Independent Auditor's Report

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Component Repair Technologies, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of Component Repair Technologies, Inc. (Company) 401(k) Plan (Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) profit sharing plan covering all employees of the Company. Employees are eligible to participate in the salary reduction portion of the Plan after completing 1 month of service and are age 18 or older. Employees are eligible for the discretionary profit-sharing contributions after completion of 1,000 hours of service in a 12-month period, are age 18 or older, and are employed on the last day of the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions:

Participants may make voluntary contributions from their compensation, as defined in the Plan agreement. The maximum voluntary contribution was \$23,000 in 2024. The total annual participant voluntary contribution is adjusted annually by a cost of living factor. Participants who will be at least age 50 by the end of the year may make additional contributions of \$7,500 in 2024.

In addition, the employer may make annual discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan which is nonelective. The Company has the discretion of which employee(s) will receive the profit-sharing contribution. The Company can choose not to contribute to the Plan for a particular year. The Company made profit sharing contributions totaling \$15,000 for 2024.

The Company's employer matching contributions are discretionary and are based on a percentage of the employee's contribution. For the year ended September 30, 2024, the Company's contribution was 100% of the employee's contribution up to the first 6%.

The Plan includes an eligible automatic contribution arrangement (EACA). Unless an affirmative election not to participate is made, all newly eligible employees will be automatically enrolled in the Plan with a default deferral rate of 3% of eligible compensation. The initial automatic deferral rate will escalate by 1% on the first day of the Plan year until it reaches a maximum rate of 6% of eligible compensation. Contributions are automatically invested in a designated balance fund until changed by the participant.

Participants' voluntary contributions and employer's profit-sharing contributions are designated under a qualified deferred arrangement as allowed by Section 401(k) and 401(m) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Participants may direct the investment of their voluntary contributions and employer's match and profit-sharing contributions into any of several mutual funds, common collective trust, or self-directed brokerage account options.

Participants' Accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with their voluntary contributions and employer's match and profit-sharing contributions and an allocation of the Plan's net earnings as defined by the Plan.

Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary contribution portion of their accounts is determined based upon years of service. A participant is vested according to the following table:

2	100%

Payment of Benefits:

Distributions are available upon termination, financial hardship, disability, death or attaining age 59-1/2. Benefits are paid in either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, annual installments over a specified period of time, or a combination thereof, if the value of the account is over \$5,000. For accounts less than \$5,000, the participant will receive a lump-sum payment.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear an interest rate of prime plus 2%.

Plan Costs:

Except for investment and auditing fees, the employer is absorbing all significant administrative costs of the Plan.

Forfeitures:

Forfeitures that are available to reduce the plan expenses and contributions of the employer to the Plan totaled \$33,474 at September 30, 2024 and \$20,172 at September 30, 2023. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions totaled \$15,315 for the year ended September 30, 2024.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Investments:

The investment funds are valued by Counsel Trust Company dba Mid Atlantic Trust Company, the custodian, at quoted market prices for mutual funds and self-directed brokerage accounts or net asset value per share for common collective trusts of the underlying securities comprising each fund. The Plan's investment in an investment fund is expressed in "units". A "unit value" is calculated by dividing the value of the entire investment fund by the total number of units in the fund. The value of the Plan's investment in an investment fund is determined by multiplying the number of units held by the Plan by the fund's unit value.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Net appreciation (depreciation) is recorded as the difference between the investment's fair value at the end of the year and the fair value at the beginning of the year, or cost if acquired during the year. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events:

Management evaluated all activity of the Plan through July 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and concluded that no subsequent events have occurred that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements or notes except as discussed in Note E.

NOTE C - INVESTMENTS CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

Investments and operations are managed by Component Repair Technologies, Inc. with the assistance of Counsel Trust Company dba Mid Atlantic Trust Company and AMI Benefit Plan Administrators who maintain records of the participants and their equity in the Plan.

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. The third-party administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies. Although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 input because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no Plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

There were no amounts allocated to participants who have separated from service and have requested distribution of their benefits at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE E - PLAN TERMINATION

The resolution to terminate the Plan was executed subsequent to year-end on January 18, 2025, subject to the provisions of ERISA. At the date of the Plan's termination, all participants employed by the Company have become fully vested and net assets of the Plan were distributed to employees on the basis of individual account balances at the date of termination. All plan assets were distributed out of the Plan by June 12, 2025.

NOTE F - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Prototype Plan Sponsor by a letter dated October 1, 2021, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE H - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of funds managed by Mid Atlantic Trust Company. Mid Atlantic Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest.

NOTE I - AMENDMENTS TO PLAN DOCUMENT

The Plan was amended effective October 1, 2023, to reduce the eligibility requirements from three months of service to one month of service. In addition, the employer match was increased to 100% of the employee's contribution up to the first 6%. The Plan was also amended to change the allocation method for the profit-sharing component of the Plan. Prior to this, profit-sharing contributions were allocated based on a discretionary percentage of plan eligible wages to all eligible participants. Under the current amendment, discretionary profit-sharing contributions can be made for each individual participant that is eligible to receive such contributions.

The Plan was amended on January 13, 2025 to comply with the SECURE 2.0 Plan provisions. The amendment was made prior to the Plan termination resolution on January 18, 2025.

NOTE J - NONCOMPLIANCE WITH PLAN PROVISIONS

During the plan year ended September 30, 2024, certain compensation components were incorrectly excluded from eligible compensation, resulting in missed deferral opportunities and related employer matching contributions for a group of eligible participants. The Company evaluated the impact of the error and determined that it did not materially affect the Plan's overall financial condition. The Company is in the process of evaluating self-correction methods available in accordance with the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System (EPCRS) and the Department of Labor's (DOL) Self-Correction Component (SCC) of the Voluntary Fiduciary Correction (VFC) Program.
