Opinion

Basis for Opinion

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. Description of plan

The following description of the **Midwest Bancorporation, Inc. and Affiliates Employee Stock Ownership Plan** (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Midwest Bancorporation, Inc. and its affiliated companies established the **Midwest Bancorporation, Inc. and Affiliates Employee Stock Ownership Plan** effective January 1, 1987. The Plan was last amended effective January 1, 2025. The Plan is a defined contribution plan intended to constitute an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975 (e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan is a multiple employer plan under Section 413(c) of the IRC and covers employees of Midwest Bancorporation, Inc., First Midwest Bank of Dexter, First Midwest Bank of the Ozarks, Poplar Bluff Banc Company, First Midwest Bank of Poplar Bluff, and Midwest Data Processing, Inc. (collectively, the "Company"). In January 2021, Poplar Bluff Banc Company merged into Midwest Bancorporation, Inc., eliminating that participating employer. In December 2021, First Midwest Bank of the Ozarks merged into First Midwest Bank of Poplar Bluff; however, the name of was kept as First Midwest Bank of the Ozarks after the merger was completed.

The Plan covers all employees of the Company who have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year. An eligible employee will begin participation on the first day of each plan year immediately following the completion of the eligibility requirements. The Plan is designed to invest primarily in securities issued by the Company and is authorized to borrow money for such investments. It is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Plan is administered by a Board of Trustees and the Company serves as the Plan Administrator.

On December 20, 2019, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE Act) was enacted and was effective beginning on January 1, 2020. The SECURE Act provision included, among other things, an increase in the age limit for required minimum distributions from age 70 ½ to 72. The Plan is in the process of operationally being amended to implement certain changes related to the SECURE Act. Written amendments to the Plan to reflect these operational changes will be adopted at a later date in accordance with applicable law and IRS guidance.

On March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act was enacted. The CARES Act provides immediate and temporary relief for eligible retirement plans and their participants who were adversely impacted by the coronavirus. The Plan made the election not to be amended to allow for the provisions of the CARES Act related to coronavirus distributions and loans. The Plan did elect to allow for the temporary waiver of required minimum distributions for the 2020 calendar year.

Contributions

Contributions are made at the discretion of the Company's Board of Directors. In order to receive an allocation of Company contributions, a participant must complete 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year unless termination is due to death, disability, or retirement. Contributions by Plan participants are not permitted by the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of the Company's contribution and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested account. During 2020, the Board of Trustees authorized a special valuation of the Company stock held in the Plan as of March 31, 2020. As a result, each participant was credited with allocations as previously defined at March 31, 2020 and December 31, 2020. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the company as of the last day of the Plan year and completed 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation, as defined. Plan earnings or losses are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account.

Vesting

Vesting of participant's accounts is based on years of credited service with the Company. A participant's account becomes fully vested after six years of credited service with the Company, under a graded vesting schedule. A participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Voting rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the Trustees prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The appointed Trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

Put option

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market or is subject to trading limitations includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation service in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution.

Benefit payments

Upon termination of service, a participant will receive a lump sum distribution of their account balance without the participant's consent if their balance does not exceed \$1,000. The amount to be distributed is based upon the account valuation date immediately preceding the distribution. Distributions are made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Company common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock. The Plan allows for hardship distributions subject to Plan provisions.

Under the provisions of the Plan, the Company is obligated to repurchase participant shares which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan if the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations.

Forfeitures

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's eligible compensation to total eligible compensation for the Plan year. Forfeitures of terminated nonvested account balances allocated to remaining participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$7,737 and \$16,552, respectively. There were no balances in forfeited nonvested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuations and income recognition

The common shares of the Company are valued at estimated fair value. Other investments are valued at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Benefit payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Company, as provided in the Plan document. Expenses paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investment presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair value measurement

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Observable inputs other than Level 1 process, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual)

term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level with the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Institutional cash: Valued at the amount held in institutional interest-bearing cash accounts.

Sponsor company common stock: The fair value of the Midwest Bancorporation, Inc. common stock held by the Plan is valued at the estimated fair value based upon an independent third-party appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. The appraiser takes into account historical and projected cash flow, net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparable, and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Investments

The Plan's investment in Company securities consists of 13,040 shares of the outstanding common stock of Midwest Bancorporation, Inc. acquired at various dates at an average purchase price of \$159.48 per share, which was the estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal, at the time of purchase. The estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$2,435 and \$1,997 per share, respectively. All the shares are allocated to participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

5. Party-in-interest transactions

The Plan's assets, which consist primarily of Company common shares, are held by the Trustees of the Plan.

The Plan is administered by the Board of Trustees and certain administrative functions are outsourced to a third-party administrator. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

The Plan invests in Company common stock. This is a related party-in-interest transaction. As the Company is the Plan Sponsor, transactions involving Company common stock qualify as party-in-interest transactions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held 13,040 shares of Company common stock and the Plan received \$1,568,391 and \$1,711,692, respectively, in dividends from this stock. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

6. Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the interest of each participant in the Plan will be distributed to such participant or beneficiary, regardless of years of service, at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the Code. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

7. Tax status

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter dated June 23, 2014, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and has no income subject to unrelated business income tax. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by

the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Risks and uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment primarily of the Company's common stock which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows, and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

9. Subsequent events

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to add and allow stock reshuffling to the Plan. Stock reshuffling allows for any Company Stock allocated to the a terminated participant's ESOP account to be redeemed and reallocated to the accounts of participants who are active employees. The proceeds shall be held in the Other Investment Account of the Participant and invested in non-Company stock investments. The reshuffling of participants accounts will occur as soon as practicable following the end of the Plan year during which a participant's termination of employment occurs based on the valuation of assets.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was also amended to add and allow for rebalancing, which is the mandatory transfer of employer stock into and out of participant accounts designed to result in all participant accounts having the same proportion of employer stock. The administrator will rebalance participant accounts as soon as practicable after the end of the Plan year based upon valuation of the assets. The number of shares of employer stock to be rebalanced will be an amount sufficient to provide all participants with an equal percentage of their total accounts (excluding rollovers) invested in employer stock.
