Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Carroll Daniel Construction Company Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended September 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended September 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

Basis for Opinion

Notes To Financial Statements

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Carroll Daniel Construction Company (the "Company") Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Company established the Plan effective October 1, 1984. Certain provisions of the Plan were restated and amended effective May 12, 2022. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Company who have one month of service and are age 18 or older. Enrollment is allowed on the first day of the month subsequent to the above conditions being met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions

Participants may contribute pretax and Roth salary deferral contributions to the Plan up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document. Participants age 50 and older may also make catch-up contributions. Participant contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Each payroll period, the Company makes a discretionary matching contribution equal to (1) 100% of participant contributions, up to 3% of compensation, and (2) 50% of participant contributions exceeding 3% of compensation, up to 7% of compensation.

The Company may contribute a discretionary profit sharing amount to the Plan, as determined by the Company's Board of Directors. The Company did not contribute a discretionary profit-sharing amount for 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contribution, if any, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, the Company's discretionary match contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Company discretionary profit-sharing contributions vest according to the following schedule:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
Less than 2 years	0%
2 years	20%
3 years	40%
4 years	60%
5 years	80%
6 or more years	100%

Participants must be credited with a minimum of 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year to complete a year of service for vesting purposes.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. Interest rates range from 3.25% to 8.50% for notes receivable outstanding at September 30, 2024. Principal and interest payments occur ratably through regular payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the note receivable was used to purchase a primary residence in which case the note receivable term may not exceed ten years.

Payment of Benefits

In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of a participant's vested account balance may be made by a participant after reaching the pre-retirement age of 59½ or at the early retirement age of 55 and six years of vesting service. In the event of a participant's heavy and immediate financial hardship, as defined in the Plan document, a participant may withdraw up to 100% of cumulative pre-tax contributions and rollover contribution account balances, exclusive of certain earnings on pre-tax contributions. Upon normal retirement, termination of employment, disability, or death, participants may receive the value of their vested account by lump-sum, installments, or a combination of both.

Plan Expenses

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan as provided in the Plan document. Certain other administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company. Investment fees are paid by the Plan in the form of reductions of net investment income earned by the Plan participant.

NOTE 2.**SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES****Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan were prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. The Plan follows accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB"). The FASB sets generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of September 30, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully-benefit responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions Income Recognition

The Plan records employer and employee contributions receivable when compensation is paid, and deferrals are withheld. The Plan adopted ASC 326, Financial Instruments - Credit Losses, effective October 1, 2023, using the modified retrospective method. In accordance with ASC 326, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded at September 30, 2024, as employer and employee contributions receivable have never historically incurred losses and current conditions and supportable forecasts show zero risk of nonpayment.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Subsequent Events

Management has reviewed subsequent events through June 30, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. INVESTMENTS CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Life Insurance Company ("Principal"), the custodian of the Plan, has provided certifications that the financial information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended September 30, 2024 provided to the Plan is complete and accurate. The information as to investment assets and transactions therein, and investment income included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended September 30, 2024 is covered by such certifications and has not been audited by independent auditors.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs in which little or no market data exists (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under GAAP are as follows:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement

Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets, or liabilities.

Level 2 - Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly.

Level 3 - Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Basis of Fair Value Measurement (Continued)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts and Mutual Funds

The Plan holds a group annuity contract (the "Contract") issued by Principal. The Contract allows the Plan to invest in mutual funds and pooled separate accounts ("PSA") which operate similarly to a mutual fund at the investment level and are invested in assets that match the investment objectives of the separate accounts. The Plan's interest in PSAs is evidenced by units of account. Units of each PSA are stated at fair value. The value of units held in PSAs is based on quoted market prices of the underlying investments and is based on the net asset value ("NAV") of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Guaranteed Interest Account

The non-fully benefit responsive ("NFBR") fixed annuity contract, composed entirely of the Principal Guaranteed Interest Account, is reported at contract value, which approximates fair value. Fair value is determined using a discounted cash flow model. The contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contract, less withdrawals. The Principal Guaranteed Interest Account is not available for sale or transfer on any securities exchange.

Total Plan investment assets at fair value classified within Level 3 were \$- and \$4,545 as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively, which consists of the Guaranteed Interest Account NFBR. Such amounts were approximately 0% and 1% of total investments at fair value as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

In estimating fair value of the investments in Level 3, those charged with governance use a third-party pricing source. In substantiating the reasonableness of the pricing data provided by third parties, those charged with governance evaluate a variety of factors including review of methods and assumptions used by external sources, recently executed transactions, existing contracts, economic conditions, industry and market developments, and overall credit ratings.

NOTE 5. GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH PRINCIPAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

The Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option is a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company totaling \$453,311 and \$373,964 at September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Principal maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit Principal to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the Contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan); (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA; or (5) premature termination of the Contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan investments are managed by the certifying entity of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants are also defined by ERISA as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 8. TAX STATUS

The Plan is based on the Principal Financial Group Prototype Basic Savings Plan which received a favorable rating from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Prototype Plan was designed in accordance with the provisions of the IRC. Accordingly, the Plan's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Company believes that the Plan continues to qualify and to operate as designed.

NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan provides for various investment options. These investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, prepayment, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near-term could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for Plan benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for Plan benefits.
