We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Traditions of America 401(k) Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Plan management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Traditions of America 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Traditions of America 401(k) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. The Plan was originally effective January 1, 2002 and was most recently amended and restated effective February 18, 2022. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Traditions of America LP (the “Company”) and related participating employers, who have attained the age of twenty-one. Employees who are covered by a collective bargaining agreement for which retirement benefits have been the subject of good faith negotiations are not eligible to participate in the Plan. Employees who are nonresident aliens with no income from a U.S. source, and employees who are acquired through an acquisition or merger are also ineligible for Plan participation. Eligible employees can enter the Plan on the first day of each month. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 85 percent of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, provided that in no event shall a participant elect to contribute more than the maximum allowed by law. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Contributions may be designated as Roth 401(k) contributions. The Plan provisions include automatic enrollment for participants who do not complete a salary deferral agreement by their Plan entry date, and provided that no contrary election is made, the participant will automatically defer 3% of eligible compensation for each payroll period to be contributed to the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan provides for a non-discretionary matching employer contribution which is calculated each payroll period. The non-discretionary matching employer contribution is 100% of the first 3% of an active participant’s eligible compensation contributed to the Plan. The Plan also provides for a discretionary profit sharing contribution for participants who complete 500 hours of service during the Plan year or are employed on the last day of the Plan year. There were no discretionary profit sharing contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and the Company’s matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company’s profit sharing contributions, if any, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balances. No more than two loans to a participant may be outstanding at any given time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Loan terms shall not extend beyond five years from the date of the loan, unless the loan is for the purchase of a participant’s primary residence.

Vesting

A participant, at all times, has a fully vested (100%) interest in their own contributions and rollover contributions, including actual earnings thereon.

Notwithstanding the above, participants will become 100% vested in the matching and profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts upon their attainment of normal retirement age (65), death, or disability.

Forfeitures are generally used to pay administrative expenses or offset employer contributions. Total unallocated forfeiture account balances were \$122,438 and \$113,643, respectively, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$74,888 were used to pay administrative expenses and \$60,194 were allocated to participants. No forfeitures were used to offset employer contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or a partial payment. In circumstances when a terminated participant has a vested account balance less than \$5,000, the participant's vested account balance shall be distributed in a lump sum. In the event of a mandatory distribution greater than \$1,000, if the participant does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly, then the Plan administrator will pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement account designated by the Plan administrator. Hardships and in-service distributions are also permitted from participant accounts, based on the terms of the Plan document.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan:

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The financial statements include the fully benefit-responsive investment contract and its related activity on a contract value basis (see Note 5).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee and investment advisors. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants (participant loans for Form 5500 reporting purposes) are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Discretionary profit-sharing contributions, if any, are recorded in the year earned.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

All reasonable administrative expenses, including trustee, custodial and third party administration fees necessary to operate and administer the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses of maintaining the Plan that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. A participant's account may be charged for expenses associated with a specific optional feature, including administration of participant loans, elected by that participant, and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through June 26, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Information Certified by a Qualified Institution

The Plan administrator having determined that it is permissible in the circumstances elected to have the audits of the Plan performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) was obtained or derived from information obtained by the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a, Principal Trust Company, a qualified institution and trustee of the Plan, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA:

- Investments, at fair value, fully benefit-responsive investment contract, at contract value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment activity, including net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

<i>Mutual funds (registered investment companies):</i>	Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
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<i>Pooled separate accounts:</i>	Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") or equivalent based on units of the pooled separate accounts. The NAV, as provided by the insurance company, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the pooled separate account less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the pooled separate account will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan's pooled separate accounts are invested in a variety of funds designed to mirror the investment strategies of similar mutual funds (registered investment companies), including equity-style funds. The objective of pooled separate accounts invested in equity investments is to approximate the risk and return characterized by various indexes; to seek long term capital appreciation; provide diversified exposure representative of various segments of the U.S. or foreign equity market; and/or to seek income. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of a pooled separate account, the insurance company reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the account in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

5. Contract with Insurance Companies

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan holds a traditional investment contract in the amount of \$106,176 and \$202,352, respectively. More specifically, the Plan holds the Principal Guaranteed Option, a guaranteed general account backed group annuity contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus interest credited less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The Principal Guaranteed Option is a group fixed annuity contract and is backed by the general account of the Principal Life Insurance Company. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The Plan owns a promise to pay interest at crediting rates which are announced in advance and guaranteed as outlined in the group annuity contract. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is based on the “vintage” approach. Each “vintage” is a set of guaranteed interest balances which remain in effect throughout the duration of the contract.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Certain events (including but not limited to termination of the contract, plan disqualification or plan termination) might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Additionally, the contract issuer may terminate the contract for causes, including but not limited to failure to maintain certain minimum amount of assets, plan disqualification or failure to comply with the terms of the contract. Upon occurrence of such an event, a market value adjustment or withdrawal restrictions may apply. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with participants.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against the group fixed annuity contract values for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

6. Tax Status

Effective February 18, 2022, through the adoption of a Principal Financial Group Prototype for Savings Plans, the Plan was amended and restated. The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) issued an opinion letter, dated June 30, 2020, stating that the prototype non-standardized profit sharing plan document was designed in accordance with applicable Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) requirements as of that date. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, management of the Plan believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes the Plan, as amended, is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

7. Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in pooled separate accounts managed by Principal Life Insurance Company whose affiliates act as trustee and recordkeeper of the Plan. Certain Plan expenses are also paid to Principal Trust Company. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. Fees paid directly from participant accounts, including those for the administration of participant loans, are included in administrative expenses. Additionally, for participants who have elected to take a participant loan, the loans are secured by the respective participant's account balance.

8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts, including any Company contributions in which they are not already vested and the net assets of the Plan would be distributed to Plan participants and beneficiaries in proportion to their respective account balances.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options to its participants. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
