Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Shelco, LLC 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Shelco, LLC, Shelco Holdings, LLC and Shelco Management Corporation (collectively, the "Company") who have completed at least six months of service and are age twenty-one or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ending December 31, 2024, all investment, contract, and loan balances were certified by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee. All entities (collectively the "certifying entities"), meet the definition of a qualified institution as defined in 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of eligible compensation, as pre-tax or Roth contributions as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. All participants have incremental increases of 1 percent each year until a participant has reached a deferral rate of 10 percent. Discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions may be contributed at the option of the Company's board of directors. There were no such contributions made during the year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are vested immediately in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contribution portions of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20 percent vested after two years of credited service, increasing 20 percent per year, with 100 percent vested after six years of credited service.

Notes receivable from participants:

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is two percent above prime rate, as defined by the Plan. At December 31, 2024, loan interest rates ranged from 5.25 percent to 10.25 percent. Principal and Interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits:

On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or the installment options as provided by the Plan. Hardship distributions are permitted upon demonstration of financial hardship. All fully vested balances are available for distribution after the participant reaches the age of 59½.

Forfeited accounts:

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$168 and \$330, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions or pay Plan expenses.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Contributions:

Contributions from Plan participants and any Company contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, Continued

Investment valuation and income recognition, continued:

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and other distributions to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Through February 28, 2024, investment related expenses were included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Effective March 1, 2024 the Plan implemented a fee levelization approach to allocate administrative expenses among participants. Under this method, revenue sharing payments received from investment providers are credited back to the participants accounts, and a uniform direct fee is assessed to cover plan administrative costs.

Revenue sharing:

Revenue sharing provides a way to use a portion of a plan's investment fees to pay for plan services, such as recordkeeping or administrative costs. The revenue sharing amounts have been recorded in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits as a reduction in administrative expenses.

Subsequent events:

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 1, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Recently issued accounting pronouncements:

Accounting standards that have been issued or proposed by the Financial Accounting Standards Board or other standards-setting bodies are not expected to have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust funds and pooled separate accounts: Valued at NAV. The NAV, as provided by the certifying entities, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust funds, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Note 5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan invests in a guaranteed interest account via a group annuity contract, which is a type of guaranteed investment contract, with Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company ("MassMutual") totaling \$711,583 2024 and \$3,134,744 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. MassMutual maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administration expenses.

The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0.00 percent. Crediting rates in 2024 ranged from 2.90 percent to 3.55 percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a triannual basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit MassMutual to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by MassMutual, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents including complete or partial termination or merger with another plan, (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Such events include the following: (a) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (c) a material misrepresentation, or (d) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

Note 6. Related-Party and Party in Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by affiliates of Empower Trust Company, LLC. Empower Trust Company, LLC, is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment and administrative expenses, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. As described in Note 2, the Plan made direct payments to the trustee totaling \$42,773 which were not covered by revenue sharing. The Company pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

Note 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their Company discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions.

Note 8. Tax Status

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated April 7, 2021, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Note 8. Tax Status, Continued

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the 2024 statement of net assets available for benefits.
