Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Protein for Pets Opco, LLC 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of Protein for Pets Opco, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document and *Summary Plan Description* for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

General

The Plan was established June 1, 2019, as a defined contribution plan sponsored by Protein for Pets Opco, LLC (the “Company”) for the benefit of its employees age 18 or older. Employees of Company subsidiary, 3D Marine Solutions, LLC are eligible to participate in the Plan.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). Reliance Trust Company serves as the Plan’s trustee and Automatic Data Processing, Inc.’s Retirement Services is the Plan’s record-keeper.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 90% of pretax annual compensation to their account. Roth contributions are permitted. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. Participating employers may make discretionary employer matching contributions.

The Plan includes a qualified automatic contribution agreement (QACA) for employer matching contributions. The Company’s matching contribution amounted to 100% of the first 1% of participant’s compensation, plus 50% of participant deferrals on a maximum of 6% of participant compensation. The Plan received \$667,168 and \$595,646 in Company matching contributions in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Company may also make annual discretionary profit-sharing contributions in which participants must be employed on the last day of the plan year and have completed 1,000 hours of service during the plan year to be eligible. There were no profit-sharing contributions made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Investment Account Options

Participants have the option of directing their contributions into any of the various investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

The plan document includes an automatic deferral feature whereby a participant is treated as electing to defer a certain percentage of eligible compensation unless the participant made an affirmative election otherwise. The percentage of compensation deferred on each participant’s behalf as a pretax elective deferral is 3% and will increase by 1% each year up to a maximum of 6%.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution, the Company’s contribution, and plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is fully vested after six years of continuous service or upon death, disability, or attainment of normal retirement age while in active service of the Company. Contributions made under the QACA plus earnings thereon are fully vested after two years of continuous service.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of services, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution, installments, or partial withdrawals. For participants with vested balances not exceeding \$1,000, the plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent as a single lump-sum payment. Absent an election made by a participant, account balances greater than \$1,000 and not exceeding \$5,000 will be directly rolled over to an individual retirement account. Withdrawals other than for termination are permitted under circumstances provided by the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$215 and \$988 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay administrative fees or reduce future employer contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$45,142 and \$24,603, respectively, were used to reduce employer-matching contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The plan document includes provisions authorizing loans from the Plan to active eligible participants. The minimum amount of a loan is \$500. The maximum amount of a participant's loan is determined by the available loan balance restricted to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. All loans are covered by demand notes and are repayable over a period not to exceed five years (except for loans for the purchase of a principal residence) through payroll withholdings unless the participant is paying the loan in full. Interest on the loans is based on prime rate plus 1%. The maximum number of loans a participant may have outstanding at one time is one.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Quoted market prices, if available, are used to value investments. Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

The Plan's interest in the collective trust fund is valued based on information reported by the investment advisor using the audited financial statement of the stable value fund at year-end.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the period.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Rollover of Liquidating Trust Certificates

In connection with the sale of certain assets by the Company's predecessor effective May 30, 2019, the ESOP acquired an interest in an escrow account, the purpose of which is to pay certain liabilities, if any, associated with the sold assets. In connection with the ESOP's termination, the ESOP's interest in the escrow was transferred to the 3D Holdings, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan Liquidating Trust (the "Liquidating Trust") established effective March 26, 2020. The Liquidating Trust was established for the benefit of those employees participating in the ESOP at the time of the ESOP's termination, of which each former ESOP participant may be entitled to a distribution from the Liquidating Trust consisting of a portion of the funds currently held in the escrow.

Pursuant to the terms of the Liquidating Trust, each employee participating in the ESOP received a "Certificate of Participation" in the Liquidating Trust (the "Liquidating Trust Certificates") evidencing an interest in the Liquidating Trust (each such recipient of the Liquidating Trust Certificate is referred to as a "Certificate Holder"). Certificate Holders also participating in the Protein for Pets Opco, LLC 401(k) Plan were permitted to rollover their Liquidating Trust Certificates into the 401(k) Plan as part of a tax-deferred rollover under Section 402 of the Internal Revenue Code.

The Company determined that it was necessary to establish the Protein for Pets Opco, LLC 401(k) Plan Trust for the Liquidating Trust Certificates, a separate trust under the Protein for Pets Opco, LLC 401(k) Plan, to hold in custody and safekeeping the Liquidating Trust Certificates rolled over to the 401(k) Plan.

On May 31, 2023, the restriction on the escrow account lapsed, and the Liquidating Trust received cash proceeds of \$1,291,014, relating to the interest in the Liquidating Trust of the Certificate Holders participating in the Protein for Pets OpCo LLC 401(k) Plan, at which time the Certificate Holders' Liquidating Trust Certificates, previously valued at \$788,206, were redeemed, and the cash proceeds were distributed in July 2023 from the Liquidating Trust and transferred into the Certificate Holders' account in the Protein for Pets OpCo, LLC 401(k) Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Company's discretion.

Note 3. Certification of Plan Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Reliance Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate.

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 4. Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. Level 1 securities include mutual funds and are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at period-end. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using pricing models, quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics, or discounted cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy.

Uncertainty of Fair Value Measurements

The following is a description of the sensitivity of significant unobservable inputs, the interrelationships between those inputs, and other unobservable inputs used in recurring fair value measurements and how those inputs might magnify or mitigate the effect of changes in the unobservable inputs on the fair value measurement.

Investments Measured Using the Net Asset Value per Share Practical Expedient

The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using the net asset value per share practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan. This fund files a Department of Labor Form 5500 as a direct filing entity.

Note 5. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

Fees incurred by the Plan for record-keeping, administrative, and investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are primarily paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Individually nonmaterial direct expenses paid to parties in interest aggregated \$48,217 and \$26,163 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Company directly pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations and provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions accounts.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Plan operates under an adoption agreement in connection with a nonstandardized prototype retirement plan and trust document sponsored by ADP, LLC. The prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency. The Plan has not obtained or requested a determination letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

Effective January 1, 2025, ADP Retirement Trust Services, LLC replaced Reliance Trust Company as the Plan's trustee.

Subsequent events have been evaluated through July 1, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
