Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Hexagon 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Hexagon 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

- the information in the financial statements (modified cash basis) referred to above, related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Hexagon 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedules are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), as identified in the table of contents, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis) that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), other than the information in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis) that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis) related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1
DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Hexagon 401(k) Plan (the Plan), formerly known as the Agility Fuel Solutions 401(k) Plan, provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of Agility California LLC (Formerly FAB Services West LLC), Agility Fuel Systems LLC, Agility North Carolina LLC (Formerly AFS MFG LLC), Agility Powertrain Systems LLC, Agility Cylinders LLC. On January 1, 2021, the plan also began covering the employees of Hexagon Purus Systems USA LLC, Hexagon Lincoln LLC, Hexagon Masterworks, Inc., Hexagon Ragasco North America, Inc., Hexagon Technical Services LLC, Hexagon Purus LLC, Hexagon R&D LLC, Hexagon Digital Wave LLC, Hexagon USA Holdings Inc., and Hexagon Purus North America Holdings Inc. (the Employers). As of February 1, 2023, Hexagon Purus Systems USA LLC, Hexagon Masterworks, Inc., Hexagon Purus LLC, and Hexagon Purus North American Holdings Inc. were removed from the Plan. As of May 31, 2024, Hexagon Ragasco North America, Inc. stopped participation in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan initially became effective on January 1, 2007. The Plan adoption agreement was amended and restated on February 1, 2023.

Eligibility - Employees who are at least 18 years of age and may elect to make participant contributions immediately after employment commences. The employees are also immediately eligible to receive employer matching contributions.

Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute up to 90% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) maximum. Such contributions may be Pre-Tax Elective Deferrals or After-Tax Roth Contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (“rollovers”). Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions to the various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Employers provide a safe-harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of the participant's elective contributions up to 6% of the participant's eligible compensation up to the applicable IRC compensation limit. The contributions are made on a per payroll basis, with a true up adjustment made in the following year. Employees do not have to be active participants to be eligible for the safe harbor contribution. The safe-harbor contributions are invested in the same ratio as the participants' contributions.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Employers' contributions, (b) Plan earnings and losses, and (c) administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Employers' safe-harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon. For those transferring from the Hexagon 401(k) Savings Plan, all balances became 100% vested upon entry to the Hexagon 401(k) Plan. For discretionary employer contributions, a three-year vesting schedule applies to all eligible participants.

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000, subject to the terms and conditions of the Plan. The notes are secured by the participant's account balance and bear interest based on prevailing rates at the time of the loan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, notes had interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%, depending on when they were issued. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions and must be repaid within five years. Each participant may have one loan outstanding at a time.

Net assets represented by a participant loan are specifically allocated to the participant account of the borrower.

Payment of benefits - Upon termination of employment, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive any or all of the participant's vested interest in his or her account within a reasonable time after separation from service. The Plan provides for lump sum or installment payment options depending on the balance in the vested account. The Plan contains provisions for in-service distributions, including hardship distributions.

Forfeitures - Non-vested amounts from separated participants reduce the Employers' contribution or administrative expenses for the Plan year.

Plan termination - Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Employers have the right under the Plan to amend, modify, or terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed as soon as practicable after the termination date.

NOTE 2
SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting - The Plan prepares its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is an accounting method other than generally accepted accounting principles. Under the modified cash basis of accounting, income is generally recognized when received and expenses are generally recognized when paid. Contributions reflect the plan year in which the contributions were received. Benefits paid to participants and administrative expenses are recorded when paid. Investments have been recorded at fair value or contract value, and investment earnings are recorded when they are allocated to the investment contracts. The principal balance of notes receivable from participants are included as an asset on the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Administrative expenses - All investments, including the ones utilized by the Plan, have expenses associated with their management and operations. All expenses of the Plan are paid by either the Plan or the Employers, as provided by the Plan document. The Employers did not make any material payments for the Plan in 2024 or 2023.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and uncertainties - The Plan utilizes various investments. Investment securities in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment valuation and income recognition - The Plan's investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value. Investments in common collective trusts (excluding fully benefit responsive investment contracts) are also stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an investment in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for further discussion on fair value measurements. The Plan's valuation policies utilize information provided by the investment advisors and custodian.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts shown on the statement of net assets available for benefits as common collective trusts at contract value are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully-benefit responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Company invests in an investment contract through an unallocated general account.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when received. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded when received. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when paid. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant loan is in default under the terms of the Plan, the delinquent participant note receivable is reduced and recorded as a deemed benefit payment.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 3
FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standard Codification (FASB ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1 Assets: Mutual Funds – The fair value of mutual funds is based on the quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Level 2 Assets: Common Collective Trusts – The Plan’s custodian uses net asset values based on units of common collective trusts. The net asset values are generally based on the fair value of underlying investments which mirror publicly traded mutual funds with readily determinable fair values.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 4
FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE CONTRACT**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Reliance Trust Company. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed by the plan.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported by the trustee, represents contributions made under contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer or all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$3,011,962 and \$3,400,341, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under the ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or (d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants are probable of occurring.

The contract does not permit the trustee to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

NOTE 5
TAX STATUS

The Plan is a prototype plan that is subject to a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated July 16, 2014. Although the Plan has been amended since its initial effective date, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

NOTE 6
INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

The Plan's trustee, Reliance Trust Company, has provided certifications to the Plan administrator regarding the accuracy and completeness of certain information related to investment holdings of the Plan and the income and expenses of the Plan. The following information certified by the Plan's trustee in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) has been used in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements. NOTE 7
RELATED PARTIES AND PARTIES IN INTEREST

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform investment or recordkeeping services for the Plan. The Plan also issues loans to participants, which are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts. Because of the nature of the Plan, the Plan also paid certain expenses related to

plan operations and investment activity to service providers. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions for which a statutory exemption exists.

NOTE 8
TRANSFER FROM THE PLAN

As disclosed in Note 1, several employers were removed from the Plan as of February 1, 2023. The removal of these employers included the transfer of participant account balances totaling \$4,305,774 to another plan. In 2024, late paid dividends from these account balances of \$507 were transferred to the same plan.

NOTE 9
PLAN ADOPTIONS

During the year ended December 31, 2020, the Plan adopted provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act including coronavirus-related distributions, repayment of coronavirus-related distributions, increased participant loan limits, loan repayment extensions, and suspension of required minimum distributions. Provisions of the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act also went into effect on January 1, 2020. There were no significant provisions of the SECURE Act that effected the Plan through 2024. The Plan has not yet been amended for these provisions.

NOTE 10
SEPARATED PARTICIPANTS AND FORFEITURES

As of December 31, 2024, net assets available for benefits included \$13,860,173 that was allocated to participants who have separated from service.
