We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the LG CNS America Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

## Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) and the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for the purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements, but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

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## NOTE A – PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the LG CNS America Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

### *GENERAL*

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) safe-harbor and profit-sharing plan sponsored by LG CNS America, Inc. (referred to as the “Company” and “Employer”) with a plan year end of December 31st. The original Plan became effective January 1, 2004, with the most recent restatement of the Plan being June 25, 2024, which updated the name of the limited trustee of the Plan. The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Company. The provisions of the Plan are included in the official Plan document, which legally governs the operations of the Plan and is available for more detailed information. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

### *ELIGIBILITY*

The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Company who are age 21 or older and have completed three months of continuous service. In general, covered employees may enter the Plan immediately after satisfying the eligibility requirements.

### *PARTICIPANT AND COMPANY CONTRIBUTIONS*

Each year, participants may elect to contribute a percentage of their eligible compensation to the Plan in pre-tax or Roth contributions up to 96 percent of their eligible wages. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover funds from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan incorporates a safe-harbor employer match equal to 100 percent of the first 3 percent and 50 percent of the next 2 percent of compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The matching contribution is invested as directed by the participant.

The Plan incorporates a discretionary employer profit-sharing contribution and qualified nonelective contribution. Participants must have at least 1 year of service, 500 hours of service in the year of the profit-sharing contribution and be employed on the last day of the Plan year to be eligible for the profit-sharing contribution. For 2024 and 2023, no discretionary Employer contributions were made to the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations.

### *PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS*

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the Company’s contributions, and (b) Plan earnings or losses, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

*VESTING*

Participants are immediately vested in their elective (voluntary) contributions, safe-harbor employer match and any income or loss thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contribution, and earnings thereon, portion of their account is based on years of continuous service as follows:

*FORFEITED ACCOUNTS*

On December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeited non-vested accounts. Any forfeiture amounts can be used to pay plan expenses or to reduce future employer contributions. No forfeiture amounts were utilized during 2024 or 2023.

*PAYMENT OF BENEFITS*

Distributions of benefits are defined in the Plan document. Generally, upon termination of employment, death, disability, or normal retirement, a participant (or designated beneficiary) may elect to receive 100% of their vested account balance in either a lump sum cash payment or a direct rollover to another qualified plan, or partial payouts. Participants who have attained age 59 1/2 may also withdraw all or a portion of their vested account balances. Minimum distributions are required once the participant reaches age 73. Distribution of a participant's salary deferral contributions and their vested Employer contribution accounts may also be made in the case of certain financial hardships.

*NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS*

The Plan provides that participants can borrow funds of at least \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 95 percent of 50 percent of their vested account balance, reduced by any Roth elective deferrals, or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus 1 percent. The term of the loan cannot exceed four and one-half years, except if the loan proceeds are used to finance the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the loan term may not exceed 30 years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions. A participant may have one loan outstanding at a time.

**NOTE B – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

*BASIS OF ACCOUNTING*

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

*USE OF ESTIMATES*

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could vary from these estimates.

*INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). See Note D for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

*NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*PAYMENT OF BENEFITS*

Benefit payments to participants and their beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

*OPERATING EXPENSES*

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of the fair value of the investments.

*DATE OF MANAGEMENT REVIEW*

Subsequent events were evaluated through July 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Management is not required to and has not evaluated events or transactions that occurred after July 15, 2025.

**NOTE C – UNAUDITED INVESTMENT INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations and disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was certified by the trustee, Mid Atlantic Trust Company, and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent public accountants.

- a. All investments shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.
- b. Net investment income from the investments, as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, including dividends and interest income and net realized and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of assets.

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### NOTE D – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB (Financial Accounting Standards Board) ASC (Accounting Standards Codification) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Inputs to the valuation method include <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;</li><li>• quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;</li><li>• inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset and liability; and</li><li>• inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.</li></ul> <p>If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.</p>
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement of the assets and liabilities.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no transfers between levels in 2024 or 2023.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used on December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Interest Bearing Cash:** Valued based on quoted prices in active markets for identical securities. The account consists of cash, U.S. Treasury bills, notes, and other obligations issued or guaranteed as to principal and interest by the U.S. Government, its agencies, or instrumentalities, and repurchase agreements secured by such obligations or cash.

**Mutual Funds:** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan’s management believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan’s assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

**NOTE E – RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Mid Atlantic Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan assets, Paychex provides third-party administrative and recordkeeping services. Pooler CPA Group, LLC is the Plan auditor. Merrill Lynch provides investment advisory services. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in interest transactions.

Audit fees and certain other administrative expenses are rendered by parties in interest and are paid by the Company. The Company also provides certain administrative services for the Plan for which it receives no compensation.

**NOTE F - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE G – TAX STATUS**

The Plan, which is a prototype plan sponsored by Paychex, has received a favored opinion letter dated August 31, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service has stated that the Plan Document is acceptable under section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore not subject to tax. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed, and being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**NOTE H – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions, if any.

**NOTE I – DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS**

During 2024 the Plan remitted participant contributions in the amount of \$341,560 beyond the normal remittance time periods that the Plan usually submits contributions to the custodian. The Company filed a VFCP application with the Department of Labor and the lost earnings correcting the affected participant accounts has been deposited to their accounts as of December 31, 2024.

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

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## **NOTE A – PLAN DESCRIPTION**

The following description of the LG CNS America Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

### *GENERAL*

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) safe-harbor and profit-sharing plan sponsored by LG CNS America, Inc. (referred to as the “Company” and “Employer”) with a plan year end of December 31st. The original Plan became effective January 1, 2004, with the most recent restatement of the Plan being June 25, 2024, which updated the name of the limited trustee of the Plan. The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Company. The provisions of the Plan are included in the official Plan document, which legally governs the operations of the Plan and is available for more detailed information. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

### *ELIGIBILITY*

The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Company who are age 21 or older and have completed three months of continuous service. In general, covered employees may enter the Plan immediately after satisfying the eligibility requirements.

### *PARTICIPANT AND COMPANY CONTRIBUTIONS*

Each year, participants may elect to contribute a percentage of their eligible compensation to the Plan in pre-tax or Roth contributions up to 96 percent of their eligible wages. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover funds from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan incorporates a safe-harbor employer match equal to 100 percent of the first 3 percent and 50 percent of the next 2 percent of compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The matching contribution is invested as directed by the participant.

The Plan incorporates a discretionary employer profit-sharing contribution and qualified nonelective contribution. Participants must have at least 1 year of service, 500 hours of service in the year of the profit-sharing contribution and be employed on the last day of the Plan year to be eligible for the profit-sharing contribution. For 2024 and 2023, no discretionary Employer contributions were made to the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations.

### *PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS*

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the Company’s contributions, and (b) Plan earnings or losses, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

*VESTING*

Participants are immediately vested in their elective (voluntary) contributions, safe-harbor employer match and any income or loss thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contribution, and earnings thereon, portion of their account is based on years of continuous service as follows:

*FORFEITED ACCOUNTS*

On December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeited non-vested accounts. Any forfeiture amounts can be used to pay plan expenses or to reduce future employer contributions. No forfeiture amounts were utilized during 2024 or 2023.

*PAYMENT OF BENEFITS*

Distributions of benefits are defined in the Plan document. Generally, upon termination of employment, death, disability, or normal retirement, a participant (or designated beneficiary) may elect to receive 100% of their vested account balance in either a lump sum cash payment or a direct rollover to another qualified plan, or partial payouts. Participants who have attained age 59 1/2 may also withdraw all or a portion of their vested account balances. Minimum distributions are required once the participant reaches age 73. Distribution of a participant's salary deferral contributions and their vested Employer contribution accounts may also be made in the case of certain financial hardships.

*NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS*

The Plan provides that participants can borrow funds of at least \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 95 percent of 50 percent of their vested account balance, reduced by any Roth elective deferrals, or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus 1 percent. The term of the loan cannot exceed four and one-half years, except if the loan proceeds are used to finance the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the loan term may not exceed 30 years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions. A participant may have one loan outstanding at a time.

**NOTE B – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

*BASIS OF ACCOUNTING*

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

*USE OF ESTIMATES*

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could vary from these estimates.

*INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). See Note D for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

*NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*PAYMENT OF BENEFITS*

Benefit payments to participants and their beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

*OPERATING EXPENSES*

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of the fair value of the investments.

*DATE OF MANAGEMENT REVIEW*

Subsequent events were evaluated through July 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Management is not required to and has not evaluated events or transactions that occurred after July 15, 2025.

**NOTE C – UNAUDITED INVESTMENT INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations and disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was certified by the trustee, Mid Atlantic Trust Company, and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent public accountants.

- a. All investments shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.
- b. Net investment income from the investments, as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, including dividends and interest income and net realized and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of assets.

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## NOTE D – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB (Financial Accounting Standards Board) ASC (Accounting Standards Codification) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Inputs to the valuation method include <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;</li><li>• quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;</li><li>• inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset and liability; and</li><li>• inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.</li></ul> <p>If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.</p>
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement of the assets and liabilities.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no transfers between levels in 2024 or 2023.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used on December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Interest Bearing Cash:** Valued based on quoted prices in active markets for identical securities. The account consists of cash, U.S. Treasury bills, notes, and other obligations issued or guaranteed as to principal and interest by the U.S. Government, its agencies, or instrumentalities, and repurchase agreements secured by such obligations or cash.

**Mutual Funds:** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan’s management believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan’s assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

**NOTE E – RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Mid Atlantic Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan assets, Paychex provides third-party administrative and recordkeeping services. Pooler CPA Group, LLC is the Plan auditor. Merrill Lynch provides investment advisory services. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in interest transactions.

Audit fees and certain other administrative expenses are rendered by parties in interest and are paid by the Company. The Company also provides certain administrative services for the Plan for which it receives no compensation.

**NOTE F - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE G – TAX STATUS**

The Plan, which is a prototype plan sponsored by Paychex, has received a favored opinion letter dated August 31, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service has stated that the Plan Document is acceptable under section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore not subject to tax. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed, and being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**NOTE H – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions, if any.

**NOTE I – DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS**

During 2024 the Plan remitted participant contributions in the amount of \$341,560 beyond the normal remittance time periods that the Plan usually submits contributions to the custodian. The Company filed a VFCP application with the Department of Labor and the lost earnings correcting the affected participant accounts has been deposited to their accounts as of December 31, 2024.
