Opinion

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Inlandboatmen's Union Income Protection Benefit Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

A. General

The Plan provides supplemental unemployment benefits for eligible employees of Blue and Gold Fleet L.P. (the "Company") covered under the Deckhand Agreement with Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific, San Francisco Region, Marine Division, ILWU. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

B. Contributions

The Company contributes one-half percent of the covered employees' gross wages.

C. Benefits

The Plan provides a weekly benefit of \$200 to eligible participating employees of the Company who hold a current seniority date with the Company, are on a qualified layoff, are unemployed, are eligible to receive unemployment benefits from their state unemployment department, have not received unemployment benefits from another employer, have met the registration and reporting requirements of the state, and have made a benefit application in accordance with procedures established in the Plan. The Board of Trustees has the right to terminate or amend benefit provisions.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Benefits and Benefit Obligations

Benefits are recorded when paid. No benefits were paid during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan's benefits payable are based on actual payments issued subsequent to year-end, pertaining to benefits earned prior to year-end.

C. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

D. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the

accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investment bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTE 3 - INCOME TAX STATUS

No provision for federal or state income tax is made. The Plan has received tax-exempt status from the federal government under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(9) and the state of California under Revenue and Taxation Code Section 23701i. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820 provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The short-term fund, mutual and exchange traded funds and U.S. securities are valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the securities are traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Plan investments are exposed to various investment risks such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investments will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Board of Trustees has the right under the Plan to terminate the Trust agreement subject to the provisions of ERISA. Where the termination occurs as a result of a merger, any and all monies and assets remaining in the Trust, after payment of expenses, shall be transferred to the Trust with which the merger has been negotiated. With respect to any other termination, any and all monies and assets remaining in the Trust, after the payment of expenses, shall be used for the continuance of the benefits provided until such monies and assets

have been exhausted, unless some other disposition is required. In no event shall any of the remaining monies or assets be paid to or be recoverable by any participating employer, employee association, or labor organization.

NOTE 7 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through June 25, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosures in the financial statements.
