### NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the **E.C.I., Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan and Trust** (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General** - E.C.I., Inc. (the "Company") established the employee stock ownership plan effective as of July 1, 2000, for all employees of the Company other than leased employees or employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement. The Plan operates as an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP), and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (IRC) and is subject to the applicable provisions of Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is administered by an Employee Benefits Administration Committee which consist of not less than one person appointed by the Sponsor Company.

Effective September 30, 2021, the Plan was amended to freeze the Plan. As such, no newly hired or rehired employees shall become a participant and no participant shall receive an allocation on or after September 30, 2021. As of September 30, 2021, all participants were fully vested in their account balances.

The Plan purchased Company common stock using the proceeds from a bank borrowing and holds the common stock in a trust established under the Plan. The bank borrowing was repaid during the Plan year ended June 30, 2008.

**Eligibility** - Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan after one year of service providing they worked at least 500 hours during the Plan year, received compensation during the Plan year, and were employed on the last day of the Plan year.

**Employer Contributions** - The Company is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan, which, when aggregated with the Plan's dividends and interest earnings, equal the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of benefits. Participant contributions are not permitted.

**Participant Accounts** - The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's beginning of the year account balance to all participants' beginning of the year account balances.

**Vesting** - For participants terminating employment for reasons other than death or upon the Normal Retirement rate, the first day of the calendar month in which the participant is age 65, the Plan has the following graded vesting schedule:

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**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN - CONTINUED**

**Benefits Paid** - Vested benefits are payable to participants upon termination of employment or in the event of the Plan's termination, in accordance with the distribution provisions of the Plan document. Distributions will be made in the form of whole shares of Company stock, with cash equal to the value of any fractional shares, in accordance with the distribution provisions of the Plan document. If shares of Company stock are distributed, such distribution shall be subject to a requirement that such shares be sold to the Company immediately upon distribution. Benefits other than Company stock are payable in the form of a lump-sum cash distribution, if under \$1,000, or installment payments over a period not to exceed five years. Company stock shall be payable according to the administrator's discretion, in a lump-sum distribution, or installment payments over a period not to exceed five years.

**Put Option** - Under federal income tax regulations, the employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representation of the current value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

**Diversification** - Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a 6-year period. In each of the first 5 years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the last year of the period, a participant may diversify up to 50 percent. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution.

**Forfeitures** - Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's compensation to total compensation for the Plan year. No forfeitures were allocated during the plan years 2024 and 2023.

**Voting Rights** - Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the Trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated shares for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The Trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting** - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

**Financial Estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

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### NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** - The shares of the Company common stock are valued at fair value. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses** - As provided in the Plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company. The Company has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

**Subsequent Events** - In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through June 12, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS

The Plan's investment in E.C.I. Inc.'s stock as of June 30, 2024 and 2023 is as follows:

For the year ended June 30, 2024, the Company redeemed 1,561.6750 shares of stock from participants, decreasing the number of shares held by the ESOP to 20,488.0381.

For the year ended June 30, 2023, the Company redeemed 1,447.2928 shares of stock from participants, decreasing the number of shares held by the ESOP to 22,049.7131.

All investment values are determined through an annual valuation (see Note 4).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Accounting standards provide a framework for measuring fair value. This framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the accounting standards are described as follows:

**Level 1** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs, and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024.

*Common Stock:* The common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based upon an independent appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables, and fair value of Company assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that market participants would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

The valuation process involves Plan management's selection of an independent appraiser. Plan management accumulates the data for the appraiser from the financial statements of the Company. The appraiser prepares a preliminary report which Plan management, along with the ESOP trustee, reviews in detail, discusses and approves. The results of this process are documented in minutes of the Plan fiduciary.

**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS - CONTINUED**

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

### **NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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#### **NOTE 5 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan's assets, which consist principally of Company common shares, are held by the Trustee of the Plan. Thus, the Trustee defined by the Plan, qualifies as a party-in-interest.

Company contributions are held and managed by the Trustee, who invest cash received, interest, and dividend income and makes distributions to participants. These are party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses for the Trustee's fees are paid directly by the Company.

#### **NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS**

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated May 25, 2017, stating that the Plan is qualified, under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation.

U.S. generally accepted accounting principles require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan, and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### **NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION**

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Employee Benefits Administration Committee shall direct the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund.

#### **NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan investments consist primarily of Company common stock, which is exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows, and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

#### **NOTE 9 - RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO FORM 5500**

For the years 2024 and 2023, there were no differences between the financial statements and the Form 5500.
