Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Midwest Engineered Systems Group 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

Midwest Engineered Systems Group 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Midwest Engineered Systems, Inc. (the Company). The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers substantially all employees of the Company who have reached eighteen years of age, excluding interns, seasonal, temporary, leased, union, and non-resident employees, and have completed three months of employment in which a minimum of 250 hours of service is performed. If 250 hours of service are not completed in the first three months of employment, 1,000 hours of service must be completed before an employee may participate in the Plan. Employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the attainment of these requirements unless the employee elects to waive participation. Participants are auto enrolled at 8%. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

The Plan provides for voluntary pre-tax and ROTH employee contributions of 1% to 75% of compensation, up to the maximum amount allowed by law. The Company may, but is not required to, make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan.

The Company matches 25% of the participant's contributions up to 8% of compensation. The match contribution is made bi-weekly with every payroll. The discretionary matching contribution amounted to \$237,710 and \$185,064 in 2024 and 2023, respectively. Contributions from Plan participants and the related matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

In addition, the Company's Board of Directors may authorize discretionary profit sharing contributions to employees who are eligible to make elective deferrals. No discretionary profit sharing contributions were made in 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, an allocation of Plan earnings, and charged with the withdrawals and an allocation of Plan losses and expenses. Allocations are based on Plan earnings or participant account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. All amounts in participant accounts are participant directed.

Investment Options

Participants may direct employee and employer contributions in any of several investment options. By designating these investment alternatives for participants, allowing frequent fund transfers, and providing the necessary fund information to participants, it is intended that the Plan be treated as an ERISA 404(c) Participant Directed Account Arrangement.

The Plan's investment in a group annuity contract allows for participant directed allocations of participant and Company contributions among numerous pooled separate investment funds (Funds). Each of the Funds reflect the Plan's proportionate share of investments in shares of registered investment companies (mutual funds). The mutual funds invest in common stocks of domestic and foreign corporations, corporate bonds, and money market funds, which cover a wide range of fund objectives, risks, and returns.

Plan Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Custodian fees, TPA fees, and financial advisor fees are included in administrative fees. Certain other fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative fees and/or netted with investment income on the accompanying Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Vesting

Participants are immediately fully vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become fully vested in their account balances upon retirement, death, or disability, as defined by the Plan. A year of vesting service is a vesting service period in which a participant has at least 1,000 hours of service. Company matching and profit sharing contributions are vested on a five-year schedule as follows:

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount or installment payments equal to the value of his or her account less forfeited amounts or postpone distribution until required by internal revenue code rules. If a participant's vested account balance is \$5,000 or less, the participant will automatically be paid a lump-sum distribution or by direct rollover to an IRA or other eligible retirement plan, as soon as administratively feasible following their termination of service. Participants with vested account balances available for distribution exceeding \$5,000 must consent to any distribution. In-service distributions are allowed under certain circumstances as described in the Plan agreement.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate (as determined by John Hancock Life Insurance Company) at the onset of the participant's loan, plus 1%. Once the participant loan rate is established, the rate of interest will be fixed for the life of the loan. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are used to reduce employer matching and profit sharing contributions. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions in 2024 and 2023 were \$7,406 and \$8,849, respectively. There were \$200 and \$400 of forfeitures outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan's investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participants' account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at their fair value, except for fully-benefit responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Realized gains (losses) and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) are recorded in the accompanying financial statements as net appreciation in fair value of investments. Realized gains (losses) on investment transactions are recorded as the difference between proceeds received and the carrying value of the investments.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S INSURANCE COMPANY (UNAUDITED)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance allowed by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, Plan management instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by the John Hancock Life Insurance Company, the insurance company of the Plan, as complete and accurate, except for comparing such information certified by the insurance company with information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

- a) Investments as disclosed in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
- b) Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments as disclosed in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.
- c) The Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year).

The Plan’s independent auditors performed limited auditing procedures with respect to this information, including comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan’s investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses the appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs were used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair values of pooled separate accounts are the net asset value (NAV), based on quoted market prices in active markets of shares held by the Plan at year end. Appreciation (depreciation) in fair value is added to, or deducted from, the pooled separate account and allocated to the individual participants as defined by the contract.

There were no significant transfers between Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3 investments during the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The Plan, which is a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan with CODA, obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Although the plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified and tax-exempt at the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed or sub-advised by John Hancock Life Insurance Company. John Hancock Life Insurance Company is the insurance company as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Administrative fees were paid by the Plan to the John Hancock Life Insurance Company for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

PPG Retirement Plan Services, LTD (PPG) is the third-party administrator of the Plan. Administrative fees were paid by the Plan to PPG for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan uses Next Level Planning & Wealth Management Company as an investment advisor for the Plan. Investment advisory fees were paid by the Plan to Next Level Planning & Wealth Management Company for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participants account balances.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 8 - SECURE ACT 2.0

SECURE Act 2.0 includes provisions that are both mandatory and voluntary. The Plan only adopted the applicable mandatory provisions and did not adopt any of the voluntary provisions during the year. The Plan has until 2026 to formally amend the Plan for SECURE Act 2.0.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated all subsequent events through June 17, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.
