NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE A - Description of Plan

The following description of the Music Reports, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Music Reports, Inc. (the "Company"), who have completed six months of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a certain percentage of eligible compensation up to the maximum amount allowed by law, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Each pay period, the Company makes discretionary matching contributions to the account of each eligible employee who completed 12 months of service. The Company may, at its discretion, make additional profit sharing contributions to the Plan on an annual basis. There were no such profit sharing contributions for the current Plan year. Matching contributions are subject to certain limitations.

The plan sponsor determined it did not properly withhold and remit participant elected deferrals including the corresponding employer match on certain bonus compensation paid to its employees in January 2023. As a result, the plan sponsor computed the amount of qualified non-elective contribution ("QNEC") (50% of missed participant contribution plus 100% of the employer match on the missed participant contribution) to be funded by the employer along with the missing employer match. The QNEC contribution of \$14,816 and related employer match contribution of \$15,735 were included in employer contributions receivable as of September 30, 2023 and were funded by the plan sponsor on November 21, 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions and (b) Plan earnings, and is charged with his or her withdrawals and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

Retirement, Death and Disability

A participant is entitled to 100% of his or her account balance upon retirement, death or disability.

NOTE A - Description of Plan (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and rollovers plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts, plus earnings thereon, is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after three years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is determined by the plan administrator and is based on the interest rates charged for similar types of loans by other lenders. The interest is fixed for the duration of the loan. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant is eligible to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Benefit amounts under \$1,000 are automatically distributed to participants. Participants (or their beneficiaries upon the death of the participant) may elect to receive their vested account balances as a single lump sum or in installment payments. In certain circumstances, participants may make "hardship withdrawals" as defined in the Plan. Active participants may also take distributions from the Plan upon attainment of age 59 1/2.

Forfeitures

Participant forfeitures of employer profit sharing contributions are reallocated to the remaining participants, based upon their relative account balances. Forfeitures of employer matching contributions are used to offset future employer matching contributions or administrative expenses of the Plan. At September 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$6,413 and \$5,093, respectively. During the year ended September 30, 2023, employer contributions were reduced by \$8,260 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Administrative and Investment Management Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Plan recordkeeping fees are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and included in the investment income reported by the Plan.

NOTE B - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United State of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures, and actual results may differ from these estimates.

Unaudited Information Certified by the Trustee

Substantially all information pertaining to the Plan's investments and notes receivable from participants included in the financial statements, including the associated investment income, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, and has not been audited by independent accountants.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received by the Plan for an asset or paid by the Plan to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date in the Plan's principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participant's loans are carried at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Notes receivable outstanding as of September 30, 2024 accrue interest rates from 4.25% to 9.5% and mature on various dates through June of 2029. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of September 30, 2024 and 2023.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability in the statements of net assets available for benefits. Corrective distributions accrued as of September 30, 2024 and 2023 were paid on December 16, 2024 and December 5, 2023, respectively. Plan management believes these excess contributions are not material to the financial statements.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events for recognition and disclosure through July 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C - Fair Value Measurements

Fair value measurements are determined by maximizing the use of observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy places the highest priority on unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and gives the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumption that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

In some cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value may include inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

The following presents the valuation methods and assumption used by the Plan to estimate the fair values of investments. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE E - Party-In-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the employer and certain others. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Some administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company. The Plan holds mutual funds managed by T.Rowe Price ("T. Rowe"). The fair value of such investments aggregated \$12,334,119 and \$8,893,544 as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services are netted against net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments. T. Rowe is a service provider to the Plan and therefore these transactions and the Plan's payment of fees to T.Rowe qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the plan agreement to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participant would become 100% vested in their Company contributions and earnings thereon.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
