Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Axiom Emerging Markets World Equity Fund (a portfolio series of Axiom Investors Trust II, a Delaware business trust) (the "Fund"), which comprise the statement of assets and liabilities, including the condensed schedule of investments, as of December 31, 2024, and the related statements of operations, and changes in net assets for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (collectively referred to as the "financial statements").

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Fund's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Fund's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024

1. ORGANIZATION

The Axiom Emerging Markets World Equity Fund (the “Fund”) is a portfolio series of Axiom Investors Trust II, a Delaware business trust. The Fund commenced operations on March 1, 2018. The Fund is exempt from registration under the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended, and interests in the Fund are offered pursuant to an exemption from registration under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended, and the regulations thereunder. The Fund is an investment company in Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”), following accounting and reporting guidance under FASB Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Topic 946, *Financial Services-Investment Companies*. The investment objective of the Fund is capital appreciation through investment in global emerging markets equity and equity-related securities. The Fund considers emerging markets securities of companies either (i) located in countries that are not included in the MSCI Developed Markets Index Series or (ii) that derive a majority of their revenues or assets from a country or countries not included in the MSCI Developed Markets Index Series, in each case at the time of investment.

Axiom Investors, LLC, formerly Axiom International Investors, LLC, (the “Manager”) is the investment manager of the Fund, with responsibility for investment management and administration. The Manager is a Registered Investment Adviser under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The Northern Trust Company is the custodian of the Trust (the “Custodial Trustee”). Wilmington Trust Company is the Delaware Trustee (the “Delaware Trustee”).

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Financial Statements — The Fund’s financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of increases and decreases in net assets from operations during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Securities — All securities are valued at fair value as of December 31, 2024. Securities traded on national exchanges are valued at the closing sale price or, if there are no sales, at the last published sales price or the latest bid quotation, whichever is more recent. Securities traded in the over-the-counter markets are valued at the closing representative bid price reported by NASDAQ. All other over-the-counter securities for which reliable quotations are available are valued at the latest bid quotation. Foreign securities are valued on the basis of quotations from the primary market in which they are traded and translated at each valuation date from the local currency into U.S. dollars using current exchange rates. Securities for which market quotations are not readily available (including illiquid securities) are valued at fair value as determined in good faith by the Custodial Trustee, under the direction of the Manager. As of December 31, 2024, no such securities existed. Short-term investment funds are valued at the quoted net asset value per share. Short-term investments are comprised of cash and cash equivalents invested in short-term investment funds which are redeemable daily.

Investment Activity — Investment transactions are accounted for on the trade date. Realized gains and losses on investments sold are computed using the specific identification method of cost determination.

Foreign Currency — All assets and liabilities of the Fund denominated in foreign currencies are translated into U.S. dollar amounts on the date of valuation. Purchases and sales of foreign securities are converted at the prevailing rate of exchange on the respective date of such transactions.

The Fund does not isolate that portion of the results of operations resulting from changes in foreign exchange rates on investments from the fluctuations arising from changes in fair values of securities held. Such fluctuations are included with the net realized and change in unrealized gain (loss) on investments and foreign currency in the Statement of Operations.

Reported net realized foreign exchange gains or losses arise from sales of foreign currencies and the difference between the amounts of dividends, interest, and foreign withholding taxes recorded on the Fund's books and the U.S. dollar equivalent of the amounts actually received or paid, in the Statement of Operations. Net change in unrealized foreign exchange gains and losses arise from changes in the fair value of assets and liabilities, other than investments in securities at fiscal year-end, resulting from changes in exchange rates.

Receivable from Brokers for Investment Sold/Payable to Brokers for Investment Purchased —

The Fund records all the securities transactions as of the trade date rather than the settle date in conjunction with FASB ASC Topic 946-320, *Financial Services-Investment Companies-Investments-Debt and Equity Securities*. Receivable from brokers for investments sold/Payable to brokers for investments purchased includes receivables from broker for securities sold but not delivered and payables to brokers for securities purchased but not received as of the year end. As of December 31, 2024, the Fund has amount Receivable and Payable for securities transactions that have not yet settled of \$113,564 and \$82,967, respectively.

Income Recognition — Interest income is recognized on an accrual basis and dividends from equity securities are recognized as income on the ex-dividend date. Withholding taxes on foreign dividends have been provided for in accordance with the Fund's understanding of the applicable country's tax rules and rates.

Expenses — Expenses, such as tax, custody, auditing and legal fees, are accrued by the Fund as incurred. The Manager may, but is not obligated to, voluntarily assume a portion of the Fund's expenses. No such expenses were assumed in the current year.

Income Taxes — The Fund is classified as a partnership for income tax purposes. Each investor is individually responsible for reporting income or loss, to the extent required by the federal and state income tax laws and regulations, based upon its respective share of the Fund's income and expenses as reported for income tax purposes.

The Fund follows the provisions of FASB ASC Topic 740, *Income Taxes* ("Topic 740"), related to accounting for uncertainty in income taxes. Topic 740 prescribes the minimum recognition threshold a tax position must meet in connection with accounting for uncertainties in income tax positions taken or expected to be taken by an entity before being measured and recognized in the financial statements. Topic 740 requires the evaluation of tax positions taken in the course of preparing the Fund's tax returns to determine whether the tax positions are "more-likely-than-not" of being sustained by the applicable tax authority. Tax positions not deemed to meet the "more-likely-than-not" threshold would be recorded as a tax liability in the current year. The Fund recognized no liability for uncertain tax positions in connection with Topic 740. The Fund is subject to U.S. Federal, state and local or non-U.S. income tax examinations by tax authorities for all tax years beginning in 2021.

Indemnifications — In the normal course of business, the Fund enters into contracts and agreements that contain a variety of representations and warranties and which provide general indemnifications. The Fund's maximum exposure under these arrangements is unknown, as this would involve future claims that may be made against the Fund that have not yet occurred. The Fund expects the risk of any future obligation under these indemnifications to be remote.

3. VALUATION OF INVESTMENT SECURITIES

In accordance with FASB ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, the Fund classifies its investments into Level 1, which refers to identical securities traded in an active market; Level 2, which refers to securities not traded on an active market but for which observable market inputs are readily available or Level 1 securities where there is a contractual restriction; and Level 3, which refers to securities not traded in an active market and for which no significant observable market inputs are available.

A description of the valuation techniques applied to the Fund's major categories of assets and liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis follows.

Equity Securities — Securities are generally valued based on quoted prices from the applicable exchange. To the extent these securities are actively traded, valuation adjustments are not applied and they are categorized in Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. Restricted securities issued by publicly held companies are valued at a discount to similar publicly traded securities and may be categorized as Level 2 of the fair value hierarchy to the extent that the discount is considered to be insignificant to the fair value measurement in its entirety, otherwise they may be categorized as Level 3. Restricted securities held in non-public entities are included in Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy because they trade infrequently, and therefore, the inputs are unobservable.

Exchange-Traded Funds — Investments in exchange-traded funds are valued based on quoted prices from the applicable exchange for which market quotations are readily available and valuation adjustments are not applied, are generally categorized in Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

Short-Term Investments — Investments in investment companies, including the short-term investment funds, are valued at their net asset values as reported by such companies. Publicly traded investment companies, for which market quotations are readily available and valuation adjustments are not applied, are generally categorized in Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. Investment companies that are not traded on an exchange, but are valued based on observable inputs, are generally categorized in Level 2 of the fair value hierarchy.

Further information regarding the disaggregation of fair value by security type is included in the Condensed Schedule of Investments and Note 6. At December 31, 2024, the Fund's investments were classified as follows, based on fair values:

4. DERIVATIVE FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Fund may enter into forward foreign currency exchange contracts primarily to hedge against foreign currency exchange rate risks on its non-U.S. dollar-denominated investment securities. When entering into a forward foreign currency exchange contract, the Fund agrees to receive or deliver a fixed quantity of foreign currency for an agreed-upon price on an agreed future date. These contracts are valued at each portfolio valuation date, and the Fund's net equity therein, representing unrealized gain or loss on the contracts as measured by the difference between the forward foreign exchange rates at the dates of entry into the contracts and the forward rates at the reporting date, is included in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities as unrealized gain or loss on forward foreign currency contracts. Net realized and change in unrealized gains and losses are

included in the Statement of Operations. These instruments involve market risk, credit risk, or both kinds of risks, in excess of the amount recognized in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities. Risks arise from the possible inability of counterparties to meet the terms of their contracts and from movement in currency rates.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Fund did not hold or trade any forward foreign currency exchange contracts.

In addition, the Fund may enter into equity swap contracts. The equity swap contract mirrors the investment in an equity security and requires an initial margin deposit. Equity swaps are marked to fair value as determined by the underlying equity price and the change in fair value is recorded by the Fund as change in unrealized gain or loss on swap contracts in the Statement of Operations. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Fund did not hold or trade any swap contracts.

These instruments involve market risk, credit risk, or both kinds of risks, in excess of the amount recognized in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities. Risks arise from the possible inability of counterparties to meet the terms of their contracts and from movement in currency and securities fair values.

5. CAPITAL SHARE TRANSACTIONS

Subscriptions and redemptions — Subscriptions and redemptions may be made in the form of cash or securities, which are recorded at their fair value at the date of subscription or redemption. Subscriptions, redemptions and other investor activity are effective normally on the last business day of each calendar month. Investors will generally be able to redeem their capital upon not less than fifteen business days' prior written notice to the Fund. Redemptions are recognized as liabilities when the amount requested in the redemption notice becomes fixed. As a result, redemptions paid after the end of the year, based on investors' net asset balances at year-end, are included in redemptions payable at December 31, 2024, if applicable.

Distributions — The Fund retains the right to distribute any income from its investments and any proceeds from any gains realized on the sale of its underlying investments in proportion to investors' percentage ownership capital in the Fund, and the Fund intends generally to follow a policy of retaining and reinvesting within the Fund all of the net income and capital gains realized by the Fund, thereby increasing the net assets of the Fund.

Distributions to investors represent income, and realized gains or realized losses related to initial public offering investments ("New Issue Investments"). Not all investors are eligible to receive income, and realized gains or realized losses related to New Issue Investments. Income and gain distributions related to New Issue Investments are automatically reinvested into the Fund. Realized losses related to New Issue Investments are included as investor redemptions for those eligible investors. The Fund has no initial public offering investments in the current year.

Certain limited partners are members, officers, principals, employees or affiliates of the Manager and represent 3.53% of the net assets at December 31, 2024.

7. FEES AND EXPENSES

The investors of the Fund pay a monthly fee to the Manager for investment management services, in accordance with their subscription agreement based on the aggregate Net Asset Value held by the investor as determined on the last business day of each month. Management fees are paid through redemption of Fund capital held by the investor, or payment by the investor separately from the Fund. The Manager shall be entitled to increase or decrease such compensation from time to time; provided, however, that the Manager shall promptly give notice of any increase to the subscriber. No such increase shall become effective until 30 days after the subscriber has been notified thereof. Certain investors of the Fund may pay a quarterly incentive fee to the Manager, in accordance with their subscription agreement terms. Other expenses, such as custody, audit, tax and legal fees, when incurred, are paid by the Fund. Neither the management fee nor incentive fee is an expense of the Fund, accordingly no management fee or incentive fee expense is reflected in the Statement of Operations.

8. CREDIT AND MARKET RISK

The security exchanges of certain foreign markets are substantially smaller, less liquid and more volatile than the major securities markets in the United States. Consequently, acquisition and disposition of securities by the Fund may be inhibited. In addition, a significant proportion of the aggregate market value of equity securities listed on the major securities exchanges in emerging markets are held by a smaller number of investors. This may limit the number of shares available for acquisition or disposition by the Fund. Some countries in which the Fund may invest require governmental approval for the repatriation of investment income, capital or the proceeds of sales of securities by foreign investors. In addition, if there is deterioration in a country's balance of payments or for other reasons, a country may impose temporary restrictions on foreign capital remittances abroad. Market risk arises mainly from uncertainty about future fair values of financial instruments held specifically from price, currency and interest rate movements. Market risk is directly impacted by the volatility and liquidity in the markets in which the financial instruments are traded and/or cleared.

9. CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

Since the Fund does not clear its own securities transactions, it has established accounts with broker dealers for this purpose. This can, and often does, result in concentrations of credit risk with one or more of these firms. Such risk, however, is partially mitigated by the brokers' obligation to comply with rules and regulations governing their business activities. These rules and regulations generally require maintenance of net capital, as defined, and segregation of customers' funds and securities from holdings of the firm.

10. FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The financial highlights provided below are computed for the Fund as a whole and are intended to facilitate the understanding of the Fund's financial performance for the year ended December 31, 2024. Total Return is calculated using period returns which are geometrically-linked based on cash flows that eliminate the effect of investor subscriptions and redemptions and has not been annualized. The ratios are based on monthly average net assets for the year ended December 31, 2024. An individual investor's total return and ratios may differ from the total return and ratios disclosed due to the timing of capital activity and income from New Issue Investments.
