### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

#### NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of DeAngelis Diamond Construction, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

##### General

The Plan was established on January 1, 1999. The Plan is a defined contribution plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) covering substantially all employees of DeAngelis Diamond Construction, LLC and its related entities DeAngelis Diamond Healthcare Group, LLC, DeAngelis Diamond Holdings, LLC, and DeAngelis Diamond Homes, LLC (collectively referred to as "the Company") who are not leased employees or nonresident aliens. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

##### Contributions

Participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan upon hire. Unless a participant makes an affirmative election, participants are automatically enrolled to contribute 6% of compensation each pay period on a pre-tax basis. Participants may elect to contribute on a pre-tax basis or post-tax (Roth) basis to the Plan up to the maximum amount allowed by law. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company makes an annual safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of participant contributions up to 6% of compensation. The safe harbor matching contribution totaled \$1,524,083 and \$1,315,262 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The safe harbor matching contributions were funded subsequent to the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and are included in employer contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Company may also make discretionary matching contributions and nonelective contributions to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made an annual discretionary matching contribution equal to 75% of participant contributions up to 4% of compensation totaling \$792,412. For the year ended December 31, 2023, the Company made an annual discretionary matching contribution equal to 100% of participant contributions up to 4% of compensation totaling \$907,941. The discretionary matching contributions were funded subsequent to the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and are included in employer contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. There were no discretionary nonelective contributions made to the Plan during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Participants direct the investment of their employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

##### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company safe harbor matching contributions, Company discretionary matching contributions, if any, an allocation of Company discretionary nonelective contributions, if any, and Plan earnings.

#### NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

##### Participant Accounts (continued)

Participants are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

##### Vesting

Participants vest immediately in their contributions and their Company safe harbor matching contributions, Company discretionary matching contributions, if any, and Company discretionary nonelective contributions, if any, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants who terminated prior to January 1, 2021, vest in their Company discretionary matching contributions, if any, and Company discretionary nonelective contributions, if any, on a six-year graded vesting schedule based on years of service.

##### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loans bear interest at a rate of 1% over the prime rate. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

##### Payment of Benefits

Participants, or their beneficiaries, may receive the vested interest of their Plan account through a distribution of benefits upon retirement, death, termination of employment, or a qualifying withdrawal. Hardship withdrawals are permitted by the Plan. In-service distributions may be made to a participant who has not separated from service provided the participant has attained age 59 ½. Benefit payments are made in the form of lump sum distributions or partial withdrawals. Participants who terminate employment with a balance of less than \$1,000 may receive an automatic lump sum distribution of their balance. Effective April 1, 2024, participants who terminate employment with a balance of less than \$7,000, but more than \$1,000, may receive an automatic direct rollover of their account balance into an individual retirement account without consent. Prior to April 1, 2024, participants who terminated employment with a balance of less than \$5,000, but more than \$1,000, may have received an automatic direct rollover of their account balance into an individual retirement account without consent.

##### Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures result from non-vested benefit payments remaining in the Plan for all terminated employees or adjustments, if any. Forfeitures may be used to pay Plan expenses or reduce future employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeiture balance was \$2,336 and \$5,787, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$3,200 and \$5,000 were used to reduce a portion of the employer contributions, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$3,201 were used to pay Plan expenses. No forfeitures were used to pay Plan expenses during the year ended December 31, 2023.

#### NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

##### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the guaranteed investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the Company safe harbor, discretionary matching, and discretionary nonelective contributions, if any, are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

##### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

##### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include fees for recordkeeping services, investment advisory services, investment management, and third-party administration. Fees related to the administration of benefit payments and participant loans and individual financial advisory

NOTE D – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The *Fair Value Measurements* topic of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC)* establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

NOTE D – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the methodology to value the unit investment trusts held in the self-directed brokerage accounts changed due to the investments having readily determinable fair values. The unit investment trusts as of December 31, 2023 were also reclassified in the fair value hierarchy to conform to the presentation in the 2024 financial statements.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Self-directed brokerage accounts:* Plan participants can invest in publicly traded securities, registered investment companies (mutual funds), and certain other investments through a self-directed brokerage account. The underlying investments held in the self-directed brokerage accounts are valued as follows:

*Interest-bearing cash:* Valued at cost plus accrued interest.

*Mutual funds (including money market funds):* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common stock:* Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

*Unit investment trusts:* Valued at the NAV of units of the investment trust. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying exchange-traded fund (ETF) investments. Units of beneficial interest in the fund are not registered with the SEC; however, these funds publish their daily NAV and transact at that price. There are no unfunded commitments. The redemption frequency is daily.

*Collective investment trusts:* Valued at the NAV of units of the collective investment trust fund as reported by the fund. The NAV is used as a practical expedient. Units of beneficial interest in the fund are not registered with the SEC; however, these funds publish their daily NAV and transact at that price. There are no unfunded commitments. The redemption frequency is daily.

#### NOTE E – GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed interest account with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (formerly Great-West Life and Annuity Insurance Company) through a group annuity contract. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America maintains the contributions in a general account (“Guaranteed Interest Fund”). The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that the issuer guarantees to the Plan.

The contract meets the fully benefit responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, represents contributions made under the account, plus earnings, less charges under the account for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The contract value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$401,325 and \$256,877, respectively. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the issuer or otherwise. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than zero percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The average yield earned by the Plan for the benefit responsive fund can be derived from averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The average yield earned was 1.66% and 1.48% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The actual average yield earned by the Plan for the benefit responsive fund can be derived by averaging the Plan’s quarterly interest rates. The actual average yield for the Plan was 1.66% and 1.48% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan document (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, spinoffs and divestitures), or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines, (2) breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

#### NOTE F – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

#### NOTE G – TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved defined contribution plan which obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### NOTE H – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Empower Retirement, LLC (and its affiliates Empower Trust Company, LLC, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, and Empower Advisory Group, LLC collectively referred to as “Empower”) is the recordkeeper and trustee for the Plan. The Plan investments are managed by Empower. Fees paid to Empower have been included in administrative expenses. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

DGH & Associates, Inc. dba Florida Retirement Consultants (FRC) is the third-party administrator for the Plan. Fees paid to FRC have been included in administrative expenses. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Raymond James Financial Services Advisors, Inc. (Raymond James) is the investment advisor for the Plan. Fees paid to Raymond James have been included in administrative expenses. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

#### NOTE I - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### NOTE J – RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO FORM 5500

Certain amounts included on the Schedule H Part I and II of the Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plans (Form 5500) have been grouped differently for purposes of presentation in the financial statements.
