Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Presbyterian Healthcare Services 403(b) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter—Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i – schedule of assets held at end of year as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements, but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1) Description of Plan

Presbyterian Healthcare Services (“PHS” or the “Company”) established the PHS Shared Security Plan as an additional way to help its employees and their beneficiaries save for retirement. The PHS Shared Security Plan consists of two separate plans, the Presbyterian Healthcare Services 403(b) Plan primarily for employee contributions and the Presbyterian Healthcare Services 401(a) Plan for employer contributions. Together, these two plans are known as the PHS Shared Security Plan.

The following description is for the Presbyterian Healthcare Services 403(b) Plan (the “Plan”) and provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more comprehensive description of the Plan’s provisions.

General and Eligibility

The Plan is a 403(b) defined contribution plan sponsored by the Company. The Plan was established on January 1, 1994, was amended and restated effective January 1, 2014, and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). There is no age or service requirement for participation. All permissible employees of the Company, as defined in accordance with the universal availability standards, are eligible to enroll upon employment. The Company serves as the Plan administrator.

Contributions

Participants may contribute either a whole percentage or dollar amount of their eligible compensation either on a before-tax or after-tax Roth basis. All participants who are eligible to make contributions and are at least age 50 by the end of the Plan year are eligible to make additional catch up contributions subject to annual limits as established by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans or individual retirement arrangements (rollovers). Company contributions are not allowed in the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby hired or rehired employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at four percent of eligible compensation unless the participant elects a different percent or affirmatively opts out of the Plan. Their contributions are invested in a default investment option until changed by the participant.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and an allocation of Plan earnings (losses). Participant accounts may also be charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are fully vested at all times in their account balance.

Unallocated Balances

Unallocated balances consist of conversion timing differences and their related earnings. Unallocated balances are primarily invested in a money market fund. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were unallocated balances of \$247,634 and \$129,693, respectively.

Revenue Sharing

Revenue sharing credits may be used to pay administrative expenses. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, administrative expenses totaling \$324,400 and \$286,783 were paid from the revenue sharing account, respectively. The amounts used are netted with administrative expenses.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct their investments to several registered investment company options and fixed interest accounts. Participants may change their investment options daily. If a participant does not make an election as to how their contributions should be invested, the Plan will automatically invest the funds in a Default Fund. The Default Fund invests in a targeted retirement fund that is closest to the participant's 65th birthday.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the eligible balance. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the vested participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates at the origination date of the loan as determined by the Plan administrator. In 2024, participants who requested a loan had interest rates ranging from 8.00% to 8.50%. In 2023, participants who requested a loan had interest rates ranging from 7.50% to 9.25%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Note receivable repayment terms may not exceed five years, or ten years if the loan is for the purchase of participant's principal residence.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are payable in the event a participant retires, dies, becomes disabled or otherwise ceases to be an employee of the Company. A participant may receive the value of the interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution or annual installments. Participants are also allowed to withdraw from their accounts in the event of certain undue financial hardships as defined.

Mandatory Cash-Out Provisions

If the amount of benefits is \$1,000 or less (including rollover contributions) at the time of separation, the Plan will distribute benefits in a single lump-sum payment, without consent of the participant.

2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses was necessary as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred.

Investments Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in a variety of investment funds. Investments in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan permits, but does not require the Company to pay costs of Plan administration. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, all administrative expenses were paid by the Plan. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated for recognition or disclosure in these financial statements through July 11, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

3) Investments and Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments without quoted market prices, but for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4) Information Prepared and Certified by Trustee and Custodian (Unaudited)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee, and Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, the custodian, certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investments reflected on the supplemental schedule of assets held at end of year.

5) **Guaranteed Investment Contract with Insurance Company**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Metropolitan Life Insurance Company (MetLife). The underlying assets in the fixed income guaranteed investment contract are part of the general assets of MetLife. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a number of factors, including, but not limited to, the level of net investment income that MetLife can earn on its newly purchased general account assets, the absolute level of interest rates, the shape of the yield curve, how interest rates have moved since the inception of the contract, the minimum guaranteed interest rate, and interest rates on alternative investments. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting, but may not be less than 3%. The average yields based on actual earnings and crediting interest rate credited to participants for 2024 and 2023 were approximately 3.2% and 3.0%, respectively.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures, or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that causes a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the participants are probable of occurring.

6) **Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Company may terminate the Plan for any reason, at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. Unless the Company was to transfer the trust fund to another trust or fund, account balances would be distributed to participants in cash or in purchased annuities.

7) Tax Status

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the sample language provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in Revenue Procedure 2007-71. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its tax exemption. The Plan administrator and legal counsel believes the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the accompanying financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan's administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

8) Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity and MetLife, the trustee and custodian, respectively. Administrative expenses include audit, recordkeeping and legal fees, offset by investment revenue sharing credits. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged.
