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Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the PEI/Genesis, Inc. Tax Deferral and Savings Plan (“the Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan was established as a profit-sharing plan in 1956 and was restated in 1998 to include a 401(k) provision. The Plan was most recently restated in July 2015. The Plan is sponsored by PEI/Genesis, Inc. (“the Company”).

Employees are eligible to become a Plan participant on the entry date coincident with or next following the date on which he/she attains the age of 21.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (“ERISA”) as amended.

Effective January 1, 2017, all employees of related employer, FilConn, Inc., who met eligibility requirements were eligible to become Plan participants. Effective February 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to include the related employer, Testco, LLC, as participating in the Plan after the Plan Sponsor, PEI Genesis, acquired this subsidiary.

Contributions

Participants may elect to defer on a pre-tax basis up to 50% of their regular annual compensation, and up to 100% of bonus compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make after-tax contributions. Total deferrals in any taxable year may not exceed a dollar limit, which is determined by the Internal Revenue Service each year. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans which are reflected as rollovers in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a common/collective trust as investment options for participants.

The Plan automatically enrolls any new employee who is eligible to participate in the Plan, and who does not affirmatively elect to make or not make contributions, at a deferral rate of 1% of the employee’s eligible compensation. The contribution will also automatically increase by 1% each year, up to a maximum of 6% for all employees who do not affirmatively elect otherwise.

Company contributions are made at the discretion of the board of directors (board) of PEI/Genesis, Inc. Amounts contributed are allocated using a formula as follows:

- a. A profit-sharing contribution allocated pro rata to each participant who has been credited with at least 1,000 hours of service for the year and is employed on the last day of the Plan year based on the relationship of eligible compensation to the total eligible compensation of all participants. This discretionary amount shall be designated by the Company. No profit-sharing contribution was made for the 2024 plan year.
- b. A Company matching contribution, if any, is determined by the board of the Company prior to the end of each Plan year. Participants credited with at least 501 hours of service for the year and employed on the last day of the plan year are eligible to receive matching contributions. For the plan year 2024, the Company matched participant contributions based on a formula applied to each qualifying participant’s first \$3,000 of elective deferrals up to a total matching contribution of \$1,000. The Company matched 75% of each participant’s first \$500 of elective deferrals and 25% of each participant’s elective deferrals between \$500 and \$3,000.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching contribution, the Company's profit-sharing contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings and losses which are credited or charged on a daily basis based on the specific funds in which the accounts are invested. Participant accounts are also charged with an allocation of Plan administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

All participants are fully vested with respect to their own contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Effective March 3, 2014, Company matching contributions vest as follows:

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of non-vested Company contributions are first used to pay administrative expenses, then to reduce future employer contributions. Unallocated forfeitures as of August 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$27,545 and \$162,773, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan has a loan provision which allows participants to borrow amounts with a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. These loans are subject to current interest rates at the time of application considering the purpose of the loan and the rate being charged by representative commercial banks in the local area for a similar loan. Each participant cannot have more than two loans outstanding at any point in time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions for a period of five years, unless the loan is for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the loan period may extend to ten years.

Distributions

Distributions from the Plan are permitted under the following circumstances: (i) death or disability of the participant, (ii) termination of employment, (iii) attainment of normal retirement age (65), or (iv) defined hardship.

Distributions of a participant's account under the Plan can be made in the form of:

- Lump-sum payment
- Life annuity
- Installment payments
- Joint and survivor annuity

On March 27, 2020, the "*Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act*" (CARES) was signed into law. The CARES Act includes several relief provisions available to the Plan and its participants. Plan management has evaluated the relief provisions available to plan participants under the CARES Act and has implemented the following provisions:

- Special coronavirus distributions up to \$100,000. Such distributions must be processed and distributed by December 31, 2020 under current law, unless that date is extended.

Plan management intends to formally amend the Plan for this relief provision no later than December 31, 2025.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of the Plan's income and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options, which are exposed to various risks, including interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of these investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Valuation of Investments

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Interest is included in income when earned, based on the terms of the investments and the periods during which the investments are owned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. The Plan presents, in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, the net change in the fair value of its investments which consists of the realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation or depreciation on those investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The Plan does not maintain any insurance contracts or other investments that are excluded from Plan assets.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of August 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company as provided by the Plan document.

Subsequent Events

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through June 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

Financial accounting standards establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

- Registered investment companies: Shares are valued using quoted market prices in an active market.
- Pooled separate account: Shares are valued at the net asset value of the underlying assets, which represent the net asset value of units held by the pooled separate accounts. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. There are no participant redemption restrictions.
- Common collective trusts: Composed of units of underlying trusts which primarily are composed of fully-benefit responsive investment contracts and are valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of units of the underlying trust. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. There are no participant redemption restrictions.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at August 31, 2024 and 2023. The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any interest in doing so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Company shall make no further contributions after the termination of the Plan. In the event of Plan termination, amounts credited to the participants' accounts as of the date of termination will be fully vested.

Note 6. Party-In-Interest Transactions

At August 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan invested in shares of investments managed by Fidelity Advisor, an affiliate of the trustee of the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

For the year ended August 31, 2024, administrative fees of \$77,282 were incurred by the Plan, of which \$48,646 was paid to the trustee. Certain other administrative fees were paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Plan operates under a nonstandardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and trust/custodial document sponsored by FMR, LLC. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency. The Plan has not obtained or requested a determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.
