Notes to the Financial Statements

Note 1 - Plan Description:

The following brief description of Crystal Springs Uplands School Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 403(b) plan that was established in September 1, 1972, and restated effective July 1, 2016. The Plan is sponsored by Crystal Springs Uplands School (the School), a private, nonprofit educational institution. The Plan was established to provide benefits to eligible employees as defined in the Plan document. The Plan invests in variable and fixed annuity contracts, mutual funds, and a pooled separate account. The Plan approved vendor is TIAA and CREF, (the Custodians). CREF serves as the issuer of the CREF variable annuities under the Plan and TIAA serves as the issuer of the TIAA Traditional Annuity contracts held by the Plan and is the recordkeeper of the TIAA and CREF assets. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Effective January 1, 2019, the Plan was restated to take advantage of the remedial adoption period at January 1, 2010 and to comply with TIAA's ERISA 403(b) volume submitter plan adoption agreement. A favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service was issued on August 7, 2017 regarding the qualified status of the volume submitter plan on which the terms of the restated Plan are based. There was no significant change in plan provisions.

On March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act") was enacted and signed into law. The CARES Act provided plan sponsors the ability to offer participants penalty-free distributions up to \$100,000, increased loan limits and deferment of loan payments. The CARES Act also temporarily waived required minimum distributions for terminated participants in calendar year 2020. The Plan has implemented these provisions and intends to formally execute the required plan amendments reflecting their implementation by the last day of the plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2022. Written amendments to the Plan to reflect these operational changes will be adopted at a later date in accordance with applicable law and Internal Revenue Service (IRS) guidance.

Effective July 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to redefine the definition of eligible compensation to calculate employer contributions. As of July 1, 2021, all stipends are now eligible with the exception of stipends paid to athletic coaches.

The Plan adopted various provisions of the SECURE Act 2.0 that was signed into law on December 29, 2022. Effective March 15, 2024, the dollar limit for mandatory distributions was increased to \$7,000 from \$5,000. Written amendments to the Plan to reflect these operational changes will be adopted at a later date in accordance with applicable law and Internal Revenue Service guidance.

Effective January 1, 2025, qualified organization catch up deferrals are no longer permitted. In addition, the plan is amended to revise the vesting schedule for nonelective employer contributions from five-year graded vesting schedule to 100% vesting upon completion of one year of service.

Eligibility

All employees are eligible to participate in the Plan, if they are not one of the excluded classes as defined in the Plan document. Eligible employees may participate immediately upon satisfying the Plan's eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Eligible employees may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, not to exceed the amount allowable under current income tax regulations. Participants may designate all or a portion of their elective deferral contributions as Roth contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. In addition, employees that have worked at least fifteen years for the School may make a special catch-up contribution as described in the plan document. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The School contributes 5% of compensation for years of service less than or equal to 5 years and 10% of compensation for 5 years and above.

Participant Accounts

The Plan's assets are held in separate funds with TIAA and CREF. Each participant's account is credited with the allocation of the employee contribution, allocation of the School's contributions and Plan earnings or losses thereon. Allocations are based on participant account balances, as defined.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, and rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. The portion attributable to employer contributions has a vesting schedule based upon completed years of service over a five-year period at 20% per year.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant's account that is lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and will be applied to pay Plan expenses or reduce any nonelective contributions. Forfeited accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$23,893 and \$24,226, respectively. Forfeitures utilized in 2024 to reduce nonelective contributions amounted to approximately \$56,160. In 2024 and 2023, there were inconsistencies noted with the participants' vesting percentage and forfeitures. The forfeitures within the Plan will be used to correct the matter.

Participant Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their account balance in a variety of investment choices as more fully described in the Plan's literature. Participants may change their investment options as allowed by their contracts throughout the year via TIAA's telephone system or internet website.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows participants to borrow from their account's unmatched pre-tax elective deferrals or rollovers from other plans a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested portion of their account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and the annual interest rate is fixed for the duration of the loan per the Plan Loan Policy. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates on outstanding loans are between 5.00% and 9.50% per annum.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions and withdrawals are payable upon retirement, termination, financial hardship, disability or death. A participant shall receive a distribution which may take the form of a lump sum, installment payments, or annuity contract in the amount equal to the value of the participant's account.

The Plan provides for hardship withdrawals of the participant's elective deferrals, in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC, not to exceed a participant's actual contributions to the Plan and must result from an immediate and qualifying financial need of the participant or beneficiary of the participant as determined on a non-discriminatory basis by the Plan Administrator.

There were no participant requests to withdraw from the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 that had not been paid out as of those dates.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the nonelective contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the related participant compensation is earned.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments of the Plan are held by the Custodians and invested based solely upon instructions received from participants. The Plan's investments are reported at fair value as of the last day of the Plan year, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (Note 5) which are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Retirement Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies, utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, the issuer and/or Custodians of the Plan. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net appreciation (depreciation) of investments in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits includes both the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in the aggregate fair value of investments and realized gains and losses on sale of investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The market volatility of equity-based investments may substantially impact the value of such investments at any given time. It is likely that the value of the Plan's investments, both in total and in individual participant accounts, has fluctuated since December 31, 2024.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction to net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at the unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the School. Expenses that are paid by the School are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Revenue Sharing

The Plan recognizes the income from revenue sharing agreements when received. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan received \$26,856 and \$24,357, respectively, of revenue sharing income utilized for plan expenses and included as administrative expenses in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events from December 31, 2024 through June 27, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that, except as disclosed in Note 1, there were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.

Note 3 - Certified Information:

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and other income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by TIAA and CREF (the Custodians of the Plan).

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements:

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Variable annuity contracts: valued based on the net asset values of underlying securities held by the contract at year end, which are generally valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources that may employ various pricing methods to value the investments, including matrix pricing.

The CREF Accounts are valued at the daily unit value published on NASDAQ. The funds are not traded on this exchange. The value of the unit holder's investment rises and falls with the return on the underlying assets in the account. The CREF variable annuity accounts consist of eight investment portfolios: the Stock, Global Equities, Growth, Equity Index, Bond Market, Inflation-Linked Bond, Social Choice, and Money Market accounts.

The Plan may redeem units at fair value on any day the New York Stock Exchange is open for business. Participants cannot redeem units from the CREF portfolios (with the exception of the Money Market account) for 90 days if a purchase, sale, and/or repurchase is made within that account within a 60-day period.

The TIAA Access variable annuity accounts are funded through a separate investment account of TIAA registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940, which invests in proprietary and non-proprietary mutual funds through various sub-accounts. Sub-account unit values are calculated daily. The TIAA Access variable annuity accounts are valued based on the net asset values of underlying securities held by the contract at year end, which are generally valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources that may employ various pricing methods to value the investments including matrix pricing.

Mutual funds: valued at daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate account: the Real Estate Account is a pooled separate account in which daily unit values are published on NASDAQ. The fund is not traded on this exchange. The value of the unit holder's investment rises and falls with the return on the underlying assets in the account. Redemptions are permitted daily except participant transfers out of the fund, which are limited to one per calendar quarter.

Fixed annuity contracts: the TIAA Traditional Annuity Contracts, which are non-benefit-responsive, have been presented at contract value, which approximates fair value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA. This determination is based on TIAA's credit rating and yield during 2024 and 2023 being comparable to similar alternative investments and the interest rate which re-sets annually being comparable to a ten-year treasury bond. In subsequent periods, if market conditions change, such as the insurance company credit rating or interest rate environment, the difference between contract value and fair value could become significant. There may be certain liquidity restrictions on redemption.

The following tables set forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

- (a) This category is primarily comprised of the TIAA Access Nuveen International Equity fund, TIAA Access Large-Cap Value fund, and the TIAA Access Nuveen Life Cycle 2035 fund.

The TIAA Access Nuveen International Equity fund seeks a favorable long-term total return, mainly through capital appreciation, primarily from equity securities of foreign issuers. The fund normally invests at least 80% of its assets in equity securities of foreign issuers and has a policy of maintaining investments in at least three countries other than the United States. The Fund may invest in stocks of smaller companies and in emerging market securities depending on the prevalence of opportunities.

The TIAA Access Nuveen Large-Cap Value fund seeks a favorable long-term total return, mainly through capital appreciation, primarily from equity securities of large domestic companies. The fund normally invests at least 80% of its assets in large-cap equity securities that the fund's management team believes are undervalued based on an evaluation of their potential worth. The fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in foreign securities.

The TIAA Access Nuveen Life Cycle 2035 fund seeks high total return over time through a combination of capital appreciation and income. Each of the Lifecycle Funds is designed to provide a single diversified portfolio managed with a target retirement date in mind. The target date is the approximate date when investors expect to begin withdrawing money from the funds. Each portfolio invests in several underlying equity, fixed-income and direct real estate funds.

Note 5 - Fully Benefit-Responsive Contracts:

The Plan has traditional investment contracts and a Stable Value fund with TIAA. The traditional investment contracts are sub-contracts, representing both fully benefit-responsive and non-benefit-responsive contracts. For investment contracts that are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the traditional investment contract because it is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transaction under the terms of the Plan. These contracts are included in the financial statements at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts totaled \$2,445,566 at December 31, 2024, which consisted of \$1,824,366 in TIAA Traditional fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and \$621,200 of TIAA Stable Value fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. At December 31, 2023, fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that totaled \$2,406,617, which consisted of \$1,861,011 in TIAA Traditional fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and \$545,606 of TIAA Stable Value fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

The traditional investment contracts held by the Plan are guaranteed investment contracts held in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Each premium allocated to the fixed annuity investment contract buys a guaranteed minimum amount of lifetime income based on the rate schedule in effect at the time the premium is credited. The average yield earned by the Plan is adjusted to reflect the actual interest rate credited to participants calculated by dividing the annualized earnings credited to participants for all fully benefit-responsive investment contracts by the fair value of all fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 3%. Such interest rates are reviewed and re-set by TIAA on an annual basis. The TIAA contract also offers the opportunity for additional amounts in excess of the guaranteed rate. When declared, additional amounts remain in effect for the 12-month period that begins each March 1.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

The contracts do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events may be different under each contract and include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, and (5) premature termination of the contract.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

Participants are permitted to transfer funds between their CREF accounts and into their TIAA Retirement Annuity at any time. However, transfers out of the TIAA annuity into any CREF account by an active participant can only be made through a Transfer Payout Annuity (TPA), which provides for the transfer of funds in substantially equal installments over a period of ten years.

Note 6 - Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions:

Certain Plan investments are managed by either the Custodians or affiliates of the Custodians of the Plan. Such arrangements, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the School. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Certain other administrative expenses are paid directly by the School.

Note 7 - Plan Termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the School has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer matching contribution.

Note 8 - Income Tax Status:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan designed to qualify as a tax-exempt plan under the Code. The Plan adopted a standardized form of the simplified ERISA 403(b) volume submitter plan sponsored by TIAA. A favorable opinion letter from the IRS was issued on August 7, 2017 regarding the qualified status of the volume submitter 403(b) plan on which the terms of the Plan are based. The Plan has been amended since the volume submitter plan received its opinion letter and qualified status under the Code. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Code. Accordingly, no provision for federal and state income taxes has been made.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that is more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements.

Note 9 - Risks and Uncertainties:

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of the investments offered by the Plan. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the nature of risks associated with investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the level of risk in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, approximately 82% and 84%, respectively, of the Plan's investments are held with TIAA and CREF. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, 9% and 11%, respectively, of the Plan's investments are held in one account with the Custodian as noted below. This is considered to be a concentration of credit risk.
