**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Team Industries, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan originally effective August 1, 1987. The Plan has been amended throughout the years to comply with tax legislation and most recently restated effective April 15, 2022. The Plan excludes nonresident aliens and employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Administrative Committee is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

**Eligibility**

Employees of Team Industries, Inc. (the Company), are eligible to participate in the deferral and match components of the Plan the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month following 90 days of service. Participants are eligible for the Employer match and profit sharing contributions if they meet the eligibility requirements above, work 1000 or more hours within the Plan year, and are employed on the last day of the Plan year.

**Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants may elect to have any portion, or all of their contributions designated as Roth 401(k) contributions. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation, and their contributions invested in the designated default fund until changed by the participant. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company may, at its discretion, make a matching contribution in which it will match 25% of participant deferrals up to 6% of each participating employee's compensation. During 2024 and 2023, the Company contributed \$118,253 and \$103,645 to the Plan, respectively. The Company also has the option to make additional discretionary contributions to the Plan. During 2024 and 2023, the Company made a profit sharing contribution of \$584,729 and \$546,589 to the Plan, respectively. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions, and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants are 100% vested in the Company's contributions after five years of credited services.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms generally range from 1 to 5 years. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the market rate as determined at the time of the loan by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Benefit Payments**

Active participants may elect a lump sum in-service or hardship distribution as eligible according to the Plan document. On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, periodic installments or qualified annuity. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. However, if the value of the vested benefit is less than \$7,000, a lump sum distribution will be made regardless of whether or not an election has been made.

**Forfeited Accounts**

At September 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$396 and \$-0-, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future Company contributions, administrative expenses and/or reinstate previously forfeited account balance of participants. In 2024 and 2023, \$6,916 and \$21,938 were used to reduce Company contributions, respectively.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of September 30, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

**Benefit Payments**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

Administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. Expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are included in administrative expenses. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through June 12, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION**

Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, Principal Life Insurance Company, and Principal Life Insurance Company on behalf of Principal Global Investors Trust Company, the qualified institutions of the Plan, have supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of September 30, 2024. Notes receivable from participants and the related interest income are not covered by the certification.

**NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

*Pooled Separate Accounts:* Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of an insurance company pooled separate account. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the pooled separate account, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the account in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

*Mutual Funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Collective Trust Funds:* Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly manner.

*Deferred Income Annuities:* Valued at aggregation of contributions, plus interest, less withdrawals adjusted to market value based on the current rates of interest available in the marketplace.

**NOTE 5 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY**

The Plan has a group annuity contract with Principal Life Insurance Company. As part of the contract, Principal Life Insurance Company maintains a portion of the contributions in a "guaranteed account." The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses charged by Principal Life Insurance Company. The guaranteed account is included in the financial statements at fair value because it is nonbenefit-responsive. Upon termination of the investment contract, the lump sum liquidation value of the general account portion of the portion of the participant's accumulation value shall be equal to the product of (a) the participant's general account accumulation value on the liquidation date, reduced by the liquidation charge applicable on the liquidation date and (b) a market value adjustment percentage.

**NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their company contributions.

**NOTE 8 TAX STATUS**

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter received from the IRS on the pre-approved plan indicating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is therefore, not subject to tax under current income tax law. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are managed by the qualified institutions of the Plan; therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included under administrative expenses on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
