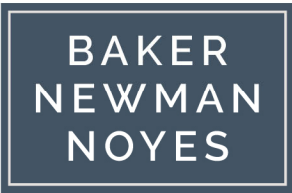

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator, Trustees and Participants
Saco & Biddeford Savings Institution 401(k) Savings Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Saco & Biddeford Savings Institution 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. Plan Description

The following description of the Saco & Biddeford Savings Institution 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a 401(k) plan sponsored by Saco & Biddeford Savings Institution (the Bank). It is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

Eligibility and Participation

The Plan covers substantially all full-time employees of the Bank and Paquin & Carroll, LLC (P&C), a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan and receive matching contributions on the next payroll date after they have reached age 18 and complete 1 month of service or if they complete 1,000 hours in the calendar year of service. Long-term part-time employees are also eligible effective January 1, 2024 if they complete 500 hours in each of the previous three years.

The Plan automatically withholds 4% of compensation if an employee has not completed a salary deferral agreement by the time they become eligible to make salary deferrals. Automatically enrolled employees will have their deferral increased annually by 1%, to a maximum deferral of 12%. Participants may execute a salary deferral agreement at any time to select an alternative deferral amount or elect not to defer under the Plan.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute, on a pre-tax and Roth basis, up to 100% of their compensation to the Plan subject to certain regulatory limitations.

The Plan provides for three levels of contributions by the Bank: (1) a discretionary matching contribution defined as 35% of the first 3% of each participant's elective deferral for participants hired before February 1, 2011 and 100% of the first 4% of each participant's elective deferral for participants hired on or after February 1, 2011, and all P&C employees; (2) a contribution of 1% of compensation for participants hired before February 1, 2011, and 3% for participants hired on or after February 1, 2011 and all P&C employees; and (3) a discretionary profit sharing contribution on behalf of eligible participants. There were no discretionary profit sharing contributions in 2024 and 2023.

At the participants' option, contributions may be invested in any of the investment options offered by the Plan. Participants should refer to the respective prospectus for further information. One of the available investment options is a brokerage account. In a brokerage account, participants manage their own account through an outside brokerage firm.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, employer contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions to the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants shall be fully vested in their contribution accounts at all times. Participants vest in the Bank contributions as follows:

Less than 1	0%
1 but less than 2	20
2 but less than 3	40
3 but less than 4	60
4 but less than 5	80
5 or more	100

Distributions

Upon death, disability or attainment of the normal retirement date, as defined, the full amount credited to a participant's account shall become fully vested. In the event of termination of employment for any reason other than death, disability or attainment of the normal retirement date, the participant will receive the vested portion of their account. Participants receive their distributions in a lump-sum payment, installments or partial payments.

Participants are permitted to make hardship withdrawals from their account provided they meet certain criteria.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts included in net assets available for benefits were not significant. Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses and employer matching contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$50,120 and \$48,198, respectively, were used to reduce employer contributions.

1. **Plan Description (Continued)**

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Note terms generally range from 1 to 5 years, with longer terms allowed for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator at the time the note is established. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Trust Fund Management

Fidelity Management Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan's investments.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Bank has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, participants will become 100% vested in their account balances.

Administrative Costs

Administrative costs are paid by the Plan to the extent they are not paid by the Bank.

Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in mutual funds of the Fidelity Fund Group, which are affiliated with Fidelity. Fidelity is the third-party administrator and custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. As described in note 5, Plan expenses were paid to Fidelity in 2024 and 2023. Cetera Investment Advisors provides investment advisory services to the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. In addition, loans to participants qualify as party-in-interest.

2. **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Investments in the stable value fund are stated at fair value using the net asset value per share practical expedient (NAV). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are classified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan's loan policy.

Contributions

Contributions are recorded in the period in which payroll deductions are made; employer matching contributions are recorded in the same period as corresponding participant contributions. Any employer discretionary contributions are recorded in the year to which the contributions relate.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Management Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options which invest in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

For the purposes of recognition and disclosure in these financial statements, management of the Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 16, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Tax Status

A qualifying plan is one for which the employer may currently deduct contributions on its income tax return, the employee is not currently taxed on the contribution, and the plan income is not taxable.

3. **Tax Status (Continued)**

The Plan is a pre-approved non-standardized defined contribution plan sponsored by FMR LLC. This pre-approved non-standardized plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service, dated June 30, 2020, as to the plan's qualified status. The Plan has subsequently been amended. The opinion letter has been relied upon by the Plan and the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by a plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. federal, state or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

4. **Investments and Fair Value Measurements**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by the Plan's custodian, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule. Fidelity Management Trust Company has provided a certification as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan's investments, notes receivable from participants, related income and transactions, including net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, were certified by the Plan's custodian.

Fair Value Measurements

U.S. GAAP establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;

- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The money market fund, mutual funds and common stock are valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the security is traded. The U.S. government securities are valued using pricing vendors utilizing matrix pricing which considers yield or price of bonds, credit quality, coupon, maturity and type as well as broker supplied prices. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The stable value fund objective is to provide a moderate level of stable income without principal volatility. The fund is valued at the net asset value of units of the bank collective trust. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. No such redemption is planned at December 31, 2024. The fund has no unfunded commitments.

5. **Plan Expenses**

The Plan's administrative expenses were paid to Fidelity and Cetera Investment Advisors during 2024 and 2023.
