Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Toledo Tool & Die Co., Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Note 1 – Description of the Plan

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was established on October 1, 1962 by Toledo Tool & Die Co., Inc. (the Company) which covers all eligible employees of Toledo Tool & Die Co., Inc. (the Plan). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The following description of the Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description or the Adoption Agreement, including amendments thereto, for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Administration

The Plan Sponsor and named Plan Administrator is Toledo Tool & Die Company, Inc. The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and fees, and reports to the Plan's Trustee. The Plan's Trustee is an officer of the Company. The Plan's Investment Custodian is Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower). The Investment Custodian holds all of the Plan's assets and executes all of the Plan's transactions.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees of the Company, except collective bargaining employees and non-resident aliens. All eligible employees must be 18 years of age and may begin participating in the Plan after completing 1 month of eligible service, with the entry date being the first day of the month coincident with or immediately after meeting the eligibility requirement specified in the plan document.

Contributions to the Plan

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the plan document, through payroll withholdings. The Plan also allows participants to make after-tax Roth contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make additional 'catch-up' contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). However, the Plan Administrator reserves the right to refuse acceptance of any rollover which might affect the status of the Plan.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible participants are automatically enrolled at a deferral rate of 3% unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. Auto-enrollment contributions are invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. The auto-enrollment percentage escalates 1% each October 1 until a participant's deferral rate reaches 6%.

The Plan allows the Company to make discretionary employer nonelective contributions. The amount is determined annually by the Board of Directors; no such contribution was made for 2024.

The Company makes matching contributions on behalf of the participants equal to 25% of the participants deferral up to a maximum of 6% compensation for all eligible participants.

Participants direct the investment of their individual contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company's contributions are allocated in the same manner as that of the participant's elective contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and employer contributions as well as plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, subject to certain Department of Labor and IRS requirements. Loan transactions are treated as participant-directed investments. Loan terms range from one to five years. Loan terms may exceed five years only in the event the loan proceeds are used to purchase or construct the participant's principal residence. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with prevailing prime rates. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Distribution of Benefits

On termination of service, participants with account balances less than \$1,000 are subject to involuntary cash outs, in which automatic distribution of their vested account balance will occur without direct consent. Participants with account balances between \$1,000 and \$5,000 are subject to involuntary cash-outs, in which automatic distributions of their vested account balance will occur without the direct consent unless a rollover is elected into another qualified account. Participants with account balances greater than \$5,000 may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution of their vested account balance. Alternatively, they may elect to rollover their vested account balance to another qualified account. The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Those participants whose account balances exceed \$5,000 may also elect to defer the distribution of their plan balance. Participants who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses, but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions. Special rules apply to distributions due to death, disability and retirement. Participants should refer to the full plan document for details.

The Plan allows for in-service distributions upon attainment of age 59 1/2 for all deferral contributions, employer matching contributions, and rollover contributions for any reason. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions prior to attainment of the Plan's normal retirement age due to financial hardship, as defined in the plan document, from vested account balances.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions (deferrals and rollovers), any employer contributions and earnings thereon. Vesting in company matching and discretionary contributions other than is based on years of continuous service at a rate of 20% per year after 2 full years of credited service. A participant is 100% vested after 6 years of credited service. Participants also become 100% vested upon death, disability, or attainment of normal retirement age.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures can be used to offset plan administration expenses and reduce employer contributions. Unallocated forfeiture balances as of September 30, 2024 and 2023 were \$25,300 and \$9,046, respectively. Forfeitures in the amount of \$16,277 were used to reduce employer contributions during the year ended September 30, 2024.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when they are earned. Employee contributions are recorded when withheld from pay. Expenses are recorded in the accounting period in which they are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Investment Custodian and investment advisers. See Note 4 for a description of the fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is accrued on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participant notes receivable are valued at their unpaid principal plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of September 30, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make repayments on a note receivable and the Plan Administrator deems the note receivable to be uncollectible, the balance on the note receivable from the participant is reclassified to benefits paid to participants.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Fees and Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including July 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Unaudited Information Certified by the Custodian

Plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the following information has been certified by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America as to its completeness and accuracy and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditors:

1. All investment balances reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024 and 2023;
2. All investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended September 30, 2024;
3. All investment-related information included in the Supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of September 30, 2024; and
4. Notes receivable from participants as of September 30, 2024 and 2023 and the related income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended September 30, 2024.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified contractual term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methods used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Note 5 – Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan has entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower with regard to the Guaranteed Income Fund (GIF) investment. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The GIF is a group annuity product, whereby amounts contributed to the contract are deposited into Empower's general account. Payment obligations and the fulfillment of any guarantees specified in the group annuity contract are insurance claims supported by the full faith and credit of Empower. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administration expenses. The contract value of the investment contract at September 30, 2024 and 2023 was \$148,372 and \$170,128, respectively.

The group annuity contract held by the Plan is a general account with no maturity date. The issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The interest crediting rate is based on the current economic and market conditions, the general interest rate environment and both the expected and actual experience of a referenced portfolio within the issuer's general account. The interest crediting rate is reset on an annual basis. The minimum crediting rate is 1.70%.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

The Plan Sponsor may transfer their account balance to any other investment option offered under Empower at any time with no restrictions or penalties. If the Plan Sponsor transfers out of the fund, Empower reserves the right to restrict transfers for 30 days. If the Plan Sponsor chooses to terminate the product, there may be transfer restrictions until the money is paid to the next provider. If there is a Plan Sponsor initiated event (such as, but not limited to, a merger, acquisition, or plan termination), a Market Value Adjustment is assessed on participant distributions for a period of 12 to 36 months, depending on the market conditions. These transactions are processed after the resolution of closed or disrupted financial exchanges or markets. The Plan Administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value are remote.

Note 6 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, who is the Plan's Investment Custodian. During the year ended September 30, 2024, the Plan paid direct compensation of \$79,377 to the Investment Custodian for services rendered. Indirect compensation (that is netted against investment income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits) is paid to the Investment Custodian from total annual operating expenses charged on the balance of fund investments, depending on the particular fund. Transactions involving these investments are considered party-in-interest transactions; however, these transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

Note 7 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. Upon termination, all participant accounts become 100% vested.

Note 8 – Plan Amendment and Tax Status

The Plan is utilizing a non-standardized pre-approved plan, which has been filed with the IRS and has received a favorable opinion letter dated November 14, 2022 from the IRS. The Plan Sponsor has not elected to apply for an individual IRS Determination Letter on the adoption of the Plan nor on any subsequent amendments. However, the Plan Sponsor believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) and that the related Trust is tax-exempt as of September 30, 2024.

The Plan permitted provisions of SECURE Act 2.0 during the year ended September 30, 2024. Written amendments to the plan document to reflect these operational changes will be adopted at a later date in accordance with the deadlines pursuant to applicable laws and IRS guidance.

The Plan was amended and re-stated effective October 1, 2022 to adopt auto enrollment provision with auto escalation.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
