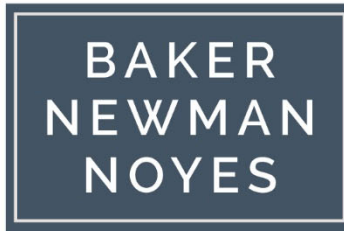

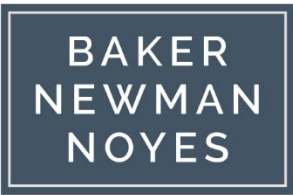

## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

The Plan Administrator and Participants  
Nappi Distributors, Inc. 401(k) Plan

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Nappi Distributors, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

### 1. Description of Plan

The following brief description of the Nappi Distributors, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of Nappi Distributors, Inc. (the Company). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after attaining age 18 and having completed one month of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

#### Contributions

Participants may make pre-tax and/or post-tax salary reduction contributions from 1% – 75% of their compensation up to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limit.

The Company matches 75% of the first 4% of compensation. The Company may also make discretionary contributions to the Plan; however, no such contributions were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan once the Plan's eligibility requirements are met. Participants are initially enrolled at 4% of their eligible compensation, unless the participant affirmatively elects not to participate or elects a different deferral rate.

#### Investment Options

Participants may elect to invest their contributions in any of the Plan's investment options. The options consist of various mutual funds as well as a collective trust fund. Employer contributions are invested in the same manner as the corresponding employee contributions.

#### Benefits

The Plan provides benefits to participants upon death, disability, retirement or termination of employment. Benefits will be paid to the participant in a lump-sum payment if the balance of the account is less than or equal to \$1,000. If the balance exceeds this amount, the participant may elect to receive the benefit in a lump-sum payment partial withdrawal (if terminated), an annuity, in installment payments or by transfer to another qualifying plan. Any distribution greater than \$1,000 that is made to a participant without the participant's consent before the normal retirement age will be rolled over into an individual retirement plan designated by the Plan Administrator. A participant who has incurred a separation from service may also elect to leave the monies in the Plan until they are required to begin receiving minimum annual distributions starting at age 73.

Participants are permitted to make hardship withdrawals from their accounts provided they meet certain criteria and the withdrawals are approved by the Plan Administrator. Participants whose employment has terminated can take partial withdrawals for any portion of their distributable vested interest in their account at any time.

### 1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Effective November 2024, the Plan adopted *SECURE 2.0 Act* provisions allowing penalty-free withdrawals of up to \$5,000 per child for qualified birth or adoption events, up to \$1,000 annually for emergency personal or family expenses, and up to \$22,000 for federally declared disasters. These distributions may be repaid within specified timeframes. Enhanced loan provisions and repayment flexibility are also available for disaster-affected participants.

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions. Participants vest in employer contributions over a five-year period beginning in the second year of service at a rate of 20% per year and are 100% vested after the fifth year of service.

#### Forfeitures

Forfeited nonvested accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses under the Plan at any time. Any forfeitures not used to pay administrative expenses under the Plan shall be applied to reduce employer contributions for the immediately following Plan Year. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions and to pay administrative expenses were not material for the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts included in net assets available for benefits were not material.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching and discretionary contributions, an allocation of Plan earnings and an allocation of administrative expenses. Plan earnings are allocated based upon participant account balances. Administrative expenses are allocated to participant accounts based on the participant's relative account balances.

#### Rollover Accounts

Employees may rollover into the Plan assets distributed as a vested interest upon their termination from a qualified defined benefit plan or qualified defined contribution plan in which they were formerly participants on or before the 60<sup>th</sup> day after the day that they received the distribution.

#### Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may also elect to borrow funds against their accounts. In no event shall the total of any such loan or loans to any participant, plus any prior loans unpaid, exceed the lesser of (a) 50% of the participant's vested account balance or (b) \$50,000. A participant may not request a loan of less than \$1,000 and may not have more than two outstanding loans at one time. No loan shall be for a term exceeding 5 years unless the loan proceeds are used to acquire a primary residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime rate plus 1% at the time the loan is established. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

### 1. **Description of Plan (Continued)**

#### *Termination of the Plan*

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA, as amended. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Upon termination of the Plan, the trustee, once notified by the Company of the termination date, will distribute to each participant their account balance on that date in accordance with the terms of the Plan.

### 2. **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

#### *Basis of Presentation*

The accrual basis of accounting is utilized for reporting purposes.

#### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (see Note 6 for further fair value information). Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income and dividends are recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### *Risks and Uncertainties*

The Plan provides for various investment options which in turn invest in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

#### *Contributions*

Contributions from participants are recorded in the year in which payroll deductions are made. Employer matching contributions are recorded in the same year as the corresponding participant contributions.

#### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

##### Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and becomes eligible for a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

##### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, to the extent they are not paid by the Company. Certain fees incurred by the Plan for investment management and certain administrative services are paid through revenue sharing rather than direct payment.

##### Subsequent Events

Events occurring after the statement of net assets available for benefits date are evaluated by management to determine whether such events should be recognized or disclosed in the financial statements. Management has evaluated subsequent events through July 2, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

#### 3. Tax Status

A qualifying plan is one for which the employer may currently deduct contributions on its income tax return, the employee is not currently taxed on the contribution, and the plan income is not taxable.

The Plan has adopted a preapproved defined contribution plan. The IRS has issued an opinion letter, dated June 30, 2020, that the preapproved plan is qualified as tax exempt under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan has been amended since the preapproved plan received the opinion letter. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Code.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by a plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### 4. **Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity), the trustee. Therefore, in addition to administrative fees, transactions involving the Plan's investments also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Net administrative fees paid by the Plan to Fidelity in 2024 and 2023 were \$14,938 and \$16,481, respectively. Additionally, notes receivable from Plan participants, the related interest income and transactions are also considered party-in-interest transactions.

#### 5. **Information Certified and Provided by Trustee**

The Plan's assets, including investments and notes receivable from participants, related investment income, and investment and notes receivable transactions, including net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest income on notes receivable from participants, were certified by Fidelity, the trustee, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan Administrator has determined that Fidelity meets the requirements of a qualified institution as defined by the United States Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Therefore, in accordance with the request of the Plan Administrator, and as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, this information was not subjected to generally accepted auditing procedures by the Plan's independent public accountants.

#### 6. **Fair Value Measurements**

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, has established a framework for measuring fair value that provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

**6. Fair Value Measurements (Continued)**

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the net asset value (based upon quoted market price) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

*Collective trust fund:* The units of the collective trust funds are valued using the net asset value practical expedient as determined by the issuer based on the current fair values of the underlying assets of the fund.

In accordance with Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2015-07, certain investments that are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. Therefore, there is no hierarchy required for the collective trust fund held by the Plan totaling \$1,011,101 and \$1,594,946 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
