Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit



NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

(1) DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

Kirkpatrick Oil Company, Inc. sponsors the Kirkpatrick Companies Savings Incentive & Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”). The following description provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

Kirkpatrick Oil Company, Inc. (“Oil”) is the Plan’s sponsor, and the following affiliates are participating employers of the Plan: Kirkpatrick Bank (the “Bank”), Kirkpatrick Management Inc. (KMI), Kirkpatrick Foundation, Inc. (the “Foundation”), Brett Weston Archives, LLC (“Archives”), Christian K. Keesee (CKK), and BeekmanNYC, LLC (“Beekman”) [collectively, the “Companies” or the “Employer”]. Effective January 1, 2024, Beekman ceased participation in the Plan. The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the benefit of the eligible employees of the Companies, except for collective bargaining employees, nonresident aliens, and non-Oklahoma based employees of CKK. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan is administered by the Investment Committee, which is a committee appointed by Oil’s board of directors. John Hancock Life Insurance Company, U.S.A. (“John Hancock”) processes and maintains the records of the participant data and holds the Plan’s assets.

Eligibility

Nonexcluded Bank employees who have completed one year of service and 1,000 hours are eligible to participate in the Plan. Nonexcluded Oil, Foundation, Archives, CKK, KMI, and Beekman employees who have completed 3 months of service and 250 hours are eligible to participate in the Plan. Eligible Bank employees may enroll in the Plan on the first day of each quarter, and all other eligible employees may enroll monthly.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their compensation, as defined in the plan document, as either pretax or Roth deferrals. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”).

Eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a 3% deferral rate. Eligible employees who do not wish to participate in the Plan may affirmatively elect to opt out, or they may elect a different deferral percentage. On the first day of each plan year, deferral percentages are automatically increased by 1% up to a maximum of 10%, unless elected otherwise by the participant.

Contributions, Continued

The Plan also provides for discretionary Employer matching contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Bank matched 100% of deferrals up to 10% of a participant's annual compensation for employees that worked 1,000 hours and were employed on the last day of the plan year; all remaining participating employers matched 100% of deferrals up to 5% of a participant's compensation on a pay period basis. Catch-up contributions for Bank employees are not eligible for Employer matching contributions.

Additional amounts may be contributed by the Employer under the Plan's nonelective provisions at the discretion of Oil's board of directors. Allocations of Employer nonelective contributions are based on the proportion of each participant's compensation to the total of all participants' eligible compensation. There were no Employer nonelective contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with participant contributions, Employer matching contributions, and allocations of Employer nonelective contributions and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in Employer contributions is based upon years of continuous service as follows:

Less than 2	0%
2 but less than 3	25%
3 but less than 4	50%
4 but less than 5	75%
5 or more	100%

Participants automatically become 100% vested upon normal retirement (attainment of age 65), disability, or death. Participants who terminate for any other reason are entitled to the vested amount of their accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their vested accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the excess of the highest outstanding loan balance during the preceding 12-month period over the outstanding loan balance on the date of the loan, or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 5.25% to 10.50%, which is based on a commercially reasonable rate as determined by the plan administrator. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any given time. Terms for all loans, including those for the purchase of a primary residence, generally range from 1 to 5 years. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, termination, disability, or death, a participant, or his or her beneficiary in the event of death, may elect to receive a lump-sum amount, partial withdrawals, or substantially equal payments equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Additionally, participants may take in-service distributions upon reaching age 59½. Upon termination, automatic distributions are required for balances of less than \$7,000. Automatic distributions above \$1,000 made without the participant's consent are rolled into an individual retirement account designated by John Hancock. The Plan allows hardship withdrawals, subject to account balance limits and applicable laws.

Participants who were automatically enrolled in the Plan have the option to withdraw their deferrals without penalty within 60 days of their automatic enrollment date.

Transfers

There were no transfers to or from the Plan during either of the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce Employer matching contributions. The Plan had \$108,816 and \$126,914 in unallocated forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures in the amount of \$19,529 and \$31,389 were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan and to reduce Employer contributions, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2023, forfeitures in the amount of \$22,887 and \$30,960 were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan and to reduce Employer contributions, respectively.

(1) DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN, CONTINUED

Administrative Expenses

The Plan allows certain administrative expenses to be paid from plan assets. Investment expenses netted against investment income represent amounts associated with the net expense ratios of the investments in the Plan's fund lineup. The Plan participates in an agreement with John Hancock, where excess revenue may be returned and deposited into an unallocated expense budget account. The amounts in the unallocated expense budget account may be used to pay reasonable and necessary plan expenses or may be allocated to participants. There were no unallocated funds in the expense budget account as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan used \$4,583 and \$11,738, respectively, from the expense budget account to pay certain plan expenses.

(2) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by John Hancock. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

(2) **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, CONTINUED**

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid. There were no benefits requested before year-end that were not paid.

Date of Management's Review of Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through July 10, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that no subsequent events have occurred that require adjustment to or disclosure in the financial statements.

(3) **INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY JOHN HANCOCK**

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, John Hancock has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment activity (net appreciation in fair value of investments) and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment information included in the footnotes and on the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

(4) FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is defined as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. In estimating fair value, the Plan utilizes valuation techniques that are consistent with the market approach, the income approach, and/or the cost approach. Such valuation techniques are consistently applied. Inputs to valuation techniques include the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability. Fair values may not represent actual values of assets and liabilities that could have been realized on the measurement date or that will be realized in the future. The use of different market assumptions and/or estimation methodologies may have a material effect on the estimated fair value amounts.

Accounting Standards Codification Topic 820, "Fair Value Measurement," establishes a fair value hierarchy for valuation inputs that gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs. The fair value hierarchy is as follows:

- Level 1 inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Level 2 inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets, and inputs that are observable for the asset and liability, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs which are used when observable inputs are unavailable and reflect an entity's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the assets or liabilities.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation methods based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its assets and liabilities.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for plan benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy:

Pooled Separate Accounts

Stated at fair value as determined by the issuer of the pooled separate accounts based on the fair market value of the underlying investments, which is valued at the net asset value (NAV) as a practical expedient to estimate fair value rather than valued using inputs according to the fair value hierarchy. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the pooled separate accounts, John Hancock reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the funds in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of a different methodology or assumption to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There has been no change in the methodology used as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using the NAV per share as a practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(5) RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Companies. No officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan for these services. Certain administrative expenses totaling approximately \$20,000 and \$23,000 were paid by the Companies on behalf of the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Companies do not expect reimbursement from the Plan for these expenses.

The investments are managed by John Hancock. The Plan also holds notes receivable from participants. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain fees incurred by the Plan are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing rather than a direct payment. The Plan also made direct payments to service providers, which were not covered by revenue sharing.

(6) PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, Oil has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in the Employer contribution portion of their accounts.

(7) TAX STATUS

The plan sponsor adopted a nonstandardized preapproved plan (the "Preapproved Plan") sponsored by FIS Business Systems LLC. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Preapproved Plan sponsor by a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Preapproved Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Code. The Preapproved Plan's opinion letter is being relied on by the Plan. Plan management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

(8) RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.
