We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Michigan Millers Mutual Insurance Company Employee 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Michigan Millers Mutual Insurance Company Employee 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Michigan Millers Mutual Insurance Company Employee 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a contributory, defined contribution plan with a 401(k) elective deferral arrangement, which covers substantially all employees of Michigan Millers Mutual Insurance Company (Company) who meet the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was amended effective January 1, 2024 and 2025, with minor revisions to the Plan provisions, as indicated below.

Eligibility

Employees that are age 21 and over are eligible to participate in the Plan after 30 days of service. Leased employees are excluded from the Plan. Effective January 1, 2024, eligible participants are automatically enrolled upon hire to contribute 6% of eligible compensation during the first year, increasing by 1% annually up to the maximum automatic rate of 10%. Prior to January 1, 2024, the initial automatic contribution rate was 5%. Effective January 1, 2025, non-resident alien employees, employees represented by a collective bargaining class, reclassified employees, part-time, temporary, and seasonal employees are also excluded from the Plan.

Contributions

The Plan allows participants to defer up to a maximum of 90% of their compensation, not to exceed the maximum contribution allowable by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) adjusted annually for cost-of-living changes. There is no minimum elective deferral limit for the Plan. Rollover contributions are allowed by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions. Effective January 1, 2024, the Company contributes matching contributions of 100% of employee deferrals, up to 6% of compensation. Prior to January 1, 2024, the Company contributed employer safe harbor matching contributions of the first 3% of the participant's compensation, plus 50% of deferrals over 3%, not to exceed 5% of the participant's compensation. Discretionary employer contributions are at the discretion of the Company. No discretionary contributions were made in 2024 or 2023.

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The participant has the responsibility to decide how his or her contribution will be invested. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are 100% vested in safe harbor matching contributions after attaining two or more years of service.

Payment of Benefits

Plan participants are eligible to receive distributions upon reaching retirement age of 62 or, if terminated, early retirement age of 55. Participants are eligible to make in-service withdrawals upon reaching age 59 ½. Hardship withdrawals are allowed to pay certain qualifying expenses as defined in the Plan document. In addition, upon separation of employment, because of death, disability, or for other reasons, participants receive their benefits as a lump-sum payment or a fixed period and fixed payment installment option.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of employer contributions shall be used to reduce the employer's matching contributions or reduce administrative expenses under the Plan. Forfeitures that have not been used to reduce employer contributions or pay administrative expenses are allocated to participants as defined by the Plan document. As of December 31, 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$145 (\$0 as of December 31, 2023). During 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$8,787 from forfeited nonvested accounts (\$7,865 in 2023).

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses were paid for by the Company. Additionally, certain administrative expenses were paid by the Plan and are reflected in the accompanying financial statements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are permitted to borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000. Such loans are secured by the balance of the participant's account and shall be charged an annual prevailing rate of interest to be fixed by the Plan administrators. Such loans shall be fully repaid on or before five years from the date of disbursement, unless the loan is used to buy a principal residence. Loans used to buy a principal residence shall be fully repaid on or before fifteen years from the date of disbursement.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon terms in the Plan's loan policy.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through June 25, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrators to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan utilizes valuation techniques that maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Based on the observability of the inputs used in the valuation techniques, the Plan is required to provide information according to the fair value hierarchy. The fair value hierarchy ranks the quality and reliability of the information used to determine fair values.

Financial assets and liabilities carried at fair value will be classified and disclosed in one of the following three categories:

Level 1 – Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the entity has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2 – Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 – Significant unobservable inputs that reflect an entity's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

In determining the appropriate levels, the Plan performs a detailed analysis of the assets and liabilities. At each reporting period, all assets and liabilities for which the fair value measurement is based on significant unobservable inputs are classified as Level 3.

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the application of valuation techniques applied to similar assets and liabilities has been consistent.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair market value, except the guaranteed investment contract, which is valued at contract value. Shares of mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices in an active market, which represent the value of shares held by the Plan at year end. The pooled separate accounts and common collective trusts are valued at fair value based on the net asset value (NAV), as reported by the trustee. The NAV is based on the fair value of securities held by the investment. Certain investments include restrictions on the number of transfers allowed in a specified time period. See Note 4 and 5 for details on the guaranteed investment contract and fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (continued)

The change in aggregate fair value and the cost of investments purchased, sold, and held is reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits as net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. Financial Data Certified by the Trustee – Unaudited

The Plan's financial information and data was certified by Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (Principal) in accordance with Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the investment balances, notes receivable from participants balances, interest, dividends, interest income on participant notes receivable, and net appreciation in fair value of investments included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule were obtained from data that has been prepared and certified as complete and accurate by Principal, the trustee. This certified information has not been audited by independent auditors.

4. Guaranteed Investment Contract with Principal Life Insurance Company

The Plan has entered into a traditional benefit-responsive investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company, the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option. The contributions to the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option are maintained in group annuity contracts. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by the Trustee. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

A plan liquidation or initiated transfer of the interest in the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option will be subject to either a 12-month advance notice or a 5% surrender charge, whichever the Plan Administrator chooses. Notification of a Plan's intent to terminate its interest may be revoked within 90 days of receipt of such notice, after which time, the notice becomes irrevocable.

4. Guaranteed Investment Contract with Principal Life Insurance Company (continued)

A 5% surrender charge will also apply if the cumulative participant transfers from the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option exceeds \$50,000 and 25% of the Plan's interest in the contract during the 12-month period immediately preceding the Plan sponsor-level surrender of the Plan's interest in the contract. If this scenario occurs, the surrender charge will be billed to the Plan sponsor. Management noted the occurrence of each of these events is not probable.

There are not any events that allow the Principal Life Insurance Company to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at amounts that differ from contract value; however, the Principal Life Insurance Company can freeze the contract by declaring a contribution cessation date. There are no unfunded commitments related to the investment contract.

There are no reserves established to offset contract value for credit risk. The contract interest rates are reviewed on a semiannual basis. The approximate average yield and minimum crediting interest rate are as follows:

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. At termination, participant accounts would become fully vested.

7. Income Tax Status

The Plan utilizes a non-standardized form of a prototype plan through Principal. The prototype plan obtained its latest opinion letter as of June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Although the Plan has been amended and restated since the date of the opinion letter, the Plan administrators believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Accordingly, no provision for income tax is included in the accompanying financial statements.

Generally, tax years 2021 through current year remain open to examination. The Plan does not believe that the results from any examination of these open years would have a material adverse effect on the Plan.

8. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain investments are managed by Principal (the Plan's trustee and recordkeeper) or affiliates of Principal, therefore, qualifying as a party-in-interest. Fees of \$28,792 were paid to Principal during 2024 (\$22,376 during 2023). Equanimity Wealth Management, SageView Advisory Group, and Morningstar Investment Management, LLC are also parties-in-interest as they serve as advisors to the Plan. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company and its affiliated entity Western National Mutual Insurance Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Notes receivable from participants are also considered party-in-interest transactions.

9. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. These investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and long-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
