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#### **NOTE 1 - Description of Plan**

The following description of the Trescal, Inc. Employee 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information of the Plan's provisions.

**General** - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Trescal, Inc. (the Company), who have completed 30 days of service and are the age 18 or older as defined by the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan assets are held by Principal Trust Company the trustee. Plan management is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan management determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

**Contributions** - Each year, participants may elect to contribute a portion of their compensation not to exceed limits established by the Internal Revenue Code. Rollover contributions from other qualified plans are also permitted at the discretion of the Plan administrator. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at six percent escalating each year by one percent to a max of ten percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The Plan currently offers various pooled separate accounts, common collective trusts and mutual funds as investment options for participants. Participants may change their investment option daily.

The Plan provides for the Company to make employer matching contributions of 50% of employee deferrals and up to 6% of the participant's compensation. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed matching contributions of \$902,916.

**Participant accounts** - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, rollover contributions and Company's matching contributions as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting** - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Employer matching contributions vesting is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service.

**Payment of benefits** - Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or separation of employment, a participant, or beneficiary thereof, shall be eligible to receive a distribution of the balance of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

**Notes receivable from participants** - The current Plan does not allow participants to borrow from their accounts. Loans taken prior to this Plan amendment are repaid through periodic payroll withholdings.

**Forfeited accounts** - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,694 and \$1, respectively. During 2024, \$91,193 was used to reduce employer contributions and \$22,068 was used to pay Plan administrative expenses.

**NOTE 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of accounting** - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment valuation and income recognition** - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The common collective trust fund is valued at the net asset value per share, or its equivalent, of the fund, which is based on the fair value of the funds underlying assets. There are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on any investment.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation included the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

**Contributions** - Contributions for Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Notes receivable from participants** - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

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**NOTE 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies - (Continued)**

**Payment of benefits** - Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Expenses** - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**Subsequent events** - The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 - Certification of Investment Information**

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company, a qualified institution.

**NOTE 4 - Fair Value Measurements**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

**Pooled separate accounts** - Valued at fair value based on the net asset value (NAV) of similar shares held by the Plan at year end. They are similar to mutual funds but are only available to group annuity contract holders.

**Common collective trust** - Fair value is determined by the underlying assets daily value using net asset value (NAV) as a practical expedient.

**Mutual funds** - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

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**NOTE 5 - Related-Party Transactions and Party In Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments are pooled separate accounts, common collective trusts and mutual funds managed by Principal Trust Company. Principal Trust Company is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. During 2024, the Plan incurred contract administration fees paid to Principal Trust Company of \$139,786 which is included in administrative expenses.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Company. No officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan for these services.

**NOTE 6 - Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

**NOTE 7 - Tax Status**

The trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue Code, and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The trust is utilizing a standardized prototype plan on which the Plan document sponsor has obtained a favorable tax opinion letter and the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan continues to qualify and to operate as designed.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or state authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

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**NOTE 8 - Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment options in pooled separate accounts, common collective trusts and mutual funds with the underlying assets consisting of any combination of stocks, fixed income securities, mutual funds and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
