NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the National Aerospace Solutions, LLC Employees Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the *Plan Document* for a more complete description of the Plan provisions, which is available from Plan management (Management).

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of National Aerospace Solutions, LLC (NAS or the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Benefit Plan Investment Committee is the ERISA Plan Administrator and Named Fiduciary and is responsible for oversight of the Plan, including monitoring the performance of the Plan's independent investment financial professional, as provided under ERISA 3(38).

Effective July 1, 2016, NAS assumed responsibility for certain work previously performed (1) by ATA at the Arnold Engineering Development Complex (AEDC) at (i) Arnold Air Force Base in Tennessee (Tennessee) and (ii) the Hyper Velocity Wind Tunnel 9 (Tunnel 9) located at White Oak, Maryland, and (2) by Jacobs Technology, Inc. at the National Full Scale Aerodynamics Complex (NFAC) at Moffett Field, California, and on such date certain employees at AEDC, White Oak or NFAC who were employed by ATA, its subcontractors, or Jacobs Technology, Inc. and participated in the Plan were transferred to and became employees of NAS.

Contributions

Each year, participants in the Plan may contribute by periodic payroll deduction an amount neither less than 1% nor more than 50% of their basic compensation, as defined in the Plan document, or a specified amount as determined by the Secretary of the Treasury in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), during each year of membership. The highly compensated employee (HCE) contributions rate is capped at 15% and may be adjusted periodically by the Company. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Plan has Traditional 401(k) and Enhanced 401(k) elements. A Traditional 401(k) participant is an individual who also participates in the AEDC Contractors Employee Pension Plan (the AEDC Pension Plan). For a Traditional 401(k) participant, the Company matches participant contributions (not including any catch-up contribution) at 100% up to 1% of participants' basic compensation and 50% for additional contributions up to 5% of their compensation.

Effective March 14, 2011, "Enhanced 401(k)" was approved for certain participants who are no longer eligible to participate in the AEDC Pension Plan. For the Enhanced 401(k) participants, the Company matches participant contributions (not including any catch-up contributions) at 50% of contributions up to 8% of the participant's compensation.

In addition to matching contributions, the Company contributes additional funds into the Plan (Company Non-Matching Contributions) for Enhanced 401(k) plan participants only. An Enhanced 401(k) plan participant is eligible for Company Non-Matching Contribution for a pay period if he or she is eligible to make 401(k) Contributions to the Plan for that pay period, subject to the 2,000-week limit described below. The contribution is based on the participant's basic compensation for the pay period, and his or her "Points" as of the first day of the pay period. Points equal the participant's age, plus Years of Service. Years of Service equals the participant's Years of Participation in the AEDC Pension Plan prior to becoming an Enhanced 401(k) Plan Participant and such participant's total years of service in this Plan after becoming an Enhanced 401(k) plan participant. An Enhanced 401(k) plan participant may not receive this contribution for more than 2,000 weeks (i.e., 1,000 bi-weekly pay periods). This limit is reduced by his or her Years of Participation in the AEDC Pension Plan. Years of Participation in the AEDC Pension Plan count toward this vesting.

Participant Accounts

Each participant account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. The Plan is intended to operate as a plan described in Section 404(c) of ERISA. This means that the Plan lets participants choose from a broad range of investments with differing characteristics, and they can (and have the responsibility to) decide for themselves how to invest the assets in their individual account under the Plan. Prospectuses relating to the various investment vehicles are available to the Plan participants. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the amount in the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their own contributions, Company matching contributions, and actual earnings (losses) thereon, except for the portion attributable to Company Non-Matching contributions, including all earnings (losses) thereon, which shall become fully vested and non-forfeitable after at least two years of vesting service. However, Company Non-Matching contributions will become 100% vested (i) in the event of the participant's death while actively employed by the Company, or (ii) on the date the participant attains Normal Retirement Age (NRA) while actively employed by the Company (where NRA is the later of attainment of age 65 or 5 years of vesting service, or (iii) in the event participant terminates employment with the Company due to any of the following: (a) a lack of work because of reorganization, elimination or consolidation of jobs or job functions, (b) partial or complete contract termination, (c) reduced level of contract effort, or (d) an identifiable need to realign the skills of the workforce to better support contract requirements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding balance of any loan from the Plan to the participant during the one-year period ending on the day before the date such loan is made or 50% of their account balance excluding Company Non-Matching Contributions and all earnings thereon. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by Plan management. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon their retirement or termination of service, participants may elect to receive their individual account under the Plan in one or more of the following ways:

- Single lump-sum payment of cash;
- Periodic installment payments of cash over a period not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant or the participant's designated beneficiary;
- A direct rollover of the participant's individual account to another qualified plan, qualified annuity plan, eligible 457(b) plan, 403(b) plan, or to a traditional IRA; and
- Any combination of the above options.

Forfeited Accounts

The non-vested balance in a participant's account is forfeited upon termination of service as described in the Plan Document. Forfeited amounts may be utilized for any purpose permitted under the Plan document, the Code, ERISA, and applicable guidance. At September 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$85,356 and \$100,270, respectively. For the fiscal year ended September 30, 2024, \$62,435 from forfeited non-vested accounts was used to pay administrative expenses and \$10,290 to reduce employer contribution.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income (loss) is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan gains (losses) on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of September 30, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and Plan management deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits paid directly to participants are recorded when paid.

Management's Review of Subsequent Events

In preparing the accompanying financial statements, Management has reviewed all known events that have occurred after September 30, 2024, and through June 30, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for inclusion in the financial statements and footnotes.

Transfers to/from Other Plan, Net

Transfers to/from other plan, net, include transfers of participant account balances to/from the Plan to the NAS, LLC Wage Employees Retirement Savings Plan as a result of change in employment status.

NOTE 3: CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS AND RELATED INVESTMENT INCOME

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments and notes receivable from participants held as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended September 30, 2024 was obtained by Management and agreed to or derived from information certified to be complete and accurate by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan (Trustee).

NOTE 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

FASB ASC 820 established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in an active market for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds): Valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Common/collective trusts: Valued using the practical expedient of the NAV of units held by the Plan at year-end based on the quoted market prices of the underlying marketable securities or discounted cash flows of the underlying investment contracts. Participant-directed redemptions of the common/collective trusts have no restrictions; however, the Plan is required to provide a one-year notice to liquidate its entire share in the fund. The Vanguard Retirement Savings Trust provides for the collective investments of assets of tax-exempt pension and profit-sharing plans, primarily in a pool of investment contracts that are issued by insurance companies and commercial banks and in contracts that are backed by bond trusts that are selected by the Trustee.

The preceding methodologies may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5: PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee or its affiliates. There were no transactions with parties in interest other than the payment of the Trustee fees and purchases and sales of assets through the Trustee. The Company paid fees during the year for accounting, legal, and other services, while the Trustee fees were paid by the Plan.

NOTE 6: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rates, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and current market volatility, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in value of investment securities will continue to occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE 7: PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on February 10, 2016, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, Plan management believes that the Plan and related trust are currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code.

US GAAP requires Management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
