Transformer Technologies, LLC, Calbag Resources, LLC, Calbag Steel, LLC, TCI of Alabama, LLC, Calbag Tacoma, LLC, and Trans Cycle Industries of Ohio, LLC (collectively, the Company), who have completed one month of service and are age 18 or older. The Plan excludes non-resident aliens and leased employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the ERISA, as amended.

#### Contributions

Each year, participants may elect to contribute up to 60% of annual compensation, not to exceed the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) which was \$23,000 in 2024, as defined by the Plan. Contributions include employee pre-tax salary deferral contributions, after-tax Roth deferral contributions, or a combination of both. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions of \$7,500 in 2024. The amount deferred will not be subject to income tax until it is actually distributed to the participant. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

The Plan has automatic enrollment for all newly eligible participants. Unless elected otherwise, the Plan Sponsor will automatically withhold 3% of an employee's eligible compensation to the Plan. The initial automatic deferral amount will also increase by 1% each 12 month period up to a maximum automatic deferral amount of 10% of an employee's eligible compensation.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various registered investment companies and common collective trusts as investment options for participants. After completing one year of service, participants become eligible for Company matching contributions. The Company contributes a discretionary match of 50% of the first 15% of compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of Calbag Metals Co.'s board of directors. There were no profit sharing contributions for 2024. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, and allocations of (a) the Company's discretionary matching contribution and discretionary profit sharing contributions, (b) Plan expenses, and (c) Plan earnings (losses). Allocations are based on participant wages or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching contribution and profit sharing contribution portions of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes partially vested at the end of two years of credited service, with the vested amount increasing gradually until the participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. Participants shall become 100% vested upon attainment of normal retirement age (55 years), death, or permanent disablement.

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#### **Note 1 - Description of Plan, continued**

##### Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments as specified by the Plan. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

##### Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024, there were no forfeited nonvested accounts remaining (\$3,904 at December 31, 2023). These accounts may be used to first pay any administrative expenses. Any remaining forfeitures will be used to reduce future employer contributions, as defined in the Plan. During 2024, \$24,380 in forfeitures were utilized to pay administrative expenses.

#### **Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies**

##### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

##### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

##### Corrective Distributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding deduction from net assets.

##### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Trustee and investment advisers. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Distribution fees related to third party administration are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

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#### **Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies, continued**

##### Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

##### Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through June 23, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

#### **Note 3 - Information Certified by the Trustee**

The Plan's investments are held by Principal Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan. Investment decisions are made at the direction of the participants. The investments are credited for earnings thereon and charged for withdrawals and expenses charged by the Trustee. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Trustee as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, that the following information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Trustee is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends

#### **Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements**

Fair value is the price that would be received from selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. When determining the fair value measurements for assets and liabilities required to be recorded at fair value, the Plan considers the principal or most advantageous market in which it would transact and considers assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, such as inherent risk, transfer restrictions, and risk of nonperformance.

The Plan follows a fair value hierarchy to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Three levels of inputs may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 - quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

#### Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements, continued

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

*Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds):* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common Collective Trusts (CCT):* CCT's invest in a variety of guaranteed investment contracts, domestic stocks, international stocks, mutual funds, bonds and other securities. The majority of the underlying securities have observable level 1 quoted pricing inputs. While the underlying asset values are generally based on publicly quoted prices, the net asset value (NAV) of each individual CCT is not valued using publicly quoted prices.

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#### **Note 5 - Stable Value Fund**

The Plan has an investment in the Principal Stable Value Z Fund which is a common collective trust (CCT) fund that invests in conventional, synthetic, and separate account investment contracts issued by life insurance companies, banks, and other financial institutions. Characteristics of these contracts allow for their principal value to remain stable regardless of the volatility of the financial markets. The contracts are nontransferable but provide for benefit responsive withdrawals and participant transfers to noncompeting options by Plan participants.

Risks arise when entering into any investment contract due to the potential inability of the issuer to meet the terms of the contract. In addition, security-backed contracts have the risk of default or the lack of liquidity of the underlying portfolio assets. The credit risk of each issuer is evaluated and monitored through credit analysis. The credit analysis includes, but is not limited to, asset quality and liquidity, management quality, surplus adequacy, and profitability.

#### **Note 6 - Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Principal Trust Company is the Third Party Administrator (TPA) of the Plan. Principal Trust Company provides recordkeeping and investment advice. The fees for these services were \$28,600 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Principal Trust Company is also the Trustee, as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

#### **Note 7 - Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their employer contributions and any earnings thereon.

#### **Note 8 - Tax Status**

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan's sponsor by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by Principal Life Insurance Company, is acceptable pursuant to section 401 of the IRC and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not requested its own determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements at December 31, 2024. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
