NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of The Great Lakes Brewing Co. 401K Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan), is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a 401(K) plan established to provide retirement benefits for all employees of The Great Lakes Brewing Co. (the Company). Until September 15, 2023, Employees of the Company were eligible to participate immediately upon employment for elective contributions. Effective September 15, 2023, the Plan was amended and participants are now eligible to participate after 90 days of employment for elective contributions. For employer matching and company discretionary contributions, participants in the Plan are eligible after having completed one year of service. The Plan and Trust utilizes the elapsed time method of calculating service with no counting of hours of service requirement for eligibility.

The Plan entry date is the first date of the quarter following attainment of the service requirement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The plan has an automatic contribution with a deferral rate of 6%. The Plan was amended effective September 15, 2023 to include a 1% escalation in the automatic deferral rate per year to a maximum of 10% for all new participants.

Contributions

Each year, Plan participants may contribute to the Plan, on a pretax basis, an amount not to exceed 100% of their compensation, subject to a limit of \$23,000 and \$22,500 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Eligible employees may elect to make additional “catch up” contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts on an after-tax basis through Roth contributions subject to the same limitations as pretax basis contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Company contributes a matching contribution on behalf of each participant in an amount equal to 25% on the first 6% of the participant’s compensation contributed to the Plan. The Company also contributed a discretionary profit sharing contribution on behalf of each participant in an amount equal to 0% and 3% for 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant Accounts

A separate account is maintained for each investment option selected by the participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contributions, the Company's profit sharing contribution, and the Plan's earnings. Allocation of the Plan's earnings is based on participant's account balances.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and those made by the Company into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers twenty-six funds as investment options for participants.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in employee contributions. Participants are 0% vested in company contributions in year one and year two of service and 100% vested after year three of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, reduced by the participant's highest outstanding loan during the previous twelve month period. Loan terms can be up to 5 years, or up to 30 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Loan balances are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued, unpaid interest and bear interest at a rate determined at the time the loan is made. Interest income from the loans is recorded on the accrual basis. As of December 31, 2024, the interest rates on all outstanding loans ranged from 3.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are repaid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions. Loan origination fees of \$75 and quarterly loan maintenance fees of \$12 are paid by the participant requesting the loan. Loan origination and maintenance fees are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Payment of Benefits

The normal form of benefits under the Plan is a single life annuity for an unmarried participant and a joint and survivor annuity, for a married participant. Additional annuity forms and lump sum distribution options are available at the election of the participant, provided for a married participant that the spouse consents. If a participant dies on or after an Annuity Starting Date, the beneficiary will be eligible to receive the retirement benefits payable to the beneficiary, if any.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures resulting from a break in participant service without the attainment of 100% vesting are applied towards Plan expenses or used to reduce employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested amounts totaled \$2 and \$4,457, respectively.

NOTE 2 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator and management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are administered by Delaware Charter Guarantee Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (Principal Trust Company) and are stated at fair value. Units held in mutual funds are valued at the daily closing prices as reported by the funds. Units held in pooled separate accounts are reported at fair value based on the unit prices quoted by the funds, representing the fair value of the underlying investments. Units held in fixed funds are reported at contract value. Through September 15, 2023, The Plan's investments were administered by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company and were stated at fair value. Units held in pooled separate accounts were reported at fair value based on the unit prices quoted by the funds, representing the fair value of the underlying investments. Units held in fixed funds were reported at contract value. Participant loans are valued at cost, which approximates fair value.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTE 2 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Administrative Services

The expenses necessary to administer the Plan are paid by the Plan or Plan sponsor including, but not limited to, those involved in retaining necessary professional assistance from an attorney, an accountant, an actuary, or an investment adviser. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value in the near term would materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE 3 - TAX STATUS

The Plan uses a prototype pre-approved plan document sponsored by Principal Life Insurance Company, which received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Plan is qualified under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401. The Plan itself has not received its own determination letter. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 4 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Certain Plan investments are investment funds managed by Principal Trust Company. Principal Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Through September 15, 2023, certain Plan investments were investment funds managed by Voya Financial Advisors, Inc. Voya Financial Advisors, Inc. was the custodian of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain fees for investment management, recordkeeping and administrative expenses are with the custodian and are not considered prohibited transactions under ERISA. Participant loans also qualify as party-in-interest.

NOTE 5 - INVESTMENTS

Effective September 15, 2023, the Plan's investments are held by Principal Trust Company as custodian. Through September 15, 2023, The Plan's investments were held by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. As custodians, both Principal Trust Company and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company maintain the investments in separate accounts, which comprise a significant portion (99.00% - 2024, 97.80% - 2023) of the Plan's assets. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals. Principal Trust Company certified for 2024 and for the period of September 15, 2023 through December 31, 2023 as to the completeness and accuracy of the information reported. Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company certified for January 1, 2023 through September 15, 2023 as to the completeness and accuracy of the information reported. Unrealized and realized gains (losses) on investments totaled \$1,950,436 and \$2,988,343 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan's provisions to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's investments were held by Principal Trust Company. Through September 15, 2023, the Plan's investments were held by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The following is a summary of the Plan's financial information that is included in the financial statements based on information certified by Principal Trust Company and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company as complete and accurate in accordance with Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting with Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

NOTE 9 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board Statement *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or by other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of the applicable portion of assets and gains/losses allocated to the Plan by the insurance company. The NAV, as provided by the insurance company, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Transactions occurring throughout the year are generally priced at the NAV. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily and there is no minimum redemption notice period.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
