We have audited the financial statements of Kyruus, Inc. Employee Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) for the period ended September 30, 2024, and we have issued our report thereon dated July 11, 2025. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (“investment information”) by Fidelity Management Trust Company, (the “qualified institution”), which is a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, that prepared and certified the statements or information regarding assets so held in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles general accepted in the United States of America. (“U.S. GAAP”). Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our letter to you dated March 10, 2025. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

## **SIGNIFICANT AUDIT FINDINGS**

### **Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices**

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted, and the application of existing policies was not changed during the period ended September 30, 2024. We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management’s knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statements was:

Management’s estimate of the Plan’s investment input levels under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*. ASC 820 requires the Plan to assess and disclose in the financial statements the level of input for each Plan investment. We evaluated the key factors and assumptions used to develop the assessments in determining it is reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

Certain financial statement disclosures are particularly sensitive because of their significance to financial statement users. The most sensitive disclosures affecting the financial statements were:

Disclosure in Note 3 regarding information certified by the qualified institution which the Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements.

The disclosure of fair value measurements in Note 4 to the financial statements, which describes the valuation techniques used to measure each classification of the investments.

The disclosure of related party and party-in-interest transactions in Note 6 which describes the relationship between the Plan and its third-party service providers.

The disclosure of plan termination in Note 8 which describes the Plan termination and transfer of all assets from the Plan to a multiple employer plan.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

**Form 5500 Procedures**

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditor's report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

**Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit**

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

**Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements**

Professional standards require us to accumulate all misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. There were no corrected or uncorrected misstatements were noted during the audit.

**Reportable Findings**

For purposes of this letter, a reportable finding is a matter that includes one or more of the following: (1) noncompliance or suspected noncompliance with laws and regulations, (2) a finding that in our professional judgment is significant and relevant to you regarding your responsibility to oversee the financial reporting process, and (3) an indication of internal control deficiencies identified during the audit that have not been previously communicated to management by other parties and that we determined are sufficiently important to merit management's attention.

**Internal Control Communications**

In planning and performing our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit we considered the Plan's system of internal control over financial reporting ("internal control") as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of issuing our report on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control, nor did we include a consideration of internal control relating to the investment information.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and, therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. However, as discussed below, we identified a certain reportable finding that we consider to be a deficiency in internal controls.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Plan's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses.

We consider the following reportable finding to be a deficiency in the Plan's internal controls:

During our audit, we identified an instance where one participant elected to decrease their deferral threshold in a prior year, and the change had not been made by the Plan administrator. As such, an excess \$450 was withheld from payroll and remitted to the Plan. We recommend management investigate the root cause of this discrepancy and establish controls to ensure that all employee deferral elections and changes are accurately and promptly reflected in the payroll system. These controls should include procedures to obtain and review a report of all deferral elections and changes during each payroll cycle, confirming that updates are made in accordance with the timing requirements outlined in the Plan's adoption agreement.

#### **Disagreements with Management**

For purposes of this letter, a disagreement with management is a disagreement on a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

#### **Management Representations**

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated July 11, 2025.

#### **Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants**

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Plan's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

#### **Other Audit Findings or Issues**

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Plan's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention.

This information is intended solely for the use of the trustees, Plan administrator, and management of the Plan and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than these specified parties.

Employee Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended September 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Kyruus, Inc. Employee Retirement Savings Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the period ended September 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements**

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements* section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Basis for Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements**

### **Emphasis of Matter—Plan Termination**

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Plan Administrator and Trustee of the Plan terminated the Plan and transferred the assets to a multiemployer plan on September 30, 2024. Plan assets were transferred directly to the multiemployer plan. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements**

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and, therefore, is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the 2024 financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

### **Auditor's Report on the 2023 Financial Statements**

The financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023, were audited by other auditors. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated October 9, 2024, indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedules, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were presented, in all material respects, in conformity with DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determines meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

SEPTEMBER 30, 2024 AND DECEMBER 31, 2023

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### Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following description of Kyruus, Inc. Employee Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. A more complete description of the Plan's provisions is in the Plan document.

*General* – The Plan is a qualified defined contribution plan with a cash deferral arrangement covering all eligible employees (“participants”) of Kyruus, Inc. (the “Company”). The Plan was established on January 1, 2013 and terminated September 30, 2024. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Participants are offered a selection of mutual funds for the placement of their contributions (“participant-directed”). The determination of the participant-directed funds made available to participants is made by the Plan's administrator.

Effective December 18, 2023, the Plan was amended to add eligibility requirements for interns to participate in the Plan including reaching age 21 and completing 1,000 hours of service, change the matching employer contribution vesting from a four year schedule to 100% immediate vesting, and to amend the definition of compensation to exclude the value of restricted stock or stock option grants, holiday bonuses, specialty bonuses and project bonuses and to include all other bonuses not explicitly excluded.

Effective September 30, 2024, the Company terminated the Plan and transferred all assets from the Plan to a multiemployer Plan. See Note 8.

*Eligibility* – Employees of the Company, as defined by the Plan, are eligible to participate and may begin salary deferrals immediately. Participants become eligible for matching employer contributions when they make deferral contributions to the Plan.

*Contributions* – Participants may elect to defer up to one hundred percent of their annual compensation as defined in the Plan, subject to limits set by the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Participants that have met requirement age of 50 or older may elect to defer additional amounts as catch-up contributions, subject to limits set by the IRC. Participants may also contribute distributions from other qualified retirement plans.

The Company may make matching contributions and non-elective contributions as permitted by the Plan at the discretion of the Company. The Company made matching contributions of \$464,847 to the Plan during the period ended September 30, 2024. The Company did not make non-elective contributions during the period ended September 30, 2024.

*Notes Receivable From Participants* – Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested balance of their account subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any given time. Loans are to be repaid within five years, unless the loan is for a primary residence. Loans are secured by the remaining vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are repaid through after-tax payroll deductions on a semi-monthly basis.

*Vesting* – Participants are fully vested in their deferral contributions, rollover contributions, and any earnings thereon. Vesting of employer matching contributions and non-elective contributions and earnings is achieved through a four-year formula based on whole years of continuous service and date of hire using the elapsed time method. Effective December 18, 2023, any new employer matching contributions are immediately vested.

*Forfeitures* – Contributions made by the Company which are not vested at the time employees cease to be participants in the Plan may first be used to pay any administrative expenses, then to reduce future contributions by the Company. As of September 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, unallocated forfeitures totaled \$-0- and \$11,061, respectively. During the period ended September 30, 2024, Plan expenses totaling \$10,917 were paid from unallocated forfeitures.

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### **Note 1—Description of the Plan (continued)**

*Payment of Benefits* – Upon termination of service, retirement, death or disability, distributions under the Plan shall be paid through a single lump-sum amount. The Plan also allows for hardship withdrawals, and in-service withdrawals upon the participant reaching age 59 ½ deemed separated when on active duty, and continuing employment after reaching normal retirement age of all or a portion of a participant's vested account.

*Participant Accounts* – Each participant's account is credited with (a) the participant's pre-tax elective deferrals, Roth elective deferrals, and rollover contributions, (b) Company's matching and non-elective contributions, and (c) the Plan's net investment earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

*Plan Administration* – The Company is the Plan administrator and has the authority to appoint persons or entities to carry out the operations of the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company ("FMTTC") is the Plan's "trustee" and Fidelity Workplace Services LLC provides recordkeeping services for the Plan. Kestra Advisory Services, LLC and Strategic Advisors, Inc. provide financial advising and other administrative services to the Plan.

*Investment Options* – Participants may direct the trustee as to the investment of their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment directions at any time, subject to such restrictions and procedures as established by the recordkeeper, Plan, and Company.

### **Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies**

*Basis of Accounting* – The accompanying financial statements are prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

*Use of Estimates* – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the use of estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein. Such estimates relate primarily to unsettled transactions and events as of the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, upon settlement, actual results may differ from estimated amounts.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition* – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

*Notes Receivable From Participants* – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of September 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

*Benefits Paid* – Benefits are recorded when paid.

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### Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

*Administrative Expenses* – Certain administrative expenses incurred in maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses, recordkeeping, and other Plan administration expenses are paid by the Plan and are recorded in the net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments and in administrative expenses. A Service Agreement (the “Agreement”) entered into by the Plan sponsor and the Plan trustee allows the Plan sponsor to be reimbursed (revenue sharing) by the Plan trustee for qualified reimbursable Plan expenses paid by the Plan sponsor. If the revenue sharing funds specified by the Agreement exceeds the Plan sponsor’s qualified reimbursable Plan expenses, the Plan sponsor may allocate the excess to the Plan participants. Revenue sharing funds received are reported as other income in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Excess revenue sharing funds may be used to pay Plan expenses or allocated to participants based upon their account balances. As of September 30, 2024 the Plan received \$19,333 in revenue sharing funds, and use it to pay Plan expenses.

### Note 3—Information certified by the Plan’s Trustee (unaudited)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, FMTC has certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following data included in the accompanying financial statements:

- Investments, at fair value and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended September 30, 2024.

The Plan’s independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to the certified information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements.

### Note 4—Fair value measurements

U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset and liability, in an orderly transaction value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs when measuring fair value.

The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan can access at the measurement date.

*Level 2* – Inputs *other* than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

*Level 3* – Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

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### **Note 4—Fair value measurements (continued)**

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

*Mutual Funds* – The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

No investments are held under the Plan as at September 30, 2024. All investments at fair value at December 30, 2023 were Level 1 investments in mutual funds.

### **Note 5—Risks and uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **Note 6—Related party and party-in-interest transactions**

Plan investments include mutual funds managed by FMTC, the trustee of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative fees related to the trustee's administration of the Plan are paid by the Plan.

Certain employees and officers of the Company, who may also be participants in the Plan, perform administrative services to the Plan at no cost to the Plan. Notes receivable from participants are included in the statement of net assets available for benefits and interest income related to notes receivable from participants is included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

### **Note 7—Tax status**

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain positions that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of September 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

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**Note 8—Plan termination**

As discussed in Note 1, the Plan was terminated effective September 30, 2024, and all assets were automatically transferred from the Plan to a multiple employer plan. All participant balances became 100% vested as of the termination date and were not subject to forfeiture.

**Note 9—Subsequent events**

The Plan sponsor has evaluated all subsequent events through July 11, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and determined that no additional subsequent events had occurred that would require recognition or disclosure in these financial statements.
