Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with US GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.



In performing an audit in accordance with US GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 ("supplemental schedule"), is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with US GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.



In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. In our opinion

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. Description of the Plan

The following description provides general information on the provisions of the Trail King Industries Employees' Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), a single-employer plan, sponsored by Trail King Industries, Inc., (the "Company"). Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

On October 4, 2010, the Company was acquired from a publicly traded third party and the Plan became effective for eligible Company employees.

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) prototype plan. This Plan covers all salaried and hourly employees of the Company. Eligible employees (as defined) of the Company who have completed 90 days of entry service are able to participate.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

Contributions

The Plan provides for an automatic 3% pre-tax elective payroll deferral for each participant, unless the participant has elected a different percentage or chosen not to participate. Participating employees may elect to make, through payroll deductions, elective deferral contributions from 1% up to 75% of eligible compensation (not to exceed the annual contribution limit, as set by the Internal Revenue Service, ("IRS")).

Effective January 1, 2024, participating employees may elect to designate all or any portion of their elective deferral contributions as after-tax. Before October 4, 2010, the Plan also provided for participating employees to elect to make after-tax voluntary contributions. Some employees retain after-tax account balances.

The Company matches 100% of each participant's first 3% of elective deferral contributions and 50% of the next 2% of elective deferral contributions. The Company may also make discretionary Plan contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no discretionary contributions.

Vesting

A participant is always 100% vested in elective deferral contributions, Company matching contributions, rollover contributions and past employee contributions. For discretionary Company contributions, a participant becomes 20% vested after completion of one year of service (as defined) and continues to vest 20% annually until 100% vesting is attained after five years of service.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company matching contributions, an allocation of Plan earnings and losses and any discretionary Company contributions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Description of the Plan – Continued

Forfeitures

Forfeited nonvested accounts are first used to pay Plan expenses. Any remaining forfeitures are used to offset Company contributions. The remaining unused forfeiture balance was \$0 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investment Options

The Company administers the Plan. Principal Trust Company (“Principal”) is the trustee of the Plan. Principal Financial Group is the recordkeeper of the Plan.

Participants self direct the investment of their accounts into registered investment company funds and common/collective trusts with the option to reallocate account balances.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are allowed to borrow from their vested account balance a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their total vested account balance or \$50,000, reduced by any outstanding note balance during the 12-month period ending on the day before the new note is made. The interest rate, at the date of the note, is charged at prime plus 1%. The notes are repaid through payroll deductions and must be repaid over five years, or fifteen years if the note is used for the purchase of a primary residence. Interest on outstanding notes ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, retirement or total and permanent disability, a participant may elect to receive payment in the form of either a lump-sum distribution or a direct rollover to an Individual Retirement Account (“IRA”) or an IRS qualified plan equal to the value of the participant’s vested account. Participants with vested account balances exceeding \$5,000 can choose to take a distribution or defer the distribution. Participants with a vested account balance greater than \$1,000 but less than \$5,000 must make a distribution election otherwise the balance is automatically rolled to an IRA. Balances of \$1,000 or less require a distribution election otherwise a check is issued for the balance. Under Federal law, regular 401(k) benefit payments must begin on the April 1st following the later of the calendar year in which the participant reaches age 73 or stops working for the Company.

Benefit payments received before age 59 ½ may be subject to a 10% tax penalty unless the amount is rolled over. In the event of death, the participant’s beneficiary will receive a lump-sum distribution. If the vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the beneficiary may choose when the account balance is paid.

Administrative Expenses

Expenses of administration, such as, legal, accounting, recordkeeping and trustee fees, are paid entirely by the Company. Investment management fees are paid from the accounts of participants. Per-use fees for notes receivable processing, distributions and withdrawals are also deducted from a participant’s account balance.

Description of the Plan – Continued

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and the Company has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will be fully vested in their accounts and the trustee will distribute Plan assets to participants or their beneficiaries in accordance with the Plan document.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Net Appreciation (Depreciation) in Fair Value of Investments

Net realized and unrealized appreciation (depreciation), which includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year, is recorded in the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits as net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Evaluation of Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated the impact of events that have occurred subsequent to December 31, 2024, through July 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible recognition or disclosure in those financial statements.

3. Investments

The Plan provides for investments that, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

4. Fair Value

The Plan follows guidance defined in Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, which provides a framework for measuring fair value under GAAP. This framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 – Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets and liabilities.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The Plan’s investments are valued at fair value using the following methodology:

- **Registered investment companies:** valued at net asset value (“NAV”) per share, using available inputs to measure fair value by such companies or funds, for shares held by the Plan at year-end. Generally, mutual funds have a quoted market price in an active market.
- **Common/collective trusts:** valued at the NAV of the units held by the Plan. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure the securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Income Tax Status

The Plan is a Prototype Non-standardized Profit Sharing Plan sponsored by Principal Life Insurance Company (“Principal Prototype Plan”). The IRS has determined and informed Principal by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Principal Prototype Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The Plan itself has not received a letter of determination but is entitled to rely on the letter issued to Principal for the Principal Prototype Plan. Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the letter, the Company believes that the Plan continues to be operated in compliance with the applicable sections of the IRC.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. There are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

6. Information Certified by the Plan’s Trustee

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal has certified that the following data included in the financial statements, notes to the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value, as shown in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Notes receivable from participants of \$1,545,576 and \$1,320,169, excluding unpaid accrued interest, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.
- Interest and dividend income as shown in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Interest income on notes receivable from participants of \$113,995.
