NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS OF AND FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Iowa Bankers Insurance and Services, Inc. 401(k) Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

General—The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Iowa Bankers Insurance and Services, Inc. and subsidiaries (the “Company”) with monthly entry dates. The Company controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Principal Trust Company, a subsidiary of Principal Financial Group (“Principal”) serves as the custodian and recordkeeper of the Plan.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions—Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible earnings, as defined in the Plan, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations. The Company matching contributions are mandatory for participants hired after December 31, 2008, and discretionary for participants hired on or before December 31, 2008. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company matched 50% of the first 6% of participant contributions for those participants hired on or before December 31, 2008. For participants hired after December 31, 2008, the Company matched 100% up to 3% of participant contributions, plus 50% on the next 4% of participant contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. These amounts are classified as rollover contributions.

Employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a 7% participant contribution rate but can opt not to participate. The Plan has provision for automatic 1% annual increases, occurring March 1 each year, up to a 10% participant contribution rate. Effective March 1, 2025, the automatic 1% annual increases occur up to a 15% contribution rate.

Participant Accounts—Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions, including earnings and losses thereon, and the Company’s matching contributions, and charged with withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Investments—Participants direct the investment of their contributions, as well as company contributions, into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and common/collective trust funds, including a stable return fund, as investment options for participants.

Vesting—Participants are vested immediately in all contributions, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants—Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000, not to exceed 50% of the participant’s vested account balance. Notes receivable terms range from one to five years or up to 15 years if the note receivable is for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at rates commensurate with the local prevailing rates at the time the funds are borrowed. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024, participant loans have maturities through 2037 at an interest rate of 5.25%–10.50%.

Payment of Benefits—Upon termination of service with the Company (including termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement), the vested portion of the participant’s account is paid to the participant or beneficiary. Account balances less than \$5,000 must be paid in a lump sum. Retirement benefits can be paid in a lump sum or installment options.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting—The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

Use of Estimates—The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties—The Plan utilizes various investment instruments, such as mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and common/collective trust funds. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the value of the participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition—Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a description of valuation methods.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and common/collective trust funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants—Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative Expenses—Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan or the Company, as provided in the Plan document. Participants pay administrative costs based on their account balance and for loans and distributions that are specific to their transactions.

Payment of Benefits—Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no amounts allocated to accounts of persons who have elected to withdraw from the Plan, but have not yet been paid.

Excess Contributions Payable—The Plan is required to return contributions received during the Plan year in excess of the IRC limits. There were no excess contributions due to participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Contributions—Employee contributions and employer matching contributions are recorded when employee contributions are withheld.

Subsequent Events—Subsequent events related to the financial statements have been evaluated through June 27, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. The Plan determined that there are no events that require adjustment or disclosure in these financial statements.

3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

The following is a summary of the information regarding the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedule that was prepared by or derived from information prepared by the custodian of the Plan and furnished to the Plan administrator. The Plan administrator has obtained certifications from the custodian that such information is complete and accurate. As of December 31, 2023, Mutual funds, Common/collective trust funds, and Pooled separate accounts have been reclassified to conform to the current year presentation and have been aggregated and presented together as “Participant directed investments”.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the

inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value, as follows: Level 1, which refers to securities valued using unadjusted quoted prices from active markets for identical assets; Level 2, which refers to securities not traded on an active market but for which observable market inputs are readily available; and Level 3, which refers to securities valued based on significant unobservable inputs. Assets are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Asset Valuation Techniques—Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds are registered investment companies and are categorized as Level 1 as they are valued and transact at quoted market prices that represent the net asset value of shares held at plan year end.

Pooled separate accounts are investment vehicles established and maintained by an insurance company and are categorized as Level 1 as they are valued and transact at quoted market prices that represent the net asset value of shares held at plan year end.

Self-directed brokerage accounts contain investment options that are publicly traded securities for which holding detail and pricing are publicly available and are categorized as Level 1.

Common/collective trust funds, inclusive of stable return funds (collectively “CCTs”), are valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of shares of the underlying fund. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. As the practical expedient is utilized, these CCTs are not included in the fair value leveling table, but are included as a reconciling line item to the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The following tables set forth by level within the fair value hierarchy a summary of the Plan’s investments measured at fair value on a recurring basis at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The valuation methods as described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. NET ASSET VALUE PER SHARE

The fair values of the investments have been estimated using the NAV of the investment. There are no unfunded commitments to fund these investments nor are there any restrictions on redemptions.

6. EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of CCTs or pooled separate accounts which are managed by Principal. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

8. FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

Effective July 1, 2022, the Plan adopted a prototype plan document sponsored by Principal. Principal received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated June 30, 2020, which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. However, the Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan does not have any uncertain positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
