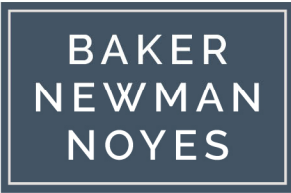

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

The Plan Administrator and Participants
Matter Communications, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Matter Communications, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Matter Communications, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Matter Communications, Inc. (the Company) for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). The Company is the sponsor of the Plan. Principal Life Insurance Company, Principal Life Insurance Company on behalf of Principal Global Investors Trust Company and Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (collectively Principal) serve as the trustees of the Plan.

Eligibility and Participation

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after having completed 1,000 hours of credited service within 12 months of the employment commencement date and attaining age 21. A participant can enter the Plan on the first day of the quarter coinciding with or next following the date on which eligibility is established.

The *SECURE ACT 2.0* expanded eligibility for certain long-term part-time (LTPT) employees. Effective January 1, 2024, part-time employees who have completed at least 500 hours of service in the three most recent consecutive years (2021 – 2023) are eligible to participate in the plan. Effective January 1, 2025, the requirement is being reduced from three to the two most recent consecutive years (2023 – 2024).

Contributions

Each participant may elect to defer pretax compensation or post-tax Roth compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to the maximum amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The Company's safe harbor matching contribution is 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of compensation that a participant defers. The matching contribution formula complies with the Safe Harbor provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan does not allow discretionary Company contributions.

The Plan permits catch-up contributions for eligible participants who are 50 years or older by the end of the calendar year and who are currently making deferral contributions. Participants may elect to rollover distributions from other qualified retirement plans.

At the participant's option, contributions may be invested in certain funds offered by the Plan. Participants should refer to each fund's prospectus for further details on the funds' objectives. Participants may change their salary reduction contribution and investment options at any time during the Plan year.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions and, (b) Plan earnings or losses, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings and account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

1. **Description of the Plan (Continued)**

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and employer safe harbor matching contributions, plus investment earnings or losses thereon.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the assets would be distributed to participants in accordance with the terms set forth in the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

In-service withdrawals from the participant's elective accounts are permitted only due to financial hardship or upon reaching age 59 ½. Participants are entitled to a distribution upon their death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment. The method of distribution is elected by the participant, subject to the terms and conditions of the Plan. The Plan allows the Plan Administrator to automatically distribute to terminated participants their entire account balance if it is less than \$5,000.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of the participant's vested balance or \$50,000 (reduced by any outstanding note balance in the previous 12 months). Notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate comparable to a similar loan with a commercial institution. A participant may have a maximum of one note outstanding at any time. Repayments of principal plus interest is required within five years unless the note is for the purchase of a principal residence. The loan repayment period for a principal residence shall be consistent with commercial home loan practices. The interest rates on the two outstanding loans range from 5.25% – 10.00% and the loans have various maturities through 2028. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses are generally paid by the Plan. Certain expenses resulting from loan administration or benefit payments are deducted directly from participant accounts.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period and, when applicable, disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments in mutual funds, collective trust funds and pooled separate accounts are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The guaranteed investment contract is reported at contract value, as determined by the insurance company, as it is considered fully benefit-responsive. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of investment securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments that were both bought and sold during the year as well as net unrealized appreciation on investments held at year-end.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options which in turn invest in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Contributions

Contributions are recorded in the period in which payroll deductions are made; employer safe harbor matching contributions are recorded in the same period as the related participant contributions.

2. **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)**

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned on an accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Subsequent Events

Events occurring after the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits are evaluated by management to determine whether such events should be recognized or disclosed in the financial statements. Management has evaluated subsequent events through June 30, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. **Tax Status**

The Plan has adopted a nonstandardized preapproved plan sponsored by Principal Financial Group. The nonstandardized preapproved plan has received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 which stated that the plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the IRC).

The Plan was amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and is qualified as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements at December 31, 2024 or 2023. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

4. **Information Certified by the Trustees**

The Plan's investments, related investment income and investment transactions, including net appreciation in fair value of investments, were certified by Principal, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan Administrator has determined that Principal meets the requirements of a qualified institution as defined by the United States Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Therefore, in accordance with the request of the Plan's Administrator and as permitted by CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, this information was not subjected to generally accepted auditing procedures by the Plan's independent public accountants. Notes receivable from participants were subject to audit procedures.

5. **Contract with Insurance Company**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract issued by Principal Life Insurance Company (PLIC). PLIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with the earnings on the underlying investments and is charged for participant withdrawals and certain administrative expenses charged by PLIC. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value, as reported to the Plan by PLIC. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and certain administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The contract is backed by PLIC's general account, which is invested in a diversified portfolio, consisting predominately of fixed income investments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semiannual basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the insurance company under the group annuity contract. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures, or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants is probable. In the event the Company elects to terminate the contract, the Company must provide a twelve month notice of its intent to terminate the contract.

6. **Fair Value Measurements**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Assets that are measured at fair value using the net asset value (NAV) per share practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust funds: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund, less its liabilities. The Plan has no unfunded commitments for those accounts and they can be redeemed daily at NAV.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the NAV of units of the separate account. The NAV, as provided by Principal Life Insurance Company, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the account less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. These units are not traded on a securities exchange but are redeemable only by the issuer. The rate of return varies based upon each fund's experience. These accounts do not distribute dividends or interest to the Plan, rather investment performance is reflected in the change in the unit value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the separate account, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the account in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. There are no unfunded commitments associated with the pooled separate accounts. Redemption is allowed on a daily basis with these investments.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

7. Party-in-Interest Transactions

A portion of the Plan's assets are invested in a group annuity contract managed by one of the trustees. This transaction qualifies as a party-in-interest transaction; however, it is exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA. A portion of the Plan's assets is also invested in pooled separate accounts and collective trusts managed by one of the trustees. Notes receivable from participants qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Certain direct administrative expenses charged to the Plan and paid to the trustees during 2024 and 2023 totaled \$58,880 and \$53,080, respectively.

8. Reconciliation to Form 5500

Notes receivable from participants are reflected as a receivable on the financial statements which is different from the Form 5500 presentation. On the Form 5500, notes receivable are classified as investments under the caption "participant loans."
