As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

***Opinion***

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Huntsman Salary Deferral Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### ***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Huntsman Salary Deferral Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the Huntsman Salary Deferral Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Huntsman International LLC (the “Company”), and the following participating employers Huntsman Purchasing Ltd.; Huntsman Petrochemical LLC; Huntsman Ethyleneamines LLC; Huntsman Advanced Materials Americas LLC; Nanocomp Technologies, Inc.; and Huntsman Building Solutions (USA) LLC (collectively, the “Employer”), except those employees covered by certain collective bargaining agreements that do not provide for participation in the Plan, residents of Puerto Rico, leased employees, an employee who is not regularly employed in the United States by the Employer, certain foreign national employees.

Employees, other than seasonal employees, are eligible to participate in the Plan on their date of hire. Seasonal employees, subject to meeting certain regulatory requirements, are able to participate in the Plan after the employee has attained the age of 21 years old and completed at least 1,000 hours of service. The Plan is administered by a committee appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) is the trustee for the Plan.

**Contributions**

Participants may elect to make pre-tax and/or Roth salary deferral contributions to the Plan of 1% up to 25% of eligible compensation, subject to certain limitations provided under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants in a former employer’s qualified plan to contribute direct rollovers. In-Plan Roth rollover contributions and In-Plan Roth conversions, of certain fully vested amounts, are allowed for participants still employed by the Employer.

The Employer shall contribute one dollar for each dollar of participant contributions made by the participant for the plan year, up to a maximum of 4% of eligible compensation for the plan year. For employees whose most recent hire date is before January 1, 2004, or hired on or after July 1, 2014, the Employer will make a nondiscretionary contribution equal to 6% of eligible compensation during the plan year except for certain eligible employees of Huntsman Advanced Materials Americas LLC. Certain groups of Huntsman Advanced Materials LLC are eligible to receive the nondiscretionary contribution equal to 6% of eligible compensation. Eligibility is based on work location. Employees covered by the collective bargaining agreement who were participants in the Huntsman Money Purchase Pension Plan, or hired on or after April 1, 2015, shall participate in the Employer nondiscretionary contributions. Certain participants covered by collective bargaining agreements will receive Employer matching contributions defined in each agreement.

**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)**

The Plan is participant directed and participants may change their contribution rates at the beginning of each payroll period and investment options at any time.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Employer contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants except for union participants that transferred to the Plan from the Huntsman Advanced Materials Americas LLC Investment Savings Plan for Non-Salaried Employees at McIntosh, Alabama are at all times fully vested in their participant and Employer contributions and the appreciation or depreciation thereon. Union participants that transferred to the Plan from the Huntsman Advanced Materials Americas LLC Investment Savings Plan for Non-Salaried Employees at McIntosh, Alabama are at all times fully vested in their participant contributions and vest as follows for former McIntosh Union Match contributions - 20% per year after two years of service through four years of service and are fully vested after five years of service. A participant shall be immediately vested upon death, retirement, termination of employment due to total and permanent disability or termination of the Plan.

The forfeiture balance was not material at December 31, 2024 or 2023. No material forfeitures were used in 2024.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are payable upon retirement, disability, death, or termination of service with the Employer. Normal retirement age under the Plan is 65. Hardship withdrawals and one annual in-service withdrawal for participants who have attained age 59½, subject to certain provisions, are permitted. Participants may receive their distributions in a lump-sum or an installment payment.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Plan participants may borrow Plan assets at a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding note balance during the prior 12 month period, or 50% of their vested account balance in the Plan. Two outstanding notes per participant are permitted. Notes are repaid in level installments through payroll deductions for periods ranging up to five years or up to fifteen years for the purchase of a principal residence. The notes bear interest at reasonable rates as determined by the plan administrator and are secured by the participant's vested account to the extent of the principal amount of the note plus accrued interest.

**Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become fully vested in their accounts and receive benefits based on their account balance accumulated to the date of the termination of the Plan.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Contributions**

Contributions from participants and the Employer matching contributions are recorded in the plan year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation. The Employer nondiscretionary contributions are recorded in the plan year in which participant compensation is paid.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value, which is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

**Benefit Payments**

Benefit payments are recorded upon distribution.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to notes receivable from participants, withdrawals, and certain investment transaction fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Other investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Federal Income Taxes**

The Plan has adopted a volume submitter prototype plan, which obtained its latest opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan to determine if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 3 - COLLECTIVE INVESTMENT TRUSTS**

The Plan invests in various collective investment trust funds. The funds held by the Plan provide for daily redemption by participants with no advance notice requirement. The Plan has no unfunded commitments and no contractual obligations to further invest in the funds. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of a fund, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust fund to ensure that securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Various inputs are used in determining the fair value of the Plan's investments. Valuation techniques used to measure fair value must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy, including the types of investments that fall under each category and the valuation methodologies used to measure fair value, are described below:

*Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

*Mutual Funds*: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Participant-Directed Brokerage Account*: Includes investments valued at fair value using a market approach based on quotations from national securities exchanges.

*Level 2* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted market prices in active markets that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices that are in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

*Level 3* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs (i.e., projections, estimates, interpretations, etc.) that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

Investments measured using the NAV practical expedient are described below:

*Collective Investment Trust Funds*: Valued at NAV based on the contractual terms of the underlying unit value reported by the investment advisor based on the fair value of the underlying investments less liabilities. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The inputs and methodologies used for valuing securities are not an indication of the risk associated with investing in those securities. There have been no changes in the methodologies used for valuing securities at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

**NOTE 5 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**NOTE 6 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are in mutual funds and investments in a participant-directed brokerage account managed by entities related to Fidelity. Fidelity is the Plan's trustee, as defined by the Plan. Therefore, these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are covered by an exemption from the prohibited transaction provisions.

**NOTE 7 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan provides for various investments. In general, such investments are exposed to various risks, such as significant world events, interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the value of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 8 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to allow participants to elect to make salary deferral and catch-up contributions to the Plan of 1% to 75% of eligible compensation.

Management has evaluated subsequent events through June 25, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
